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WHY CROP AND LIVESTOCK REPORTS

A man's judgment is no better than his facts and crop reports are the basic facts of Agriculture.

They aid farmers in planning their production and marketing.

They are essential in enacting wise legislation affecting Agriculture.

They are the basis for analysis of agriculture and other business conditions.

They enable railroads to make a better distribution of cars for moving farm products.

They give producers the same foresight to future price trends that organized dealers possess.

They are a check on fluctuation in price. Uncertainty of supply promotes undue fluctuation in price.

They are indispensable in times of war because food is as essential as ammunition and weapons of war.

They are the best basis for adjusting supply to demand which is highly essential if maximum price is to prevail.

They aid farm organizations, schools and others in planning constructive programs, and the prospective purchaser of land.

They give information on surplus and deficit areas of production making possible a more economical distribution of products.

They eliminate the ill effects of misleading reports that might be circulated for private gain, if there were no official reports.

They are a guide to farm resources and for developing new resources such as irrigation, electric power, location of food processing and other factories.

They reduce the amount of speculation in farm products. Speculation thrives on uncertainty. Unbiased official crop reports reduce uncertainty which limits speculation.

They indicate potential buying power thereby enabling the manufacturer to meet the probable demand. With economical production and distribution, the manufacturer can sell at a lower price than he could with uncertain demand.

They reduce the risk of ownership of buyers of farm products which enables them to do business on a smaller margin. Under the stimulus of competition, they pay producers higher prices than could be paid if uncertainty of production existed.

They provide an accurate, unbiased picture of Arizona's agriculture. The facts on present and prospective supplies furnish a sound basis for judgment and action by farmers, other individuals, business men, railroads, crop and livestock interests and governmental agencies.

