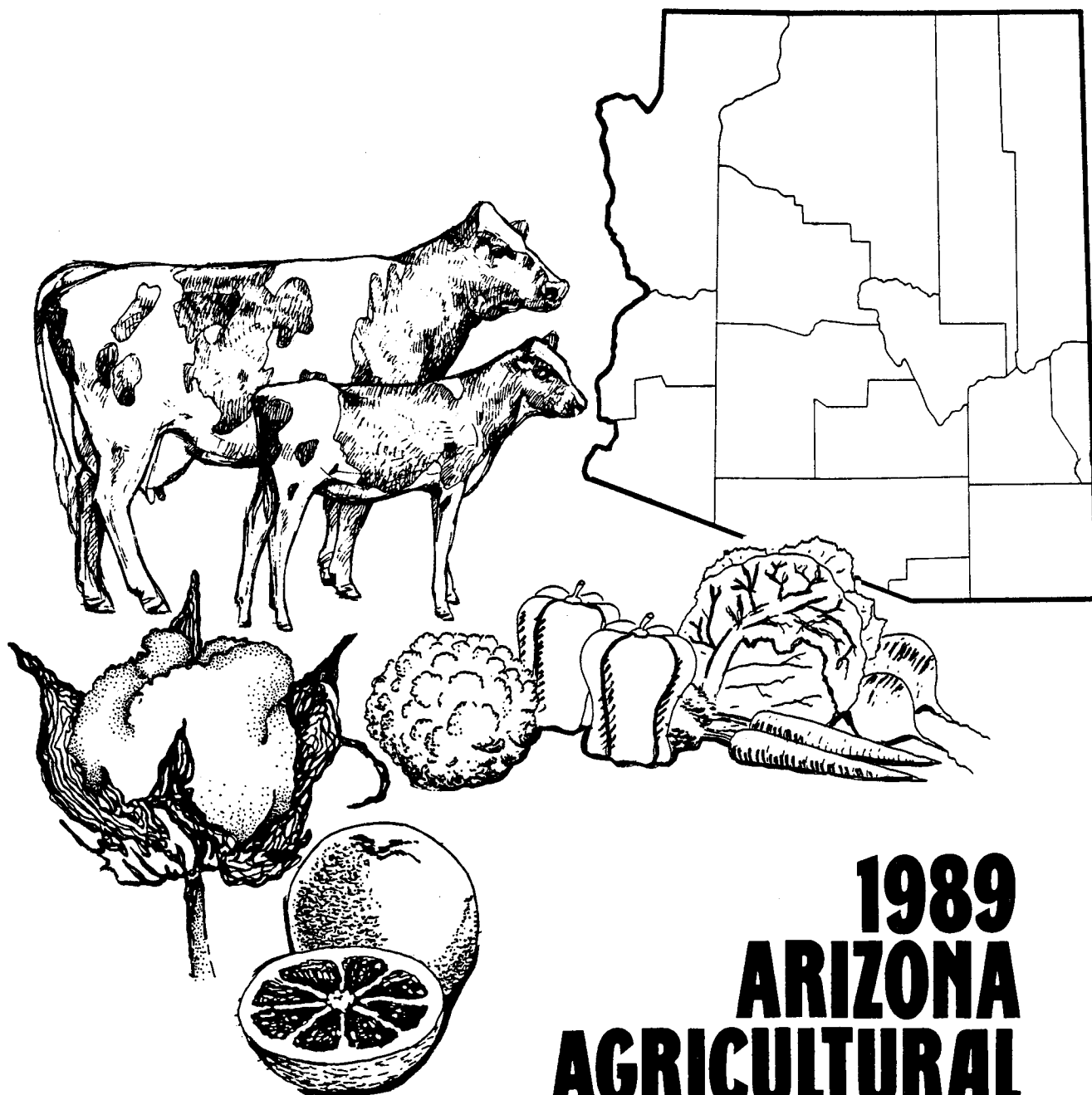

TRIBUTE TO DR. HILLMAN

This year's bulletin is dedicated to Dr. Jimmye S. Hillman who stepped down as head of the Department of Agricultural Economics at the University of Arizona, effective June 30, 1990. A one-year sabbatical is planned in New Zealand and then Dr. Hillman will return as a member of the faculty in the Department of Agricultural Economics.

Dr. Hillman, a Mississippi native and graduate from Mississippi State University, received his Masters Degree from Texas A & M and his PhD from the University of California-Berkeley. He guided the Department for nearly 29 years and established the Department's reputation of excellence in teaching, research and extension in the College of Agriculture, the State, nationally and internationally.

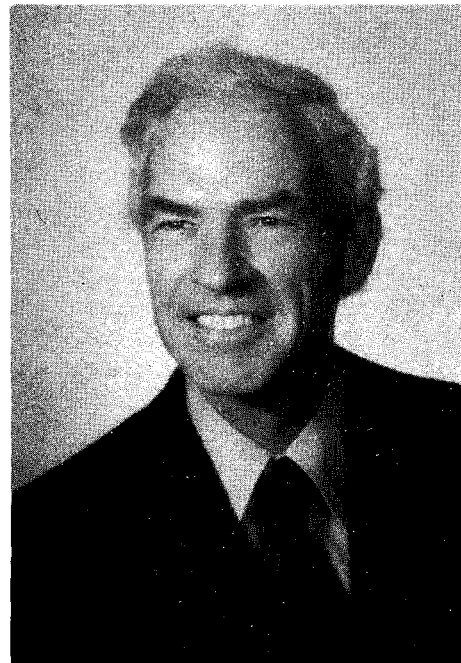
The cooperative agreement that exists between the University of Arizona and the Arizona Agricultural Statistics Service was primarily the result of Dr. Hillman's work in 1965. Through his efforts important data series on Arizona's agriculture were upgraded and the State-Federal cooperative relationship became a model for other states.

In addition to the years as Department Head, Dr. Hillman has served in many other leadership positions including Director of the Office of International Programs at the University of Arizona, President of both the American and Western Agricultural Economics Associations, and received an appointment by President Johnson to serve as the Executive Director of the National Advisory Commission on Food and Fiber.

