WEATHER

Temperature highs ranged from the mid 50s to mid 80s in the mountains, mid 60s to low 90s in the valley, high 60s to mid 90s along the coast, and low 80s to mid 100s in the desert. Temperature lows ranged from the low 30s to low 50s in the mountains, high 30s to mid 70s in the desert, mid 40s to mid 60s along the coast, and high 40s to low 70s in the valley.

FIELD CROPS

In Tulare, Fresno, and Kings counties, **alfalfa** was cut and baled. **Sorghum** was nearing harvest. **Corn** continued to be harvested. **Cotton** was in full bloom and bolls were filling. **Wheat** planting preparation continued. Harvesting of **safflower** continued. **Rice** was harvested.

FRUIT CROPS

Nectarine, **peach**, **plum**, **pluot**, and **prune** harvest was winding down for the season. **Pear**, **fig**, **olive**, **pomegranate**, and **Asian pear** harvest continued. Post-harvest pruning and mechanical topping of stone fruit orchards was ongoing. Dried pruning debris was shredded. After harvest, some older stone fruit orchards were pushed out and burned to clear for replanting. **Kiwis** and **persimmons** were maturing well. Table and wine **grape** harvest was ongoing. Irrigation and mechanical vineyard maintenance continued. A limited amount of Valencia **oranges** were harvested. Gassing of Valencia oranges continued to counter re-greening. Ruby red **grapefruit** and **limes** were harvested. Citrus groves were pruned, hedged, and skirted.

NUT CROPS

Orchards continued to be irrigated. **Walnuts** were developing well. Orchard floor cleaning continued in preparation of harvest. **Almond** harvest was well underway and **pistachio** harvest continued.

VEGETABLE CROPS

In Colusa, Sacramento, Solano, and Yolo counties, processing **tomato** harvest was winding down with below average yields reported. Halloween **pumpkin** harvest continued in preparation for Halloween. Fresno County reported late bell **peppers** progressing well. **Carrot** planting was completed with herbicides sprays for emerging weeds underway.

LIVESTOCK

Foothill rangeland and non-irrigated pasture were reported to be in fair to poor condition. Supplemental feeding was ongoing. Some cattle grazed in higher elevation pasture.
