**ALASKA:** There were 3.5 **days suitable for fieldwork** for the week ending September 1. Good weekend weather was present for the conclusion of the Alaska State Fair in the **Matanuska Valley**. The second cutting of hay was in full swing. Progress was made on the harvests of barley, field peas and the second cutting of hay in the **Tanana Valley** last week. Little to no straw had been baled yet. Other activities included mowing and baling of forage cover crops, CRP maintenance, and fence construction and maintenance.