He has dealt with such contemporary Arizona issues as the economics of agricultural production and marketing; the economics of water use and conservation; and the economics of interstate and interregional trade. International agricultural studies and leadership on world economic committees gave Dr. Hillman a good background for fitting Arizona's agricultural economy into the global economy.

Dr. Hillman has kept pace with the agricultural problems facing the world as a whole by serving, from 1975 to 1980, on three subcommittees of the Science Advisory Board of the United States Environmental Protection Agency. Also, on five occasions and with five different missions since 1968, he was asked by the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations to consult on matters of important policy consequences.

We extend our best wishes to Dr. Hillman as he enters a new phase of his illustrious career.

INTRODUCTION

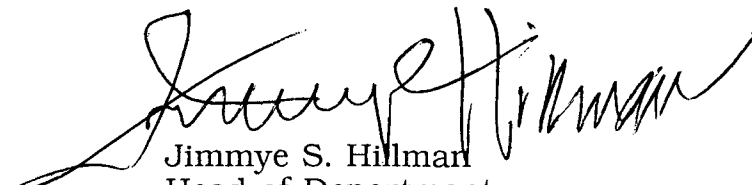
Before 1964, the State of Arizona had a number of "statistical reports" for its agricultural sector. These were: 1) reports from the U.S. Department of Agriculture; 2) **Arizona Agriculture** published by the Department of Agricultural Economics, University of Arizona; and 3) the **Annual Statistical Review** of the Valley National Bank. There was little coordination between these agencies, hence there was confusion about agricultural statistics.

It was in that year that I assembled representatives from these agencies, and a few others, to suggest a method to rectify the confusion, and a vehicle to publish **one** official set of agricultural data. The result was Arizona Agricultural Statistics as we now know it.

This twenty fifth edition of a joint effort between the Department of Agricultural Economics, University of Arizona and the Statistical Reporting Service, U.S.D.A, therefore, gives me special pleasure. At the same time some sadness, because it represents the last volume for which I shall be responsible as Department Head.

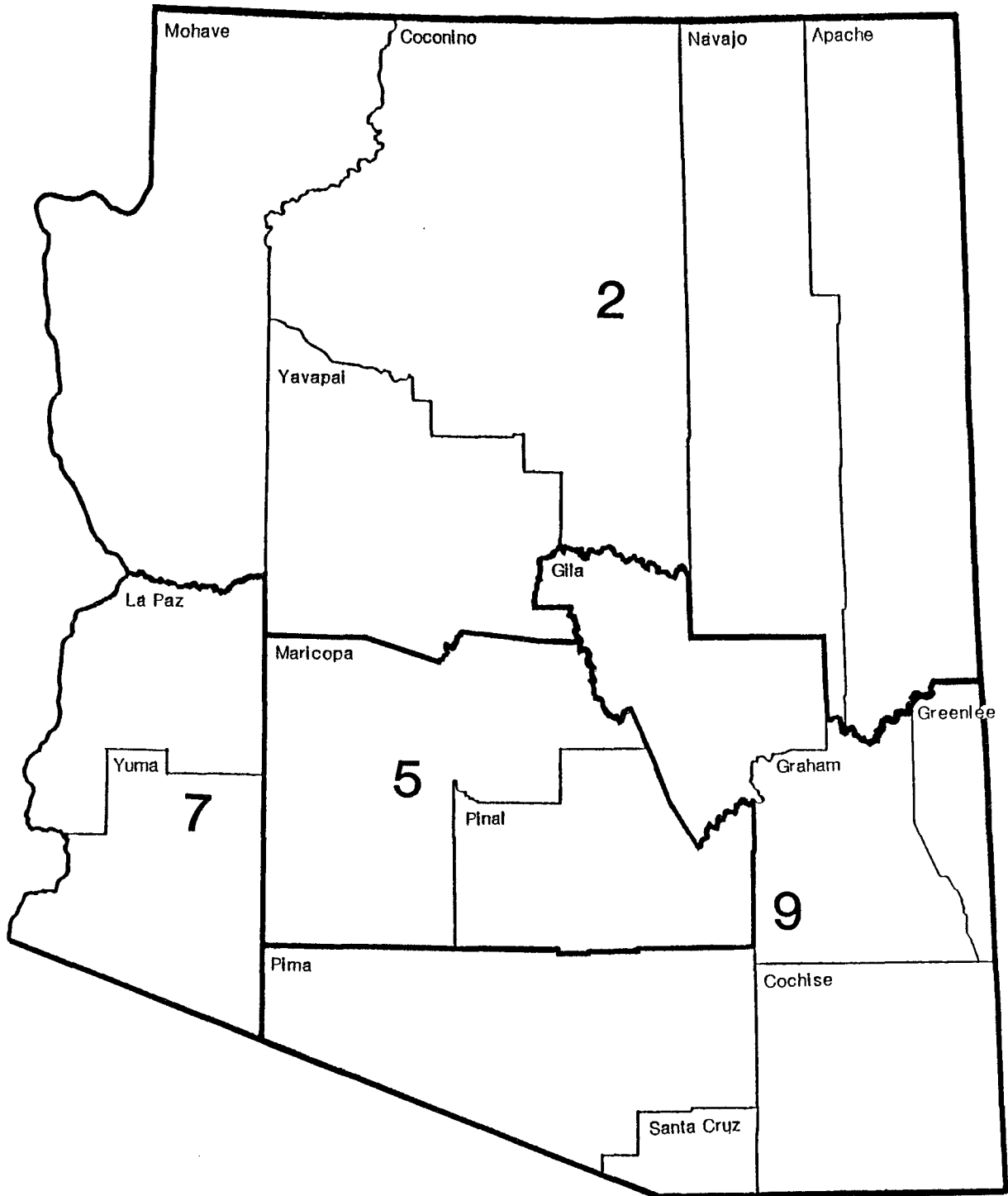
Thanks are due to more people for their help over the years than space allows to list. Let me, however, mention a few: the late State Senator Ben Arnold, of Pinal County who helped put a small budget in place for cooperation with the USDA; the late Bill Davis of the Arizona Farm Bureau for his political help; the Statisticians in Charge, Arizona Crop and Livestock Reporting Service, Floyd Rolf, Horace Mayes, Ron Brantner and, currently, Barry Bloyd; and finally various Deans of Agriculture at the University of Arizona, and the faculty in Agricultural Economics who have assisted with budgetary and technical matters.

