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1996 FLORICULTURE AND NURSERY SALES INCREASE 2 PERCENT

Grower sales of Hawaii's flower and nursery products increased for the second straight year to \$69.5 million. According to the Hawaii Agricultural Statistics Service, the 1996 wholesale value was 2 percent more than 1995.

Increases in orchids, foliage, and potted flowering plant categories helped push the wholesale value higher despite declines or no growth in other categories. Cut flower value declined 1 percent from

STATE SUMMARY (Continued)

1995 making 1996 the sixth consecutive year of declining values for this general category. Within the cut flower category, anthuriums, miniature carnations, other gingers, and proteas made positive gains over the previous year. Cut anthuriums and proteas advanced in valuation, a result of increased prices.

Value of orchid sales increased 30 percent in 1996. All orchid types contributed toward making positive gains.


The lei flower category remained relatively unchanged at \$3.9 million. Plumerias and lei dendrobiums increased sales by 47 percent and 3 percent, respectively. However, the increases were not enough to offset declines in other lei flower types.


Foliage sales (potted, cut, and unfinished), pegged at \$16.9 million, were 2 percent higher than 1995. Sales of potted flowering plants were valued at \$3.9 million, a 17 percent increase over the previous year.

COUNTY RANKINGS:

Hawaii island sales, pegged at \$34.7 million, were 6 percent higher than 1995. Oahu farmers registered sales of \$25.3 million, 3 percent lower than the previous year. Maui/Molokai sales totaled \$7.5 million, 4 percent lower than last year. Kauai posted

nearly \$2.0 million in sales, 10 percent more than 1995.



LANDSCAPE PLANT MATERIAL VALUED AT \$10.2 MILLION

The State's growers of landscape material had sales pegged at \$10.2 million in 1996. This value combines items published elsewhere in this release. It does not include the value of landscape design or installation but only the wholesale value of plant material grown.

Potted foliage for landscape, pegged at \$3.5 million, accounted for 35 percent of the landscape plant material category in 1996. Bedding/Garden plants, with \$2.6 million, accounted for 25 percent of the total. Other landscape plant material and ornamentals and trees followed at \$2.3 million and \$1.7 million, respectively.

BIG ISLAND ACCOUNTS FOR HALF OF TOTAL VALUE

Hawaii Island growers accounted for one-half of the State's total wholesale value of flower and nursery products in 1996. Big Island's 316 producers generated \$34.7 million in wholesale sales, 6 percent more than 1995. With the exception of cut flowers and all other nursery products, all categories registered increases. Oahu followed as the second leading island with a wholesale value of \$25.3 million. This was 3 percent lower than last year despite increases in the orchid, foliage, and potted flowering plant categories. Floriculture and nursery farms on Oahu numbered 211 in 1996. Maui/Molokai's 111 floriculture and nursery farms reported sales of \$7.5 million, 4 percent lower than a year ago. Kauai's 52 producers generated nearly \$2.0 million in wholesale sales, 10 percent more than 1995.



OUT-OF-STATE SALES DECLINE 2 PERCENT

The value of out-of-State sales of flowers and nursery products (including wholesale and retail sales) during 1996 was estimated at \$38.4 million. Increases in dendrobium sprays, cymbidiums, other cut greens, heliconias, other potted orchids, and the all other products category were not enough to offset declines by other commodities. Values in this table are not comparable to values shown in the majority of other tables throughout this release. The value of out-of-State sales represents the dollar received at the point the commodity leaves the State. Thus, the product contains retail and



wholesale sales and may include multiple transactions by the time it leaves the State.

Anthuriums remained the number one floriculture crop or nursery product exported. The \$9.7 million in value was 7 percent lower than 1995. Potted foliage followed at \$9.5 million, 4 percent lower than a year ago. Dendrobium sprays moved into third with \$4.1 million in value. This was 32 percent higher than the previous year. Other potted orchids increased 17 percent from 1995. The \$4.0 million generated by other potted orchids ranked it fourth in out-of-State sales.

U.S. FLORICULTURE VALUED AT \$3.42 BILLION

The value of floriculture crops continued upward in 1996. The total value of all crops at wholesale for all growers with \$10,000 or more in sales was estimated at \$3.42 billion for 1996, compared with \$3.33 billion in 1995. California continued as the leading state with crops valued at \$724 million, an increase of 5 percent from the value of floriculture in 1995. Florida continued to expand its output as the 1996 value reached \$660 million for a 5 percent gain. These two states accounted for 40 percent of the total value in the 36 states surveyed in the National Floriculture Survey. The top five states, California, Florida, Texas, Michigan, and Ohio accounted for \$1.90

billion, 56 percent of the total value. Growers with sales exceeding \$100,000 for the year accounted for 93 percent of the total, at \$3.17 billion. This size group included only 47 percent of the total number of growers.

