ALASKA: There were 4.7 days suitable for fieldwork for the week ending August 18. Rain continued early in the week in Matanuska Valley. Drier conditions were present during the weekend, just in time for the opening weekend of the Alaska State Fair. Potatoes looked to be in good condition. Parts of the Tanana Valley remained dry again this week. Areas east of Delta Junction were very dry, while areas in the Tanana Loop received excess moisture. Activities in the Tanana Valley included continued grass seed harvest, start of second cutting of hay, preparing for grain harvest, and CRP and general farm maintenance.