CASH RECEIPTS

Cash receipts are computed as marketing volume times price and are usually reported on a calendar-year basis. Marketings can come from current production or from storage of past year's crop (assuming a crop is storable, like potatoes). Thus, the quantity available for sale (marketings), can be thought of as coming from current production less shrinkage and the amount used on farms for food, feed, and seed plus change in stored quantity (inventory). On the other hand, value of production, which is generally reported as a crop-year statistic, is computed as production times average price. The difference between value of production and cash receipts is usually only important to those commodities which can be stored and thus have a specific marketing pattern which extends through time from the date of harvest.

STATE SUMMARY

Farm and ranch numbers in Arizona reached a peak of 8,600 in 1986, but have since declined to a current level of 8,100. Land in Arizona farms and ranches has continued to decrease and now totals 36.0 million acres. Nationally, farm numbers and land in farms continues to decline. A farm or ranch is defined as a place from which \$1,000 or more of agricultural products were sold, or normally could be sold.

In Arizona, a large number of the farms and ranches are mini-farms located in the suburban areas of the state. The 1987 census of agriculture showed that 28 percent of the State's farms were places of less than 10 acres while nearly 75 percent were places of less than 500 acres.

Land in farms, along with "average size" of farm can be misleading, especially in the western states, since, by definition, it excludes all state and federal public grazing lands which are leased on a per-head basis rather than a per-acre basis.

Also, Indian lands that cannot be accounted for in the usual individual operator manner are reported as one farm or ranch by a central tribal source. In Arizona, Indian lands contribute over 20 million acres to the State's land in farms and ranches. The Navajo nation, as one farm, accounts for almost half of the Indian land.

In order to present a picture of an average cotton farm, there were approximately 1,200 cotton farms tabulated in the 1987 census of agriculture. These farms had an average of 320 acres of cotton. However, excluding those farms with less than 100 acres results in a typical irrigated cotton farm of 405 acres.

FIELD CROPS

HIGHLIGHTS - 1989 CROP YEAR

Farmers and ranchers in Arizona will remember the 1989 season as hot and dry. Unseasonably high temperatures arrived in early April warming soils and encouraging crop growth. Cotton planting began well ahead of normal and the crops advanced quickly at the beginning of the season. American-Pima acreage was at an all time high while the upland acreage was down. The weather was also favorable for small grain development and the crops were harvested by the end of June, a week ahead of normal. The monsoons arrived on schedule but brought mostly wind and dust causing little damage to the state's crops. A few isolated storms in late July and early August did hit the Yuma area causing severe flooding and loss of cut hay.

AMERICAN-PIMA COTTON ACREAGE UP

Stalk shredding, disking and plowing was well underway early in January with concerns about meeting the final plowdown deadline. By late January, land preparation was underway in the western part of the state with land being leveled and fields pre-irrigated. Planting in the western region became very active by mid-March with the eastern and central producing regions just getting underway. Strong 1988 crop prices had generated an optimistic outlook for American-Pima cotton. In light of this, many growers proceeded to plant a record-breaking acreage of long staple cotton. April's unseasonably warm weather and favorable soil conditions encouraged planting statewide resulting in half of the acreage squaring by the third week in May. The crop was well ahead of normal in mid-June with most of the squaring completed and over half of the crop acreage setting bolls. Although the crop's progress remained ahead of normal, the rate of progress started to decrease in the beginning of July. Bolls were opening in all areas the first week of August and harvest was underway in Yuma County by the last week of the month. Harvest continued with few problems and was virtually completed by the third week of December, slightly ahead of normal.

ALL WHEAT ACREAGE UP

All wheat acreage was up in 1989, primarily due to the considerable increase in Durum wheat acreage. A good percentage of the acreage was seeded by the first of January and the crop was beginning to joint by the first week of February. Ideal weather conditions in the middle of February allowed some of the acreage to start heading out in western areas of the state. By April, well over half of the acreage was heading, with Yuma County acreage starting to turn color. Almost one-third of the acreage was turning color in mid-April and Yuma County growers began harvesting. The warm weather pushed harvest ahead of normal statewide. Harvesting was very active all during June and was completed by the end of the month.

ALFALFA HAY YIELDS DOWN

After a record yield in 1988, the 1989 alfalfa hay yield was slightly lower and harvested acreage was down as well. The year started with some light reseeding due to freeze damage caused by a winter storm. Sheeping off was heavy in all areas from the beginning of January through mid-February. Ideal curing conditions in late February and early March allowed the first cuttings to get underway. Conditions remained favorable throughout March and April. Spraying for the alfalfa weevil and aphids began the second week in May but did not affect harvest. Isolated rain storms caused some damage to the crop in July and August when the operators were into their fifth and sixth cuttings. As harvest activity tapered off in early November, a hard frost abruptly finished the crop in Greenlee County. All other areas brought the 1989 season to a close the first part of December.

CORN AND SORGHUM ACREAGE UP SLIGHTLY

The state's corn and sorghum planted acreage were each up slightly in 1989. The State's corn acreage was planted in March and April with the largest acreage intended for grain planted in Cochise County. Most of the corn planted in central Arizona was cut for silage and fed at local dairies. Much of the State's limited sorghum acreage for 1989 was planted in La Paz, Maricopa and Pinal counties, and was all planted by mid-May. The decline of feed grain production in Arizona can be attributed to the decline in the cattle feeding business and the increased shipment of out of state grain into Arizona. Sorghum county estimates were discontinued beginning with the 1988 crop season due to the small acreage involved and the risk of disclosing individual operations.

