**ALASKA:** There were **3.7 days suitable for fieldwork** last week. Temperatures for the week were below average for much of the state. Homer, Kenai, and Delta Junction had several days with significant precipitation.

**TANANA VALLEY:** An average of **6.0 days was suitable for fieldwork.** Some areas have become dry, which required irrigation. **Crop rate of growth** was 50% moderate and 50% rapid. **Farm activities** for the week included spraying weeds, irrigation, harvesting hay and general farm maintenance.

**MATANUSKA VALLEY:** An average of **1.0 day was suitable for fieldwork. Crop rate of growth** was 100% slow. Wind and rain slowed field work. **Farm activities** for the week included harvesting first cutting hay and general farm maintenance.

**KENAI:** An average of **6.0 days was suitable for fieldwork. Crop rate of growth** was 50% slow and 50% moderate. Some slight wind damage was reported.
