
2000 POINSETTIA INVENTORY ESTIMATED AT 345,000 POTS

Hawaii's October 1 poinsettia inventory is pegged at 345,000 pots, according to the *Hawaii Agricultural Statistics Service*. Total pot inventory available for the upcoming holiday season is relatively unchanged from 1999's level.

Historically, October 1 pot inventory represents 95-98 percent of total pots set and does not take into account culling for disease and quality, combining smaller pots into hanging baskets, and other factors which may affect the actual amount reaching markets during the peak holiday season.

NAKASONE Statistical Assistant A closer look at the reported data revealed pots in the 5-6 1/2 inch category made up the majority of the inventory with 203,550 pots or 59 percent of the total. Pots less than 5 inches comprised 30 percent while those in the 6 1/2 inch category made up 11 percent of this year's October 1 pot inventory.

The proportion of pots grown under saran made up 49 percent of this season's inventory. Those grown under glass or glass substitute were 28 percent of the total and pots grown under open field conditions were 23 percent of total pots grown.

Varieties reported were Freedom red at 48 percent of the total, 10 percent to other Freedom varieties, and 5 percent Supjibi. The remaining pots were planted to other varieties with the red types making up the majority at 25 percent.