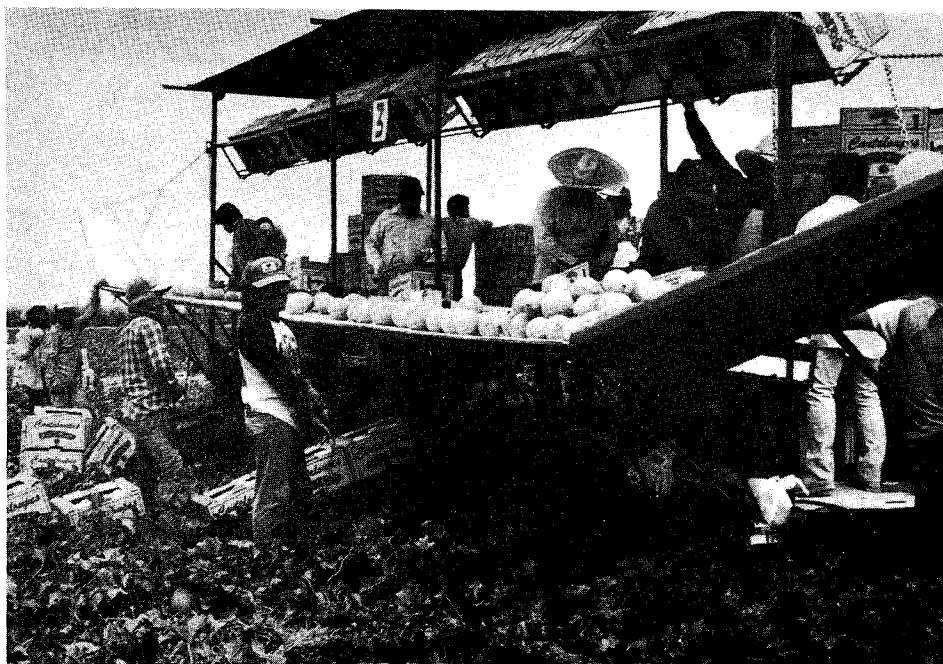
VEGETABLES, MELONS, AND POTATOES

The seasons for commercial vegetable crops in Arizona vary by crop. The summaries for western lettuce, carrots, broccoli, and cauliflower reflect the 1988/89 growing season while other vegetable crops included in this summary represent the 1989 season. Production for the principal vegetables, potato, and melon crops totaled 20,319,000 hundredweight, 3 percent above 1988. The production area of 86,700 harvested acres in 1989 includes lettuce, carrots, broccoli, potatoes, dry onions, watermelons, cantaloups, honeydews, and cauliflower. For the fresh market vegetables covered by the Agricultural Statistics Board, Arizona ranked third nationally in area harvested, total production, and total value of production. California and Florida ranked first and second, respectively.

Iceberg lettuce, the leader among the fresh market crops, accounted for over 59 percent of the total value of production for all vegetables in 1989. Head lettuce acreage has increased from 38,500 acres harvested in 1978 to the present estimate of 50,200 acres for the 1989 crop year. Melons, primarily cantaloups, watermelons, and honeydews, are second to lettuce in production and total value. In 1989, Arizona produced almost 3.7 million hundredweight of melons from nearly 16,100 acres with a value of \$27.4 million. This compares to 2.4 million hundredweight of melons harvested in 1978 from 15,320 acres. In 1978, the melon crops were valued at \$23.9 million. Acres of potatoes, both fresh and processing varieties, have remained fairly constant over the last several years. In 1989 Arizona grew 5,800 acres of potatoes compared to 6,000 acres grown in 1978. The 1989 crop yielded 31,500 pounds per harvested acre, the highest yield ever since Arizona started estimating potatoes nearly 100 years ago. Nationally, the state ranked second in lettuce, cauliflower, and broccoli production and third in honeydews.

The total value of vegetable production for Arizona in 1989 decreased 30 percent from previous year's level of over \$455 million. This decreased value can be primarily attributed to the 59 percent decrease in value of production for western lettuce. The 1988 winter lettuce crops in the western areas of Arizona were affected significantly by whitefly infestations and poor planting conditions resulting in lower yields per acre and higher prices. Western lettuce prices peaked in November 1988 with an average price of \$51.20 per hundredweight. This compares to \$15.00 per hundredweight in November 1989.

Value of "miscellaneous" vegetables was estimated at over \$46 million in 1989, nearly 15 percent of the value of all vegetables produced in Arizona. The most significant among these were Boston, romaine, and leaf lettuce, greens, field tomatoes, cabbage and asparagus.

FRUITS AND NUTS

During the 1988-89 growing season, Arizona's fruit and nut producers realized a total value of production of \$104.7 million. This was down considerably from the \$110.0 million value of crops produced during the 1987-88 season. Citrus, grapes and pecans accounted for the largest percentage of the total.

Total citrus production for the 1988-89 season was 16.2 million cartons, up from the 16.0 million cartons packed in the 1987-88 season. Value of production for all citrus in 1988-89 was \$69.2 million, an increase of \$4.9 million from the previous season.

Production of lemons during the 1988-89 season increased to 7.6 million cartons. With this increase, came an increase in the value of production; nearly \$34.0 million compared to \$31.4 million last season.

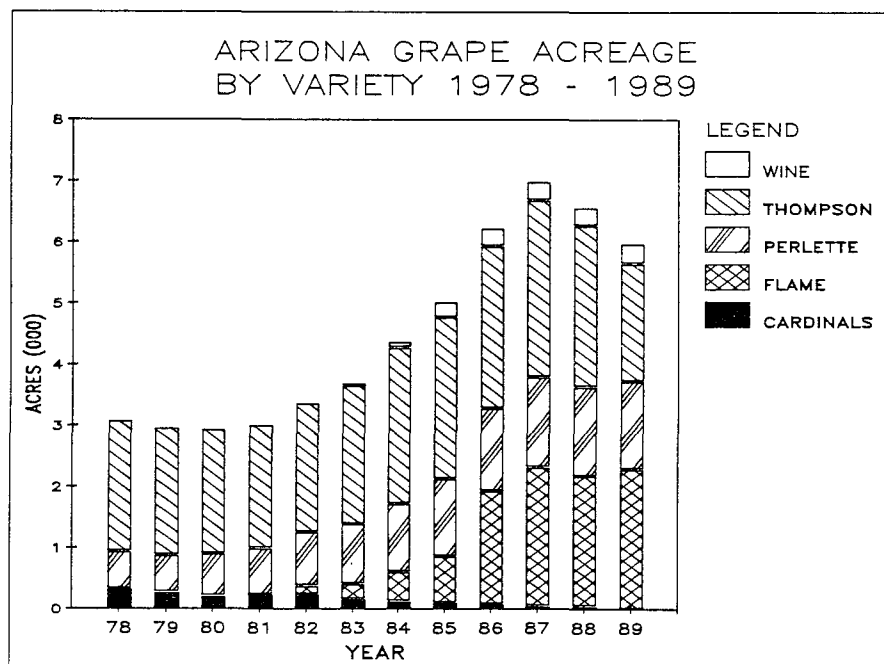
Production of all varieties of oranges in Arizona declined from 3.6 million cartons to 3.4 million cartons for the 1988-89 season. Production of Valencia oranges totaled 2.3 million cartons with a value of \$8.8 million. Navel, sweet and miscellaneous orange production totaled 1.1 million cartons valued at \$6.6 million.