The number of floriculture growers continued to fall as the count in 1996 was 9,765, down 393 from the

number in 1995. The number of growers with sales of \$100,000 or more declined from 4,657 in 1995 to 4,614 in 1996.

The use of hired workers increased in 1996. A total of 8,242 operations reported hired workers during the year compared with 7,974 reporting hired workers in 1995. Overall, 84 percent of the operations used some hired workers in 1996

compared with 78 percent in 1995. The average number of hired workers used during peak times equaled the previous year's average of 13.8 workers.


The total value of floriculture crops grown by operations exceeding the \$100,000 minimum sales level reached \$3.17 billion in 1996, a 3 percent increase over the \$3.07 billion for 1995. Values for all categories rose in 1996. Bedding and garden plants, the largest contributor, recorded a 4 percent increase in wholesale value to \$1.41 billion. Flowering potted plants recorded a modest 1 percent boost over the previous year reaching \$686 million. Foliage showed a 2 percent higher value at \$508 million. Values of cut flowers and cut cultivated greens grew 5 percent and 7 percent, respectively.

Where does Hawaii rank? For producers with \$100,000 or more in total sales, Hawaii's cut flower wholesale value of sales ranked 4th behind California, Florida, and Colorado. Hawaii's foliage for indoor or patio use growers also ranked 4th in the nation behind Florida, California, and Texas.

ANTHURIUM VALUE OF SALES FLAT

Hawaii's anthurium producers, with total flower and nursery sales of \$10,000 or more (total sales includes anthuriums and other crops), registered sales of \$7.1 million in 1996. This was relatively unchanged despite a 6 percent decline in quantity sold. Production area totaled 11.1 million square feet, 2 percent lower than a year ago.



ANTHURIUMS: Farm numbers, sales, value, and production area, State of Hawaii, 1992-96¹



VALUE OF ANTHURIUM EXPORTS DECLINES IN 1996

Out-of-State anthurium sales were estimated at \$9.7 million for 1996, 7 percent lower than 1995. The out-of-State value includes wholesale and retail sales and is a relative gauge of sales outside of the State of Hawaii.

Out-of-State shipments from the Big Island, which produces more than 99 percent of the State's anthuriums, totaled 675,300 dozen in 1996. Big Island's total out-of-State shipments were 11 percent fewer than 1995. Mainland destinations, which made up about 55 percent of the Big Island's exports, were 3 percent higher than 1996. previous year.


DENDROBIUM ORCHID SALES JUMP 23 PERCENT

Dendrobium orchid sales were pegged at \$10.1 million in 1996. All dendrobium orchid categories registered increases to push the total value of dendrobiums 23 percent higher than 1995.

Potted in bud/bloom, valued at \$4.6 million, represented 46 percent of the total dendrobium orchid value. Value of sales for pots in

bud/bloom increased 11 percent from a year ago and was the highest sales value recorded.

Growers of cut sprays registered \$4.1 million in sales, nearly 41 percent of the total dendrobium value. At 34 percent more than 1995, this was the highest value on record and the first time cut sprays exceeded \$4 million in value of sales. Individual blossoms of dendrobiums were valued at \$740,000, 3 percent more than 1995. Value of community pots, pegged at \$610,000, nearly tripled the 1995 value.

DENDROBIUM ORCHIDS: Sales and value, State of Hawaii, 1992-961



PRODUCTION AREA 6 PERCENT LOWER

The combined production area for dendrobium cut sprays and bud/bloom pots totaled 4.2 million square feet, 6 percent lower than 1995 for growers with \$10,000 or more in total sales (total sales can include crops other than dendrobiums). Production area reported by growers includes newly planted, as well as established acreage; thus, year-to-year yield comparisons calculated using area and sales may be misleading.

Area utilized for cut sprays totaled 3.1 million square feet, 9 percent lower than 1995. Production area for potted in bud/bloom totaled 1.0 million square feet, 8 percent more than last year.



CUT SPRAYS CARRY DENDROBIUM EXPORTS TO NEW HIGH

Export dendrobium sales totaled \$7.1 million in 1996, 10 percent higher than the previous highest Potted dendrobiums, with \$3.0 year, 1995. million in sales, declined 11 percent. However, cut sprays with \$4.1 million in export sales registered a 32 percent increase which was enough to offset the lower value of the potted category.
