ALASKA: There were 3.3 **days suitable for fieldwork** for the week ending September 8. Wet weather was present in the **Matanuska Valley** last week. Potato harvest was close to halfway complete. Wet weather slowed hay cutting in many areas. Growers in the **Tanana Valley** were struggling with excess moisture last week from scattered rain showers and lack of sunshine. Barley harvest continued, with some high moisture grain bagged for ensiling. Hay that had been cut was baled and wrapped at higher moisture. Final garden harvests were underway. Other activities in the Tanana Valley included brush mowing, and fence construction and maintenance.
