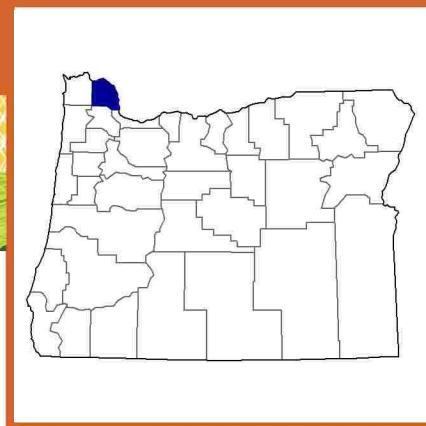




Columbia County, Oregon Farms with American Indian or Alaska Native Producers^a

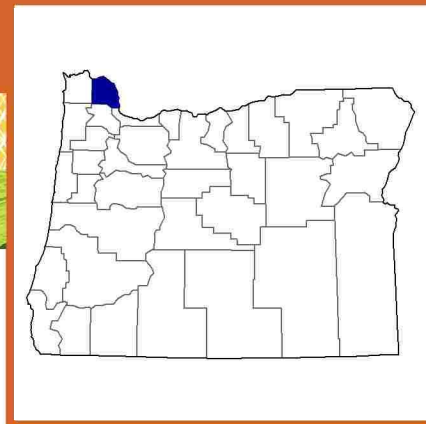

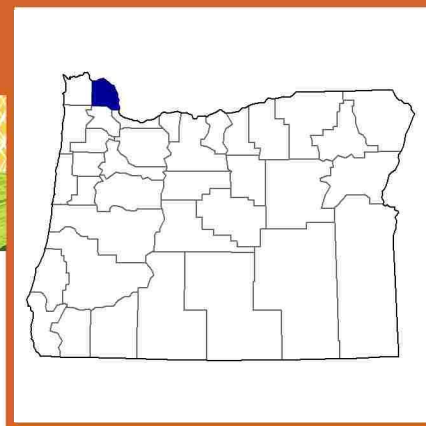

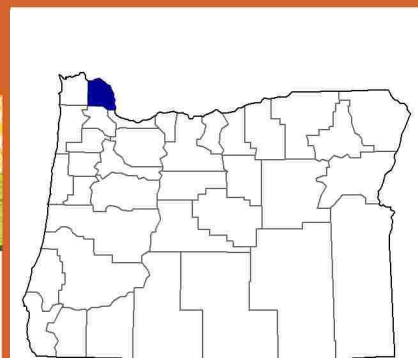
