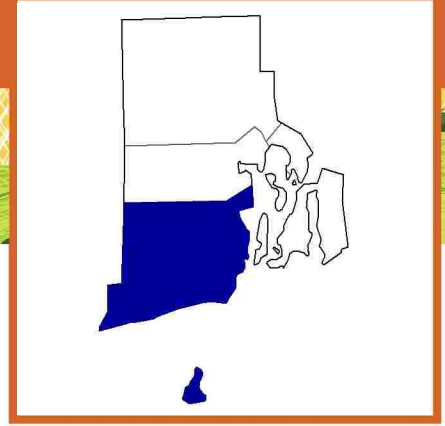




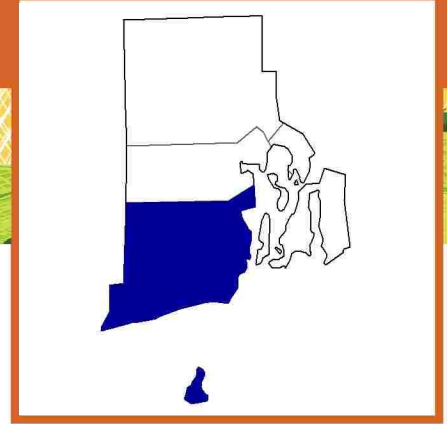

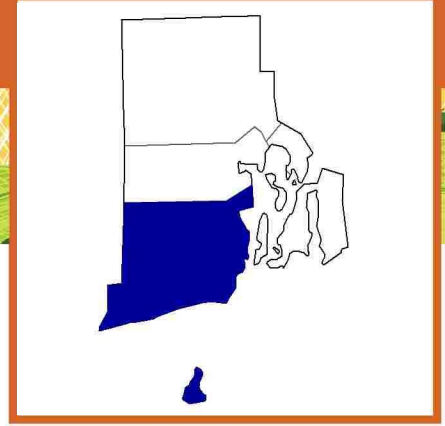


Washington County, Rhode Island Farms with Asian Producers^a

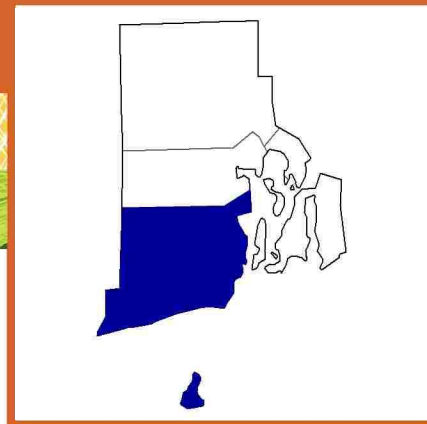

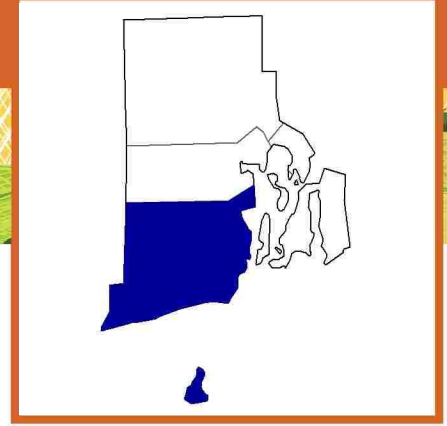

Washington County, Rhode Island Farms with White Producers^a

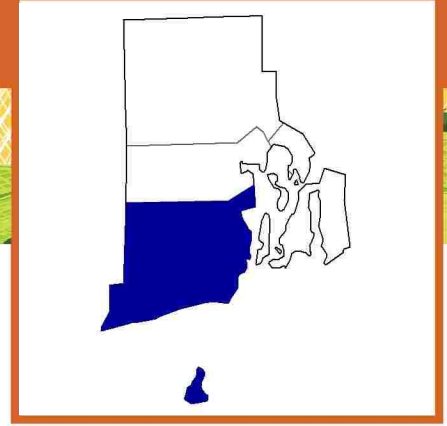

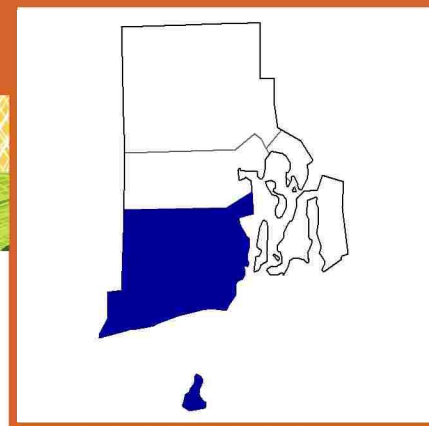
