ALASKA: There were 5.1 days suitable for fieldwork for the week ending May 26. Progress of fieldwork was reported as normal across the state. Local hay supplies were reported as 45% short and 55% adequate. Condition of livestock was reported as 15% fair, 75% good, and 10% excellent. Range and pasture condition was reported as 10% fair, 85% good and 5% excellent. Rain in the Tanana Valley slowed field work but was beneficial to areas already planted or hay and pastures that had been fertilized. Pastures were greening up well and some producers were turning out cattle. Potato planting was winding down and pastures and hay fields had decent growth in the Matanuska Valley.
