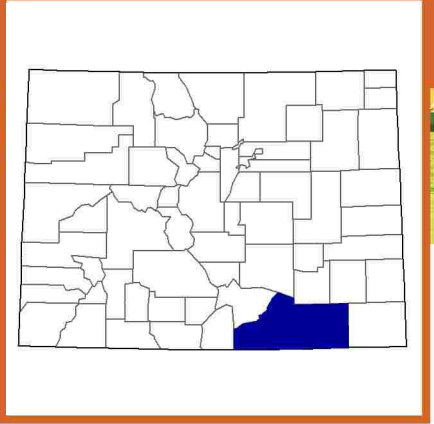


Las Animas County, Colorado Farms with Asian Producers^a

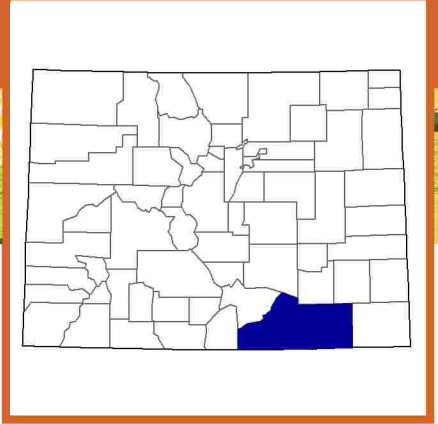

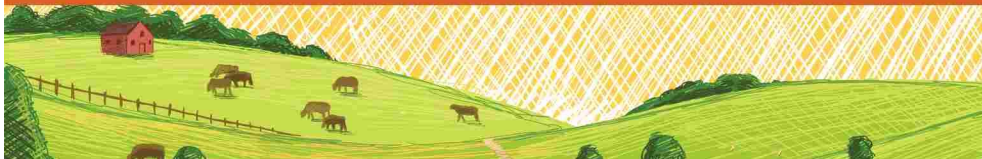