Grapefruit production equaled last season's production of 3.9 million cartons; however, the value of production increased to \$9.7 million, up from the \$8.8 million value of the previous season. Tangerine production increased to 1.3 million cartons resulting in a value of production of \$10.1 million.

Grape utilized production totaled 26,500 tons for 1989, up 2,500 tons from 1988. A season average price of only \$674 per ton made the crop worth \$17.9 million, a decrease of \$12.1 million from 1988. The majority of Arizona grapes are for the fresh market; however an increasing amount were utilized for raisin production in 1989. Wine varieties are planted on nearly 300 acres.

Weather conditions were favorable for apples during the 1989 growing season. A late, but mild frost did hold production below potential for the young orchards; however, production was much better than in the 1988 season. Total apple output in 1989 was 24.8 million pounds, with a value of production of \$2.3 million.

There were 15,859 acres of tree nuts in production during 1989 compared with 15,697 acres producing in 1988. Pecans accounted for most of the tree nut acreage with 14,135 producing acres followed by 1,724 acres of pistachios.

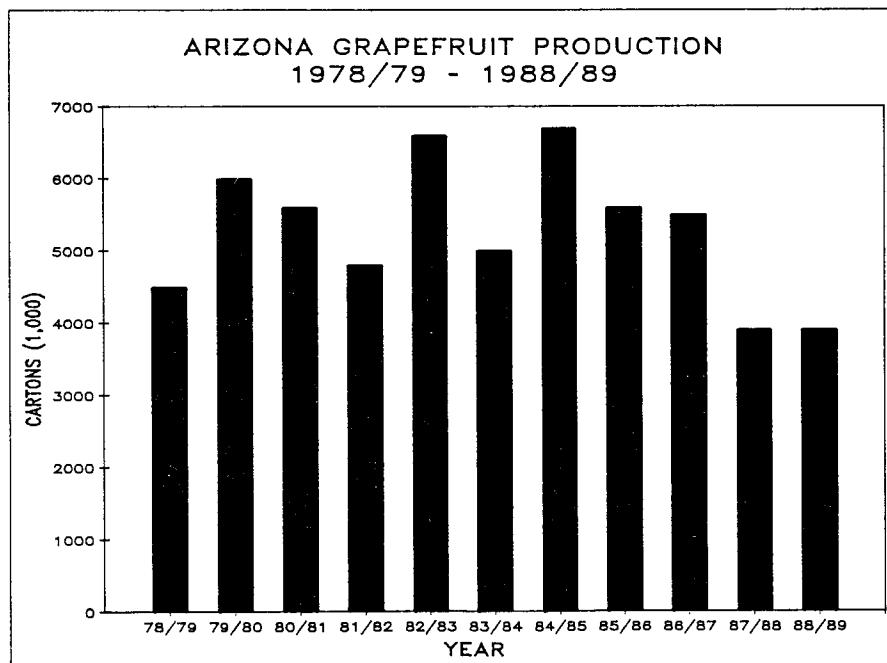

CATTLE AND CALVES

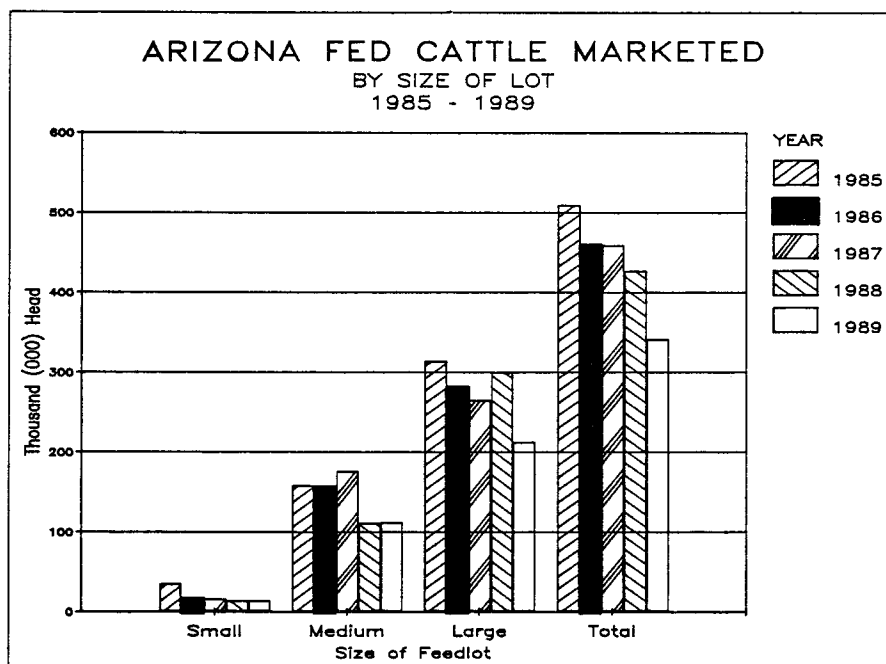
Arizona's cattle and calf inventory totaled 830,000 head as of January 1, 1990, 6 percent below 1989 and 14 percent below 1988. This represents the lowest inventory since 1950 when the number of head totaled 818,000. Several factors have contributed to the decline in cattle numbers over the last ten years, the drop in cattle on feed inventories being the most significant. During 1989, drought like conditions across Arizona forced many of our ranchers to sell parts or all of their herds. Conception rates were also affected by the dry conditions resulting in a lower calf crop. A total of 253,000 head of cattle were on feed January 1, 1990, 22,000 head fewer than a year earlier.

