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Arizona Agricultural Statistics 2019

We are proud to present you with the 2019 edition of **Arizona Agricultural Statistics**. The statistics included show the size and scope of one of Arizona's largest industries. Agriculture cash receipts totaled a record high \$5.04 billion in 2019, 21 percent higher than last year. Cash receipts from milk, lettuces, spinach, and pecans had the largest increases, but these cash receipt gains were partially offset by decreases in cattle and cotton.

The results from the 2017 Census of Agriculture were published in April, 2019. Below are some of the following highlights:

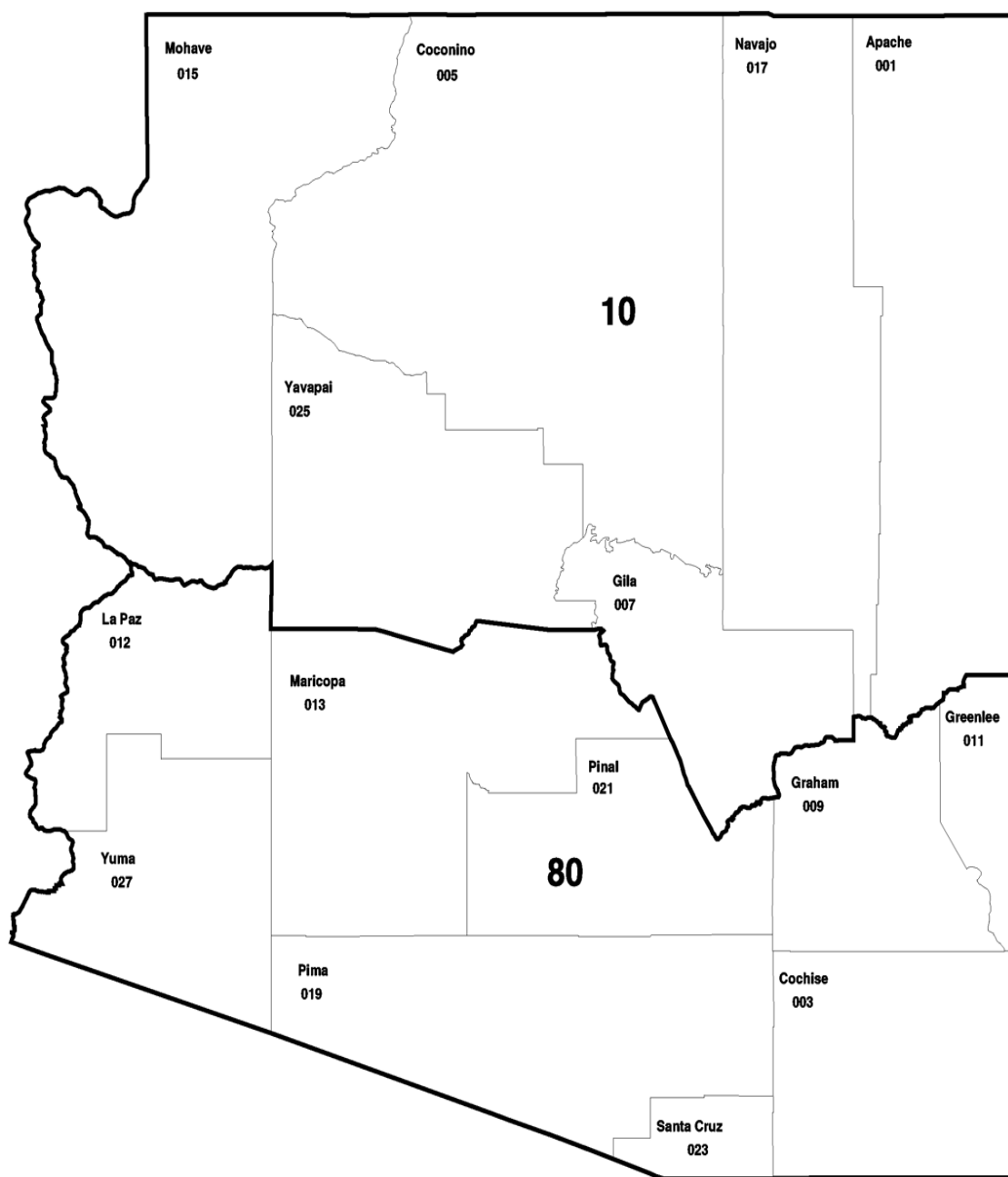

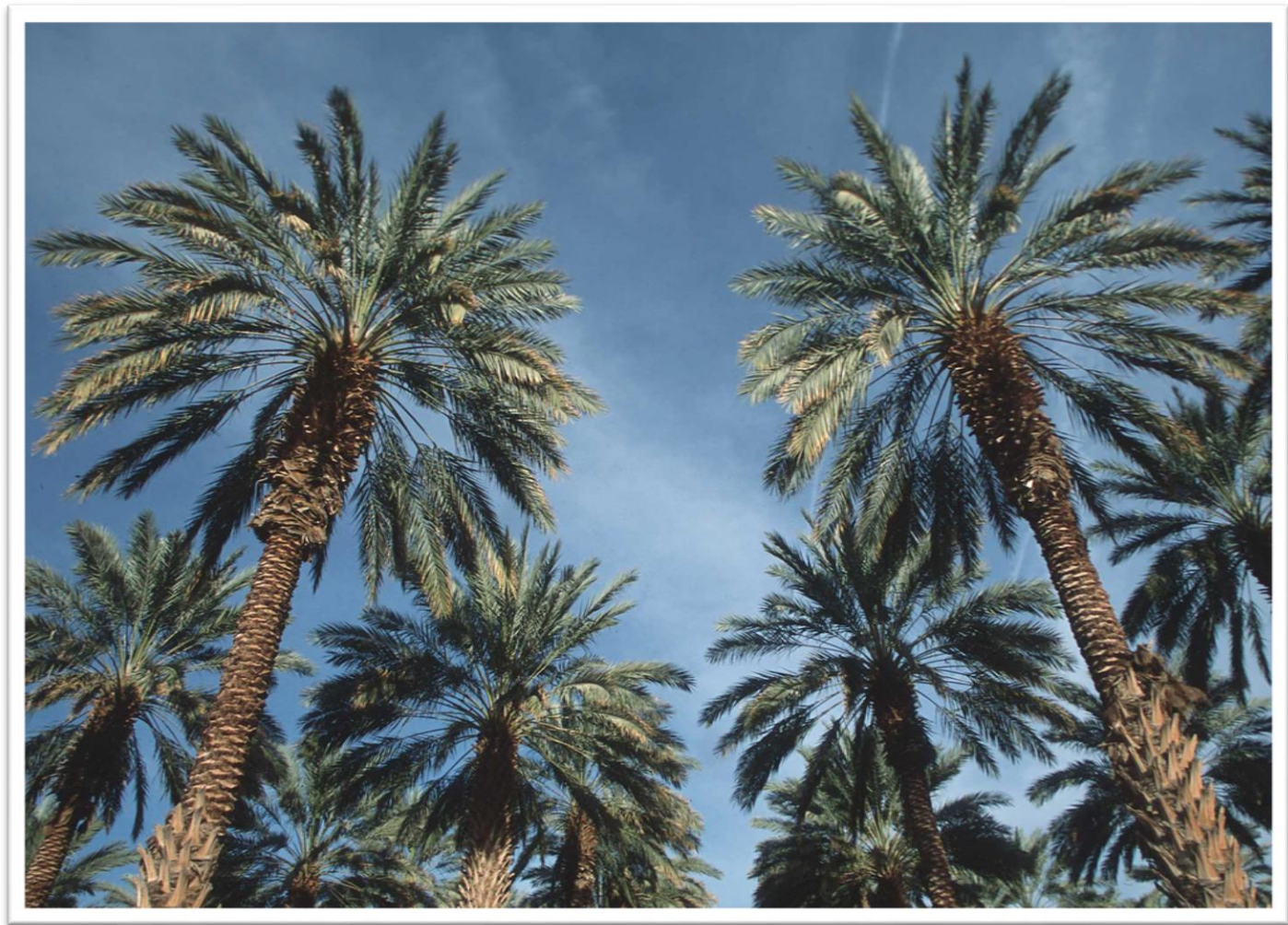


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
