## **AVOCADOS**

FLORIDA: The forecast of avocados for certified shipments is maintained at 800,000 bushels. If realized, this will be the largest crop since before Hurricane Andrew in 1992. Last season, 744,000 bushels were shipped commercially.

Shipments through September were 461,800 bushels, well ahead of the previous season's 388,300 to the same date.

Demand is reported strong with good to excellent quality fruit.

CALIFORNIA: With one month remaining in the 1995-96 season, shipments total 6,269,000 bushel equivalents as reported by the California Avocado Commission. Expected total shipments for the season will be about 6 percent higher than last season.