Gross income totaled \$453.9 million during 1989, a 13 percent decrease from 1988. During 1989, all cattle prices increased an average of 1 percent to \$66.30 per hundredweight with calves decreasing 1 percent to \$86.70 per hundredweight. Marketings totaled 672 million pounds, down 14 percent from 1988. In 1989, the prices received for beef were not high enough to offset a decrease in marketings which in turn forced the cattle industry to absorb a loss in cash receipts and gross income.

During 1989, there were 15 feedlots in operation, down from 18 the previous year. The average number of cattle on feed for the year was 213,000 head, down 19 percent from 1988. During 1989, the number of cattle on feed hit their lowest level since 1958. Placements totaled 369,000 head, down 17 percent from the previous year. Marketings of fed cattle totaled 342,000 head during 1989, down 20 percent from 1988. Fed cattle marketings accounted for 51 percent of the cattle marketed in Arizona during 1989.

Of the 275,000 head on feed January 1, 1990, there were 241,000 steers on feed for slaughter and 12,000 heifers. Heifers on feed in Arizona feedlots historically have made up less than 5 percent of the total number on feed. Steers and heifers under 500 pounds totaled 54,000 head, 500-699 pounds numbered 74,000, 700-899 pounds totaled 67,000, and 900 pounds and over tallied 58,000 head.

Inshipments during 1989 totaled 410,000 head which was down 16 percent from the 490,000 head brought into the state during 1988. Cattle shipped into Arizona are usually destined for feedlots and are typically shipped in from Texas, Mexico, New Mexico, Florida, Mississippi, and California.

DAIRY

The Arizona dairy industry has experienced steady growth over the last 10 years. In 1980, the average number of milk cows totaled 72,000 head and by 1989, the average reached 91,000 head. Dairy operations in Arizona are among the most modern and efficient in the country, with producers concentrating on state-of-the-art milking and herd management practices. Arizona's average commercial herd size is nearly 700 head.

The average number of cows milked increased 2 percent in 1989 to a record level of 91,000 head in Arizona dairies. This is up from last year's average of 89,000 head. Milk production per cow decreased a slight 1 percent with an average of 16,736 pounds of milk. This was a decrease of 118 pounds from 1988, and moved Arizona from fourth to fifth in the National State rankings of milk production per cow behind New Mexico (18,552 lbs./cow), Washington (18,209 lbs./cow), California (17,530 lbs./cow), and Colorado (16,803 lbs./cow).

Arizona's total milk production also hit a record high in 1989 with 1.52 million pounds being produced. Total U.S. milk production declined 1 percent in 1989 to 144 billion pounds. The annual average number of cows was 10.1 million head, down 1 percent from the average in 1988.

Producer's cash receipts from milk were up 1 percent in 1989 to 205.9 million dollars. This increase occurred partly due to a \$1.20 increase in price per hundredweight of milk marketed by producers in 1988.

SHEEP, LAMBS, AND WOOL

The inventory of sheep and lambs on Arizona farms and ranches has declined 32 percent over the last 10 years, from a high of 385,000 head on January 1, 1980, to 262,000 head on January 1, 1990. This continues the declining trend in total sheep and lambs which began almost 75 years ago. In 1917, 142 million sheep and lambs were reported in Arizona.

The number of sheep and lambs on Arizona farms and ranches on January 1, 1990 totaled 262,000 head, down 8 percent from the same date a year earlier. Stock sheep accounted for 84 percent of the inventory coming in at 220,000 head; the remainder were sheep and lambs on feed. The number of sheep and lambs on feed as of January 1, 1990 totaled 42,000 head, slightly below the 45,000 on feed as of January 1, 1989. The 1989 lamb crop of 130,000 was up 4 percent from 1988.

Sheep and lamb marketings during 1989 totaled 189,000 head, an increase of 3 percent from a year earlier. There were 20.4 million pounds marketed during 1989. Cash receipts showed a decline of 3 percent to 10.7 million, down 8 percent from the 11.6 million received during 1988.

Wool production decreased 7 percent in 1989 to 1.63 million pounds. The number of head shorn was estimated at 240,000 and the average fleece weight was up to 6.8 pounds per head. The price per pound of wool increased to \$1.10, up 2 percent from the \$1.08 per pound received in 1989. This resulted in a value of production for wool shorn of \$1.79 million, down 5 percent from the same date a year earlier.

HOGS AND PIGS

The Arizona pork industry has experienced a considerable decline in numbers in the last 10 years. In 1980, hogs and pigs totaled 180,000 head and by 1989, inventories had fallen to 100,000 head. The years of 1986 through 1989 included the most marked decline with a decrease of 55,000 head.

The inventory of all hogs and pigs in Arizona on December 1, 1989 totaled 100,000 head, 23 percent below a year earlier. Breeding hogs were down 3,000 head from the previous year to 12,000 head as market hogs also decreased 27,000 head to 88,000. Market hog inventory by weight group was as follows: under 60 pounds totaled 29,000 head, down 34 percent; 60-119 pounds were at 24,000 head, down 11 percent; 120-179 pounds totaled 20,000 head, down 13 percent; 180 pounds and over came in at 15,000 head, down 29 percent. Inshipments totaled 6,000 head during 1989, a decrease of 9,000 head from a year earlier. The majority of hogs and pigs shipped into the state are feeder pigs although farrow to finish operations are predominant.

A total of 24,000 sows farrowed during 1989 producing a pig crop of 197,000 head, a decrease of 8 percent from the pig crop in 1988. During the first half of the year (December-May), 14,000 sows farrowed with an average litter rate of 8.2 pigs, up slightly from 8.1 during the same period a year earlier. During the other half of the year (June to November), a total of 10,000 sows farrowed with an average litter rate of 8.3 pigs. Average litter sizes (pigs per litter) have increased nearly 14 percent since 1980.

The gross income generated by Arizona's pork industry for 1989 dropped to 20.1 million, a decline of almost \$4 million from the \$23.8 million received during 1988. The average price received for market hogs during 1989 was \$44.50 per hundredweight, a decrease of 5 percent from the \$46.90 received during 1988. Marketings totaled 222,000 head during 1989, an increase of 3 percent from 1988. The total liveweight of hogs marketed during 1989 came to 44.6 million pounds. Commercial hog slaughter totaled 15,900 head in 1989, down from 18,000 head slaughtered during 1988. The majority of hogs raised in Arizona are shipped out of state for slaughter.

