GRAIN STOCKS – MARCH 1, 2025

ARIZONA

Off-farm **corn** stocks in Arizona on March 1, 2025, were 1.77 million bushels, according to the March 1 Agricultural Survey and March Grain Stocks Report conducted by the Mountain Regional Field Office of the National Agricultural Statistics Service, USDA. Comparison data from March 1, 2024 was not available. Off-farm **all wheat** stocks in Arizona on March 1, 2025, were 2.11 million bushels, down 7 percent from March 1, 2024. Other Arizona grain stocks were not published separately to avoid disclosing data for individual operations.

COLORADO

Colorado corn stocks in all positions on March 1, 2025, were 48.86 million bushels, down 17 percent from March 1, 2024, according to the March 1 Agricultural Survey and March Grain Stocks Report conducted by the Mountain Regional Field Office of the National Agricultural Statistics Service, USDA. Corn stored on farms amounted to 33.00 million bushels, up 3 percent from a year ago. Corn stored off farms amounted to 15.86 million bushels, down 41 percent from a year ago. Off-farm **sorghum** stocks totaled 2.07 million bushels on March 1, 2025, up 39 percent from last year. Off-farm **oat** stocks totaled 27,000 bushels on March 1, 2025, up 80 percent from a year ago. Off-farm **barley** stocks totaled 4.70 million bushels, up 28 percent from last year.

All wheat stocks in all positions in Colorado on March 1, 2025, were 34.63 million bushels, down 3 percent from March 1, 2024. All wheat stored on farms amounted to 7.70 million bushels, up 10 percent from a year ago. All wheat stored off farms amounted to 26.93 million bushels, down 7 percent from a year ago. Other Colorado grain stocks were not published separately to avoid disclosing data for individual operations.

MONTANA

Oat stocks in all positions in Montana on March 1, 2025, were 521,000 bushels, up 40 percent from March 1, 2024, according to the March 1 Agricultural Survey and March Grain Stocks Report conducted by the Mountain Regional Field Office of the National Agricultural Statistics Service, USDA. Oats stored off-farm were down 60 percent from last year to 21,000 bushels. Oats stored on farm amounted to 500,000 bushels, up 56 percent from a year ago. Montana **barley** stocks in all positions on March 1, 2025, were 23.46 million bushels, down 12 percent from a year ago. Barley stored on farms was 16.00 million bushels, unchanged from last year. Off-farm barley stocks totaled 7.46 million bushels, down 30 percent from a year ago.

All wheat stocks in all positions in Montana on March 1, 2025, were 96.12 million bushels, up 8 percent from March 1, 2024. All wheat stocks stored on farms amounted to 64.00 million bushels, up 12 percent from a year ago. All wheat stored off farms amounted to 32.12 million bushels, down less than 1 percent from a year ago. **Durum wheat** stocks in all positions on March 1, 2025, were 11.41 million bushels, up 3 percent from a year ago. Durum wheat stocks stored on farms amounted to 9.00 million bushels, and Durum wheat stored off farms amounted to 2.41 million bushels. Other Montana grain stocks were not published separately to avoid disclosing data for individual operations.

NEW MEXICO

New Mexico grain stocks on March 1, 2025, were not published separately to avoid disclosing data for individual operations.

UTAH

Off-farm **corn** stocks in Utah on March 1, 2025, were 350,000 bushels, according to the March 1 Agricultural Survey and March Grain Stocks Report conducted by the Mountain Regional Field Office of the National Agricultural Statistics Service, USDA. Comparison data from March 1, 2024 was not available. Off-farm **all wheat** stocks in Utah on March 1, 2025, were 4.05 million bushels, up 3 percent from March 1, 2024. Other Utah grain stocks were not published separately to avoid disclosing data for individual operations.

WYOMING

Wyoming grain stocks on March 1, 2025, were not published separately to avoid disclosing data for individual operations.

UNITED STATES

Corn stocks in all positions on March 1, 2025 totaled 8.15 billion bushels, down 2 percent from March 1, 2024. Of the total stocks, 4.50 billion bushels were stored on farms, down 11 percent from a year earlier. Off-farm stocks, at 3.65 billion bushels, are up 12 percent from a year ago. The December 2024 - February 2025 indicated disappearance is 3.92 billion bushels, compared with 3.82 billion bushels during the same period last year.

Grain sorghum stored in all positions on March 1, 2025 totaled 150 million bushels, up 42 percent from a year ago. On-farm stocks, at 14.9 million bushels, are up 35 percent from last March. Off-farm stocks, at 135 million bushels, are up 43 percent from a year earlier. The December 2024 - February 2025 indicated disappearance from all positions is 62.2 million bushels, 26 percent below the same period last year.

Oats stored in all positions on March 1, 2025 totaled 41.4 million bushels, 20 percent below the stocks on March 1, 2024. Of the total stocks on hand, 16.9 million bushels were stored on farms, up 4 percent from a year ago. Off-farm stocks totaled 24.5 million bushels, down 30 percent from the previous year. Indicated disappearance during December 2024 - February 2025 totaled 10.7 million bushels, 1 percent below the same period a year ago.

Barley stocks in all positions on March 1, 2025 totaled 103 million bushels, down 8 percent from March 1, 2024. On-farm stocks are estimated at 44.5 million bushels, 20 percent below a year ago. Off-farm stocks, at 58.4 million bushels, are 4 percent above March 2024. The December 2024 - February 2025 indicated disappearance totaled 13.9 million bushels, 54 percent below the same period a year earlier.

All wheat stored in all positions on March 1, 2025 totaled 1.24 billion bushels, up 14 percent from a year ago. On-farm stocks are estimated at 307 million bushels, up 13 percent from last March. Off-farm stocks, at 930 million bushels, are up 14 percent from a year ago. The December 2024 - February 2025 indicated disappearance is 336 million bushels, 1 percent above the same period a year earlier.

Durum wheat stocks in all positions on March 1, 2025 totaled 38.7 million bushels, up 6 percent from a year ago. On-farm stocks, at 21.6 million bushels, are up 15 percent from March 1, 2024. Off-farm stocks totaled 17.1 million bushels, down 3 percent from a year ago. The December 2024 - February 2025 indicated disappearance of 17.8 million bushels is 100 percent above the same period a year earlier.

Sunflower stocks in all positions on March 1, 2025 totaled 564 million pounds, 52 percent below March 1, 2024. All stocks stored on farms totaled 263 million pounds and off-farm stocks totaled 301 million pounds. Stocks of oil type sunflower seed are 426 million pounds; of this total, 210 million pounds are on-farm stocks and 216 million pounds are off-farm stocks. Non-oil sunflower stocks totaled 138 million pounds, with 53.4 million pounds stored on the farm and 84.2 million pounds stored off the farm.

Soybeans stored in all positions on March 1, 2025 totaled 1.91 billion bushels, up 4 percent from March 1, 2024. Soybean stocks stored on farms are estimated at 877 million bushels, down 6 percent from a year ago. Off-farm stocks, at 1.03 billion bushels, are up 13 percent from last March. Indicated disappearance for the December 2024 - February 2025 quarter totaled 1.19 billion bushels, up 3 percent from the same period a year earlier.
