Arkansas January 1 All Cattle Inventory Down 4 Percent

All cattle and calves in Arkansas as of January 1, 2023, totaled 1.63 million head, were down 4 percent from January 1, 2022. The calf crop for the full year of 2022 was 760,000 head, down 1 percent from last year. All cows and heifers that have calved, at 870,000 head, were down 4 percent from January 1, 2022; beef cows, at 866,000 head, were down 4 percent; and milk cows, at 4,000 head, were down 20 percent from 2022. All heifers weighing 500 pounds and over were down 7 percent at 195,000 head. Steers were unchanged at 115,000 head; bulls were unchanged at 55,000 head; and calves weighing less than 500 pounds were down 4 percent at 395,000 head.

Meat and other goat inventory in Arkansas, on January 1, 2023, totaled 31,000 head, unchanged from the previous year. The January 1, 2023, Arkansas milk goat inventory totaled 4,500 head, up 500 head from 2022.


