MINK AND HONEY

MINK: Illinois ranks ninth nationally in mink pelt production. Production of mink pelts in Illinois increased 10 percent in 2009 to 71,100 pelts. Females bred to produce kits in 2010 totaled 18,400, down 6 percent from the number of females bred to produce kits in 2009.

HONEY: Illinois honey production in 2009 from producers with 5 or more colonies totaled 272,000 pounds, down 39 percent from 2008. Prices for 2009 Illinois honey averaged \$2.26 per pound, down 33 cents from the 2008 price. The total value of honey production was \$615,000, down 47 percent from 2008. Prices are based on retail sales by producers and sales to private processors and cooperatives.
