Late December rains slow crop growth

Variable weather conditions resulted in vegetable crops making mixed progress during December. Crop-growing conditions were generally favorable for the first three weeks as relatively dry weather prevailed. Vegetable crops stressed by heavy rains in late November took advantage of the dry weather by making good growth. Weather conditions, however, changed dramatically on December 22 when a pre-frontal convergence band brought moderate to heavy showers to Kauai, Oahu, Molokai, and Lanai. This was followed a few days later by another cold front that produced another round of heavy showers to Kauai and Oahu. By the end of the month, vegetable crops were again in fair to poor condition. Crop progress was further hampered by additional showers during the first few weeks of January.

Expected changes in harvested acreage were almost evenly split among vegetables in January. Snap beans (+18%), Chinese cabbage (+25%), and dry onions (+30%) are all expected to show increases in harvested acreage in January. Vegetable crops expected to show a decrease in harvested acreage this month are head cabbage (-5%), cucumbers (-6%), mustard cabbage (-39%), sweet corn (-36%), and romaine (-31%). Harvested acreage of head lettuce, semi-head (Manoa) lettuce, and green onions are expected to remain unchanged from December.

Year-ago, month-ago, current, and upcoming harvested acreage.







December production down for most vegetables

CHINESE CABBAGE production totaled 388,000 pounds in December, down 10 percent from November. Crop conditions were generally good, but a 30 percent drop in harvested acreage reduced December's production.

HEAD CABBAGE production is estimated at 862,000 pounds, up 23 percent from last month. Cooler temperatures have improved crop conditions, but have also slowed development. Weeds are problem in some fields.

SWEET CORN production is estimated at 129,000 pounds for December, down 15 percent from the previous month and down 12 percent from a year ago. Crop conditions were mostly fair.

CUCUMBER production is estimated at 326,000 pounds for December, down 13 percent from November and down 18 percent from a year ago. Crop conditions were mainly poor as recent rains

have taken a toll on the crop.


DRY ONION production totaled 130,000 pounds, down 38 percent from November, but up 62 percent from a year ago. Overall crop conditions were fair as cloudy skies, and occasionally heavy showers, have hampered crop growth and quality.

GREEN PEPPER production is

pegged at 185,000 pounds for December, down 9 percent from November. Crop conditions were fair.

TOMATO production is estimated at 1.1 million pounds in December, down 1 percent from the previous month and down 22 percent from a year ago. Crop conditions were generally fair. ■
