



MORE POINSETTIAS AVAILABLE FOR 2005 HOLIDAY SEASON

poinsettias available More are for upcoming 2005 holiday season according to USDA, NASS, Hawaii Field Office. Based on the October 2005 poinsettia grower survey taken earlier in the month, inventory is pegged at 438,000 pots and 16 percent above the 2004 total.

Historically, October pot inventory represents 95-98 percent of total pots set and does not take into account culling for disease and quality, combining smaller pots into hanging baskets, and other factors that may affect the actual amount reaching markets during the peak holiday season.

A closer look at the October 2005 inventory revealed pots in the 5-6 ½ inch category made up the majority of the inventory with 278,000 pots or 64 percent of the total. Pots less than 5 inches accounted for 26 percent or 115,000 pots while those in the Over 6 ½ inch category made up 10 percent or 45,000 pots.

The proportion of pots grown under saran made up 48 percent of this season's inventory. Those grown under glass or glass substitute were 27 percent of the total and pots grown under open field conditions were 25 percent of the total.

Red continued to be the popular color for the upcoming season with Freedom Red and other red making up nearly 75 percent of the inventory. The remaining 25 percent was divided among the other varieties.
