

HOG INVENTORY AT ALL TIME LOW

According to the *Hawaii Agricultural Statistics Service*; the total number of hogs and pigs on Hawaii farms on December 1, 1997 was **27,000** head compared with 28,000 a year earlier and 34,000 two years ago. The 27,000 hog inventory is a record low. The decline in inventory occurred in the breeding hog category, which decreased to 5,000 head, while the market hog herd remained unchanged at 22,000 head.

All islands, except for the Island of Oahu recorded declines in inventory. The largest decline occurred on Maui county following by the Island of Hawaii. The increase in herd size on Oahu can be attributed to the recovery by hog operators from the Porcine Reproductive and Respiratory Syndrome (PRRS) virus, which seriously infected hog operations in the Waianae district on Oahu the previous year. PRRS, became a serious problem between the summer of 1996 into the first half of 1997, causing pregnant sows to abort or have still births and deaths of weak piglets soon after birth.

The 1997 pig crop totaled 38,000 pigs, a decrease of 7,000 and 13,000 pigs from 1996 and 1995, respectively. The decrease is attributed to the downsizing and closure of farms as well as to PRRS. Farmers project farrowing 3,000 sows during the next 6-month period covering December 1, 1997 to May 30, 1998. This is an anticipated increase of 200 and 300 sows from the previous 6 months (June 1, 1997 to November 30, 1997) and the same 6 month period a year earlier.

U.S. HOG INVENTORY UP 7 PERCENT

U.S. inventory of all hogs and pigs on December 1, 1997, was 59.9 million head. This was 7 percent above December 1996.

Breeding inventory, at 6.98 million head, is up 5 percent from December 1, 1996.

Market hog inventory, at 52.9 million head was 7 percent above last year.

The September-November 1997 U.S. pig crop at 25.3 million head was 9 percent more than 1996 and 8 percent more than 1995.

Sows farrowing during this period totaled 2.93 million head, 8 percent above last year.

• The average pigs per litter continues to increase at a rapid pace, with an average of 8.63 pigs saved per litter for the September - November period.

U.S. producers intend to have 2.91 million sows farrow during the December 1997 - February 1998 quarter, 9 percent above the actual farrowings during the same period last year, and 6 percent higher than 1996. Intended farrowings for March - May 1998 at 3.04 million sows are 3 percent above both the 1997 and the 1996 period.

The number of operations with hogs totaled 138,690 during 1997, down 11 percent from last year and 24 percent below 1995. Places with 2,000 or more hogs on hand accounted for 4 percent of the operations and 55 percent of the inventory. This is the second time operations with inventories over 2,000 head have controlled over 50 percent of the total inventory. Operations with over 5,000 head accounted for 35 percent of the total inventory.