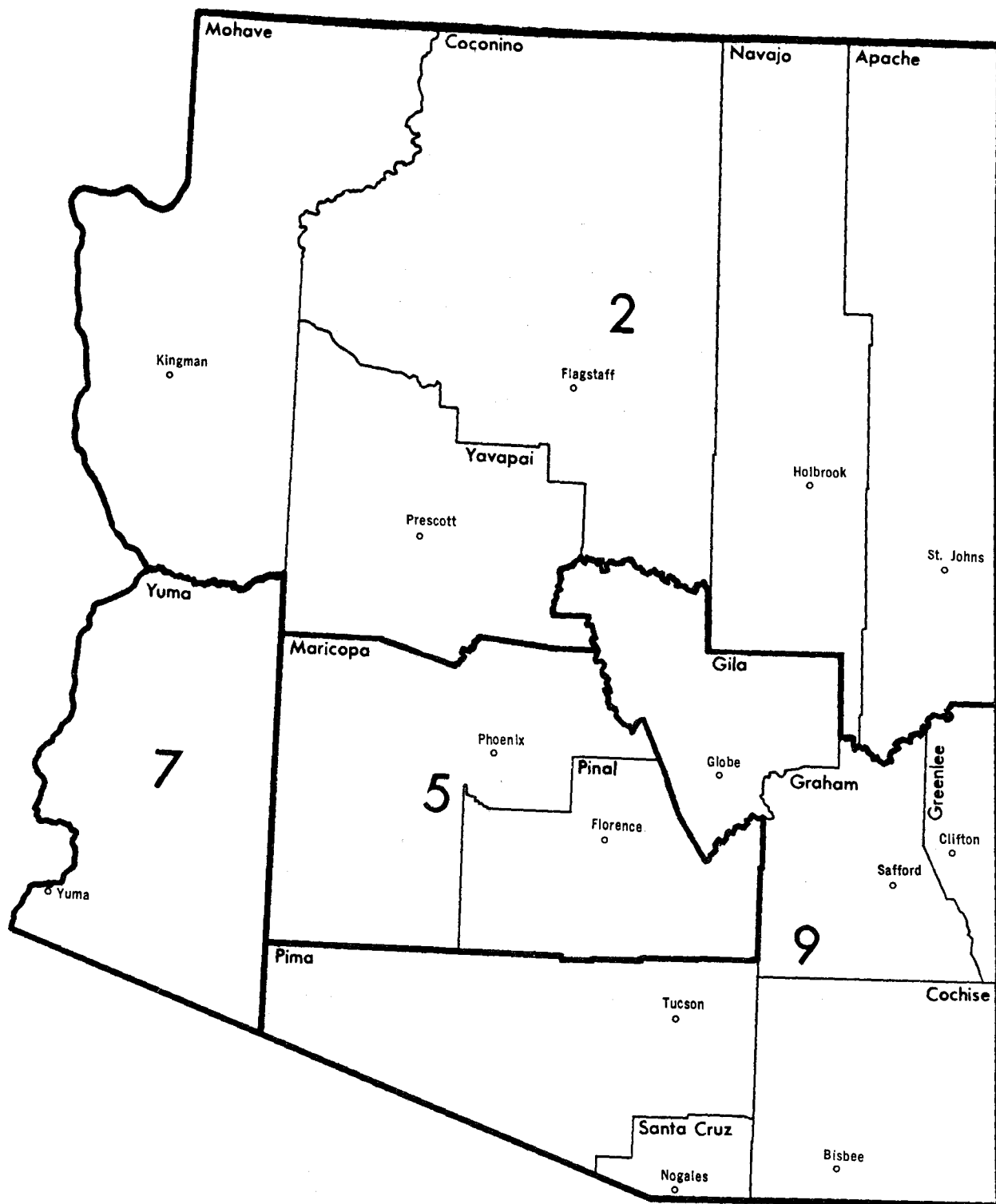

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I N T R O D U C T I O N

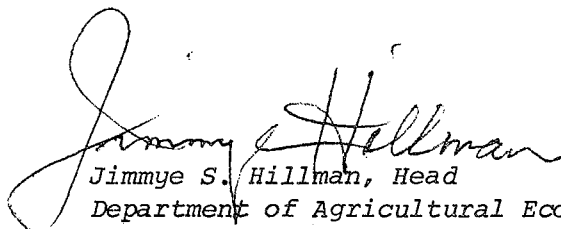
During the past decade the value of commodities produced on Arizona's farms and ranches has doubled. In 1966 the value of crops and livestock produced was slightly over a half billion dollars. By 1973 it had exceeded a billion dollars and is expected to total 1.3 billion dollars for 1976.

This growth in value of farm and ranch output has been steady from year to year except in 1975 when it dipped slightly. Price inflation, of course, greatly influenced the increase in value. Moreover, the composition of the output has shifted over time. Crops accounted for 54 percent of the value in 1966, but it declined to a low of 40 percent in 1973. Expansion of feedlot operations resulted in income from livestock climbing at a rapid rate. Since 1973, however, value of livestock production has declined in relation to value of crops, and, in 1976, crops accounted for 60 percent and livestock 40 percent.

Arizona's producers invest considerable capital to generate this output. In order to accurately measure the impact of agriculture on the State's economy one must consider additional dollars generated by agri-business. Farmers and ranchers need capital, marketing service, hired labor, machinery, fuel, fertilizer, herbicides and insecticides, vaccine for livestock, etc. Suppliers of those input items create jobs and generate dollars into the State's economy. Also, businesses engaged in processing, storage, transporting and marketing output from farms and ranches are an integral part of the agricultural and total economy.

Every facet of Arizona's agricultural industry needs a continuing series of agricultural statistics as a tool for decision making. The University of Arizona, College of Agriculture, and the Statistical Reporting Service of USDA joined efforts in 1965 to establish and maintain a series of State and County agricultural statistics. Collection and analysis of the data provide comparability from year to year within the State as well as between States. A second feature of the program is the elimination of conflicting estimates. As a result of this cooperative effort our program has been recognized as the official source for the State's agricultural statistical information.

This, the twelveth issue of "Arizona Agricultural Statistics", is one of the major results of the cooperative effort and is the most comprehensive annual source of statistics available on Arizona agriculture.

VALUE OF MARKETINGS: The values shown in the above table were developed by the Arizona Crop and Livestock Reporting Service. For crops, value was derived by multiplying production by season average price. Those values for major crops are shown elsewhere in this bulletin and account for over 90 percent of the values in the foregoing table. The other ten percent represents values for minor crops not included in the regular program of estimates, such as, green onions, burmuda grass seed, deciduous fruit, dry beans, sugarbeet seed, chili pepper, etc.

Marketings of cattle and calves from feedlots for the three years shown were valued by multiplying the monthly price by average liveweight of cattle slaughtered and the number slaughtered. Values for cows and calves sold from ranches were derived by multiplying number of head sold by average price for each class. Dollar value for hogs, sheep, lambs, wool and other livestock and livestock products were determined in a similar manner. That is, using estimated quantities produced and monthly or season average price.

Prior publications of "Arizona Agricultural Statistics" have included a table titled, "Cash Receipts from Farm Marketings". Those data were developed by USDA, Economic Research Service, available in August following the year of marketings. Thus, the most recent year of comparable data was not available. However, the Economic Research Service cash receipts values will be available in August 1977 in a release prepared by the Arizona Crop and Livestock Reporting Service.

Agricultural Summary - 1976

WEATHER: At the beginning of 1976 most Arizona weather stations were reporting below normal precipitation accumulations. Exceptions were a few northern stations at higher elevations. That condition continued during the first three months and at the end of March most stations were still well below normal. At that time, exceptions were some northern stations and Yuma. April, May and June precipitation brought most areas' precipitation for the year back to normal. Even with normal precipitation accumulations, run off was below normal due to the earlier droughty conditions. Scattered heavy thundershowers were recorded over most of the state during July-September. In late September, tropical storm Kathlene caused heavy showers and damaging high winds in the Yuma area as well as some other areas along the Colorado River. Accumulated precipitation at the end of September was well above normal in many areas but the southeast as well as some northwestern areas remained well below average. The last three months brought continued scattered showers and some heavy snowfall in the Mogollon Rim and eastern mountain areas. Moisture accumulations for the year were normal or somewhat above in most areas with the exception of the southeast and northwest. However, snow pack and expected spring run off are currently well below normal.