GOATS

The Arizona angora goat inventory as of January 1, 1990 totaled 98,000 head, 2 percent less than last year's total of 100,000. The majority of the angora goats in Arizona are located in the northeastern part of the state on the Navajo Indian Reservation. Arizona is one of the five major producing states in the country with an estimated average value per head of \$50.00. The value of the inventory on January 1, 1990 for angora goats totaled 4.9 million dollars, down 11 percent from a year ago.

HONEY

Honey production in 1989 from producers with 5 or more hives totaled 32 million pounds, down 11 percent from 1988. The decline in production was a combination of fewer colonies producing honey and a lower yield per colony. There were 71,000 colonies producing honey, down 3 percent from 1988. Yield per colony averaged 45 pounds, down from 49 pounds in 1988. Dry weather conditions across the state contributed to the lower honey yield.

Prices for the 1989 crop averaged 61 cents per pound, up from the 49 cents received in 1988. The value of production for the 1989 crop totaled \$1.9 million, up 11 percent from 1988.

GRAZING FEES: Arizona, 1986-90

Approximately 44 percent of Arizona's total area of 72,960,000 acres is federal and state public trust lands administered by the U.S. Department of Interior's Bureau of Land Management, the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Forest Service, and Arizona's State Land Department. A majority of these public lands are leased for livestock grazing.

For the years 1979-1985, fees for grazing on federal public lands were determined by a formula established in the Public Rangelands Improvement Act of 1978 (PRIA). This act expired December 31, 1985. On February 14, 1986, in the absence of Congressional action, the President, through Executive Order 12548, indefinitely extended the PRIA formula subject to a few minor changes.

These minor changes included: (1) the Forage Value Index would use the weighted average estimate of the annual rental charge per head per month rather than Animal Unit Month; (2) the Beef Cattle Price Index means the weighted average annual selling price for beef cattle in the 11 Western States, and (3) the Prices Paid Index would reflect selected livestock production costs in the Western States. In addition, the Executive Order specified that the fee shall not be less than \$1.35 per Animal Unit Month and that annual adjustments would not exceed plus or minus 25 percent of the previous year's grazing fee.

Effective March 1, 1988, the Secretary of Agriculture issued a final ruling that established regulations for annually determining federal grazing fees. The fee system now in effect is the formula prescribed in the Executive Order of February, 1986, and, in most respects, is the same grazing fee formula enacted by Congress in 1978. Grazing fees will be based on a rate per head month.

A head month is a month's use and occupancy of range by one animal, except for sheep or goats. A full head month's fee is charged for a month of grazing by adult animals; if the grazing animal is weaned or 6 months of age or older at the time of entering the federal lands; or will become 12 months of age during the permitted period of use. For fee purposes 5 sheep or goats are equivalent to one cow, bull, steer, heifer, horse, or mule.

Arizona adopted the federal fee formula for state trust lands beginning in 1982, except that a base year fee of \$.95 is used instead of the federal base fee of \$1.23, the difference being a credit for range improvements made on state lands and for taxes paid on those lands by the lessees.

Grazing fee formula components are compiled by the USDA's Agricultural Statistics Board and furnished to USDI Bureau of Land Management, USDA's Forest Service, and the Arizona State Land Department for calculating the grazing fee each year. The components are made public at the same time, during the last week of December.

FARM LABOR

The farm employment and wage rate estimates are for the week that includes the 12th of the month. This corresponds to the week specified in general employment and wage series of other Government agencies.

Self-employed workers are defined as the operator and others who work on the farm without pay, but share in the returns from the farm. This concept was adopted in 1982 to provide data users with an agricultural series analogous with other industrial series. With the adoption of the self-employed category, all active partners working on the farm are counted as self-employed, whereas prior to 1982 only one was counted as the operator and the others were listed in the unpaid family category. Self-employed workers are counted if they work at least 1 hour during the survey week. Unpaid workers must work at least 15 hours or more to be counted.

Hired workers include both family members and other workers who are paid by the farm or ranch operator for working on agricultural jobs for 1 hour or more during the survey week. Workers paid by a crew leader or agricultural service firm hired by the farm or ranch operator to perform specific tasks are not included in the number of hired workers or wage rate statistics. A separate tabulation of these agricultural service workers is maintained only for the Nation, California, and Florida.

INTERNATIONAL TRADE

It is not possible under present methods of statistical measurement to determine what amount of Arizona's production is actually sold abroad. No reliable system of reporting this information has yet been designed, and no official series exists. If such figures were available they would be of little use to farm analysts and producers unless they bore some regular relationship to the state's annual agricultural production.

The alternative that is usually taken is to impute to each state a share of U.S. exports proportional to its share of total U.S. production. The export values appearing in the following table were calculated in this manner for the years 1984-85 through 1988-89. The ratio of Arizona production to U.S. production for each commodity listed was multiplied by the value of U.S. exports of that commodity. The same procedure can also yield an export value share for the southwest states taken together. While in certain cases the actual export value can be found to differ from the imputed export share, the defense of the calculation rests on the principle that supplies of a given commodity from one state or another are essentially interchangeable in domestic and foreign markets.

To make the apportionment of exports to states more realistic, data for certain groups such as feed grains were limited to states that account for 90 percent of the output. It was also assumed that a state would share in exports only if it had an apparent surplus. The latter involves computing grain-consuming animal units and the amount of grain needed to sustain those number.

WEATHER

Rainfall amounts during 1989 averaged well below normal in Arizona. Of the eighteen weather stations that reported both an annual and average amount, seventeen stations reported below average rainfall. The Yuma station reported 4.1 inches above normal rainfall, which was primarily due to two severe storms that flooded the area in late July and early August. For all months except July and August, rainfall in Yuma was only slightly below or well below normal. The station with the largest rainfall deficit was McNary with only 13.52 inches of rainfall for the year, 13.72 inches below normal.

Rainfall statistics vary considerably within Arizona due to the diverse geographic regions and elevations. Yuma, with a long-term average of 2.65 inches, typically receives the lowest annual rainfall; while McNary, with an average of 27.24 inches, will usually receive the most precipitation of any reporting station. In 1989 however, the lowest rainfall was reported by the Parker weather station, only 2.26 inches and the largest amount, 15.99 inches, was recorded in Payson.

