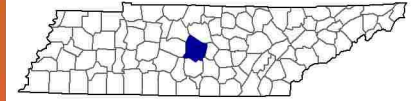


Rutherford County, Tennessee Farms with American Indian or Alaska Native Producers^a

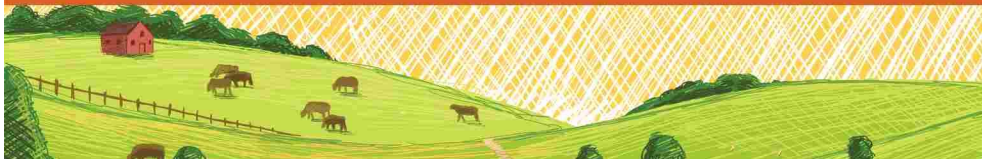
