2024-2025 CITRUS SUMMARY:
PRODUCTION, PRICE PER BOX AND
PRODUCTION BY COUNTY

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All Citrus Production Down 28 Percent

Florida's all citrus production in 2024-2025 is 14.6 million boxes, down 28 percent from the previous season's 20.3 million boxes. All orange production dropped 32 percent to 12.2 million boxes. Non-Valencia production at 4.60 million boxes is down 32 percent from the 2023-2024 season. Valencia orange production at 7.60 million boxes is down 33 percent. All grapefruit production decreased 27 percent to 1.30 million boxes. Tangerine and tangelo production in 2024-2025 is down 11 percent from the previous season. Lemons were added to the citrus production in the 2024-2025 season.

The top 5 citrus producing counties were Polk (3.79 million boxes), Highlands (2.89 million boxes), Desoto (1.37 million boxes), Hardee (1.30 million boxes), and St. Lucie (1.27 million boxes). Together they account for 76 percent of the state's total citrus production. Oranges constituted 88 percent of the citrus production, grapefruit accounted for 9 percent, and tangerines and tangelos represented 3 percent.

Estimates of county production are prepared from objective survey data used in forecasting citrus crop production. The apportionment of final harvest to the counties is based on bearing trees, an estimate of the average fruit per tree, and the drop and size surveys. Sample size used in these surveys and the distribution of the sample groves around the state are chosen to minimize error in the estimates of production and are not to be considered as precise for the counties as at the state level.