CROPS: The 1976 crop year will be remembered as the year of the large durum wheat crop. Due to economic incentives caused by heavy foreign demand, Arizona farmers produced about 718,000 tons of durum wheat from 319,000 acres. Prior to 1976, Arizona's durum wheat acreage was probably limited to no more than 30-40,000 acres. Cotton farmers also produced a large crop, estimated at 860,000 bales. This was 41 percent larger than the 1975 crop. Value of cotton lint production was estimated at about \$275 million, 71 percent more than the 1975 level. Cotton was the leading crop in value of production followed by all wheat at \$127 million. Hay followed with a value of \$107.5 million. All vegetable production was valued at \$95.6 and grain production other than wheat was worth about \$48 million. Production of oranges was down 46 percent, but grapefruit production was up 11 percent. Tangerine production was about the same as 1974-1975, but lemon production was only about one-third of the 1974-1975 level.

LIVESTOCK: Arizona's cattle and calf population at the beginning of the year was 1,280,000 head - 9 percent above the beginning 1975 level. The count was down to 1,200,000 head by mid-year and 1,065,000 head at the end of the year. The ending inventory was 17 percent below the beginning inventory. A large portion of the decrease was accounted for by a reduction of cattle in feedlots from 510,000 head at the beginning of the year to 361,000 at the end of the year. Beef cattle prices were well below the 1975 level from May through the end of the year, but calf prices were generally above the 1975 level. Cattle slaughter in the state was 5 percent more than 1975. Hog numbers increased from 97,000 head at the beginning to 99,000 head at the end of the year. Hog prices during the first half of the year were above 1975 level, but were consistently well below the 1975 level during the second half. Hog slaughter during 1976 was 5 percent above the 1975 level.

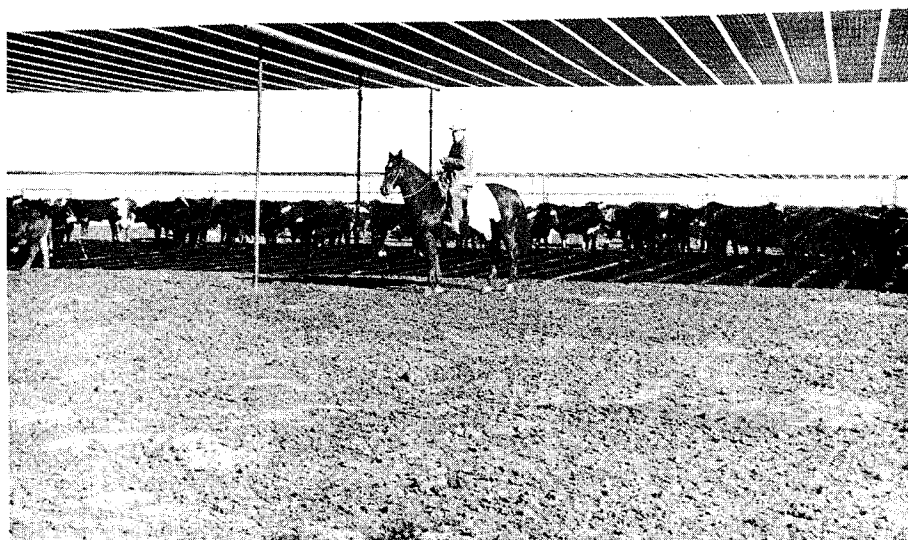

WATER SUPPLY: Snow cover is half of normal and spring run off is expected to be less than one-third of average. With moderate reservoir storage in most areas, water supplies will generally be adequate for this year. Some areas, such as the San Carlos and Upper Gila areas, will be very short this year. If dry conditions continue through next winter, most of the state will be short of water next year.

SNOW COVER: Snow cover now varies from 45% of average on the Salt and Gila Watersheds to 60% on the Verde.

PRECIPITATION: Storm activity increased the last week of February, but precipitation on all watersheds ended up much below average for the month. Amounts of 1" to 2" were common at the higher elevations and 1/2" to 1" at the lower. Since November 1 all watersheds have received just about half of normal amounts of precipitation.

SOIL MOISTURE: Moderate storms in the next few weeks should yield good runoff from the lower elevations, but at the higher elevations much of the snow water will be absorbed by the soil this year.

RESERVOIR STORAGE: Reservoir storage varies from a nearly empty San Carlos Reservoir to above average conditions in Lyman Reservoir. Salt River Project reservoirs are about half full, which is only slightly below normal for this date. The most favorable water supplies occur on the Colorado River, where the combined reservoir storage is now 57% above average.