The annual average temperature was above normal at all reporting stations for 1989. Phoenix again showed the largest departure from normal with an average temperature of 77.0 degrees, 5.8 degrees above normal. Yuma has the highest long-term average temperature at 73.9 degrees. The reporting station with the lowest average temperature in 1989 was Flagstaff with 47.8 degrees. Flagstaff also has the lowest long-term average temperature of 45.4 degrees.

Temperatures during January averaged below normal while precipitation averaged above normal. Cold temperatures made it necessary for fruit and vegetable growers in western and central areas to provide frost protection to their crops several times during the month. February began cool and rainy with snow showers on the 5th as low as 3,000 feet. Conditions changed as the month continued and by the 23rd, record high temperatures were recorded in Phoenix, Tucson and Yuma. February ended with above average temperatures and below normal rainfall.

Temperatures continued to rise during March, April and May, as records were set almost daily around the state. The week of Easter provided some relief from the heat as rain, snow and gusty winds cooled the air. Another break in the weather didn't come until mid-May when another low pressure system moved across the state. Soil and air temperatures were favorable for cotton planting which continued ahead of schedule through May.

June was a continuation of the unusually high temperatures and below normal rainfall. Many areas again experienced record breaking high temperatures. As the heat continued with no relief from rainfall, range quality decreased and ranchers were forced to increase their supplemental feeding and haul in water. Typical monsoons moved into the state in July and August but rain activity was isolated at best. Most weather stations averaged below normal precipitation even in these months. Temperatures continued to soar throughout July and August. On July 27th, 2.55 inches of rain fell in Yuma, only .10 inch short of the normal annual rainfall. Again on August 9th a severe storm hit Yuma dumping 3.44 inches of rain in the area. Severe flooding and high winds caused cut hay to be scattered in the Yuma and Parker areas. Thunderstorms continued across the state through August 19th, providing some relief from the dry, hot weather.

By the 9th of September, the monsoons had ended. Temperatures remained above normal throughout the end of the year. Typical fall weather did not arrive in Arizona until November 26th, when a strong storm system moved across the state lowering temperatures significantly. December was mostly mild with little precipitation.

SUMMARY: The April 1 forecast was for surface water supplies in Arizona to be limited as streamflow and reservoir storage declined. The water from the Central Arizona Project was expected to relieve some shortages. Runoff within the state had been very low and forecasts did not call for any improvement. The snowpack had melted dramatically. March moisture was below average and reservoir storage was low except on the Colorado River.

SNOWPACK: March fluctuated between periods of cool weather and periods of above normal temperatures. The warm days rapidly melted the Arizona snowpack. The Salt River snowpack, which never got much above 50% of average, was reduced to 8% of average by April 1. The Verde River snowpack, which was above average in mid March, was 1% of average at month's end. The Gila basin snowpack was 41% of average and the southern portion of the Little Colorado basin, 22%. The Chuska Mountains snowpack was 32% of average. Snow at the Grand Canyon was 28% of normal with snow remaining on the North Rim. The San Francisco Peaks was down to 56% of average.

PRECIPITATION: The first two weeks of March were stormy but the next two weeks were dry except for the last two days. As a result, precipitation for March was below average in all parts of Arizona. March precipitation was 73% of average over the Salt River basin and 72% over the Verde basin. The Little Colorado River basin ran 76% of normal. The San Francisco - upper Gila River basin received 64% of average moisture. Northwestern Arizona moisture was 38% of average. The Santa Cruz basin had 61% of average precipitation and Sulphur Springs Valley was only 49% of average for the month. Most of Arizona had received 57% to 77% of average moisture since October 1.

RESERVOIRS: Overall, reservoir storage continued to decline. The total Salt River Project storage on April 1 was at 50% of capacity with 1,014,800 acre feet. The Salt River dams were 58% full but the Verde River dams were only 5% full. San Carlos was 6% full with 55,700 acre feet. Lake Pleasant held 49,400 acre feet at 31% of capacity. Lakes Havasu, Mohave, Mead, and Powell held a combined storage of 41,617,000 acre feet at 78% of capacity. Lyman lake reported 11,400 acre feet and Show Low Lake had dropped to about 800 acre feet.

STREAMFLOW: March runoff was much below the 25 year average. Streamflow was 25% of average on the Verde River, 19% on the Salt, and 16% on the San Francisco at Clifton and the Gila River at Head of Safford Valley. The Gila at Calva was 7% of average after diversions. Tonto Creek ran 9% of average. The Little Colorado River inflow to Lyman Lake was less than the gage could measure. The lack of runoff on Arizona streams was a result of several factors. As of April 1, February was the only month in the preceding six months to receive above average precipitation in the headwaters of major Arizona streams. Most storms in January through March were cold with snow falling at low elevations which produced very little immediate runoff. Soils were very dry so when snow melted, most of the water was held by the soil and did not contribute to runoff. The April-May forecasts called for 14% of average runoff on the Salt River, 31% on the Verde, and 13% on the Gila at Safford Valley. The San Francisco forecast at Clifton was 15% of average. Little Colorado River inflow to Lyman Lake was only 1% of normal. The April-July forecast for the Colorado River was 45% of average inflow to Lake Powell.

UPLAND COTTON OBJECTIVE YIELD FORECASTING PROGRAM

The upland cotton yield forecasting program of the Arizona Agricultural Statistics Service includes both regular interviews with farmers, and objective measurements from samples in randomly selected fields.

During the yield forecasting season (August 1 to harvest), trained enumerators make monthly visits to randomly selected fields across the State. Row spacing measurements, plant counts, fruit counts, and other pertinent information affecting crop yields are recorded. The grower is interviewed to obtain information about acreage, seeding rates, fertilizer applied, and other information about the fields where objective counts are to be conducted. A State yield is generated from the different models used to forecast total bolls expected, average boll weight, and harvesting loss.

The number of samples varies from year to year as a result of changes in program size, grower refusals, or sometimes losses because of abandonment. Samples are also visited after the crop is harvested to obtain measurement of harvesting loss and other information affecting production.

The sample data published below were edited to eliminate nonrepresentative reports but still contain some sampling fluctuation. They are not official Agricultural Statistics Board estimates, but provide indications and trends in cropping practices.
