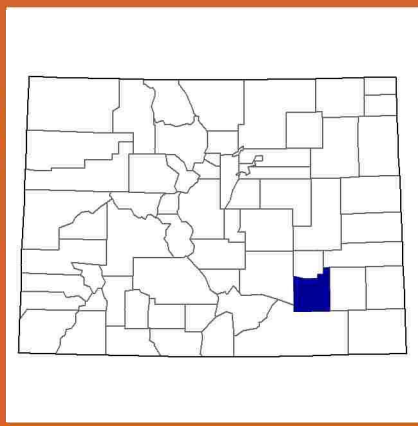




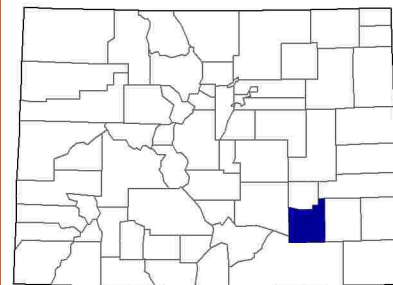

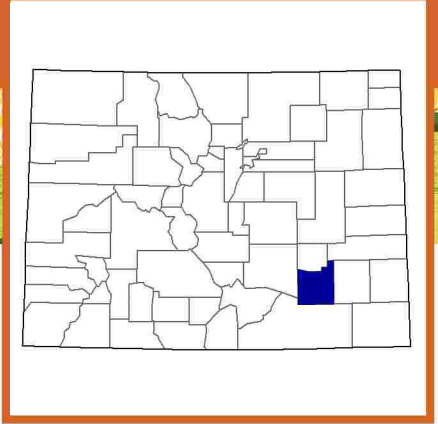


Otero County, Colorado Farms with Asian Producers^a

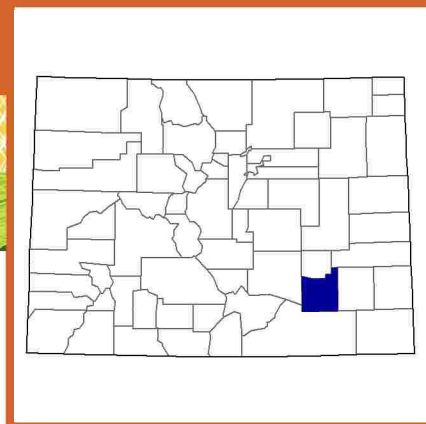

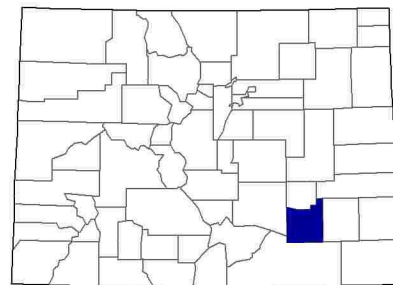

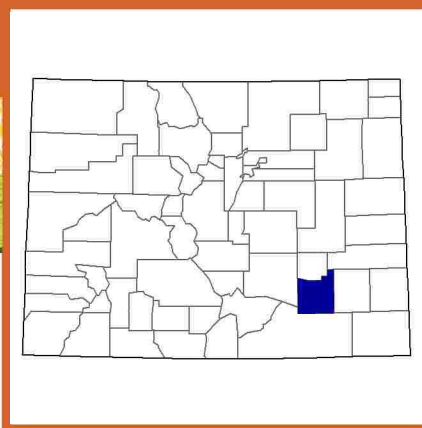


Otero County, Colorado Farms with White Producers^a

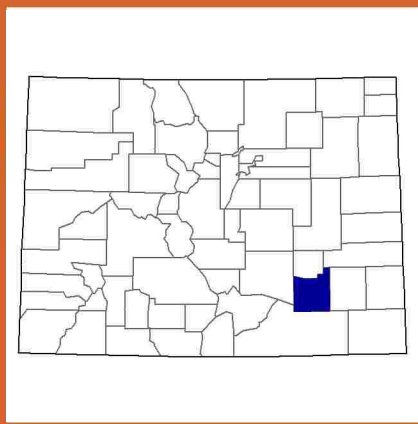
