

The data contained in this book is published each year to meet the need for accurate, reliable and unbiased information regarding Indiana's agricultural production. This is the 81st edition, which documents Indiana Agriculture in 2006, and is published by the cooperative efforts of USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service and Purdue University Agricultural Research Programs. 
# FARM INCOME

## CASH RECEIPTS

Indiana farmers received \$5.97 billion in cash receipts from farm marketings in 2006, 10 percent above 2005. Cash receipts from crops were up 16 percent, and receipts for livestock were slightly above the previous year. Marketings of crops at \$3.92 billion, accounted for 65.6 percent of the total cash receipts in 2006 while livestock receipts, at \$2.05 billion, accounted for the remaining 34.4 percent. In the previous year crop receipts accounted for 62.3 percent and livestock 37.7 percent of total cash receipts.

Corn was the leading source of income for Indiana farmers in 2006 and amounted to \$1.85 billion. Soybeans were second at \$1.52 billion and meat animals were third with \$995 million. Poultry and Eggs returned to the fourth leading contributor with \$575 million and Dairy follows with \$449 million. These five commodity groups accounted for over 90 percent of the 2006 cash receipts.


10% Probability for Frost

## CROP HIGHLIGHTS

**ACREAGE:** Indiana's five major field crops totaled 12.3 million acres during 2006, virtually the same as the 2005 planted acreage. Corn acreage for harvest was 7 percent below a year ago, while soybean acreage for harvest increased 6 percent. Winter wheat harvested acreage was up 35 percent from a year ago and all hay harvested acreage was the same as the 2005 level. Oat acreage for harvest increased 56 percent from the 2005 level. Other crops showing harvested acreage changes were processing tomatoes down 1 percent, snap beans for processing down 4 percent, and popcorn down 36 percent. In addition, cantaloupe acreage fell 7 percent and watermelon acreage increased 1 percent.

**YIELDS:** The 2006 growing season got off to a slow start due to cool, wet weather in April and May. Many corn and soybean fields or portions of fields had to be replanted due to heavy rains and cool temperatures causing germination and emergence problems. As of May 7th, 52 percent of the corn acreage and 15 percent of the soybean acreage had been planted. Planting of both crops was running behind the 5-year average pace. By May 28th, 89 percent of the corn acreage was planted and 58 percent of the soybean acreage was planted. Southern portions of the state were the furthest behind in planting because of frequent rain showers throughout the spring. Most areas of the state experienced good growing conditions during June, July and August with adequate precipitation and normal temperatures. Cool temperatures and heavy rains in September slowed the

maturing of both corn and soybeans. Harvest began later than normal and lagged behind the 5-year average throughout the fall. The average yield for corn was 157 bushels per acre, 3 bushels above the 2005 yield and the third highest on record. The average yield for soybeans was 50 bushels per acre, 1 bushel above the 2005 yield of 49 bushels per acre. The average yield for winter wheat at 69 bushels per acre was 3 bushels below the previous year's record yield of 72 bushels per acre. The average oat yield at 80 bushels per acre tied the record yield set in 2001. All hay yield at 3.39 tons per acre was .21 tons higher than the 2005 yield. Popcorn averaged 4,100 pounds per acre, 100 pounds per acre less than the 4,200 pounds per acre produced a year earlier.

**PRODUCTION:** Corn produced during 2006 was 844.7 million bushels, 5 percent below the 2005 level of 888.6 million bushels. Soybean production was 284.0 million bushels, 8 percent above the 263.6 million bushels produced a year earlier. Winter wheat production increased 30 percent from a year earlier, to 31.7 million bushels. Popcorn production totaled 196.8 million pounds, 38 percent below the 2005 level. Oat production of 1.1 million bushels was 80 percent above the 621 thousand bushels produced in 2005. All hay production, at 2.2 million tons, rose 6 percent. Peppermint production increased 24 percent, while spearmint production rose 25 percent. Apple production increased 10 percent to 55.0 million pounds. Blueberry production totaled 3.4 million pounds, a 3 percent decrease from the previous year.



Indiana: 1960 - 2006







# CHEMICAL USAGE

## INDIANA PESTICIDE USAGE

Herbicides were used on 100 percent of Indiana's 5.7 million **SOYBEAN** acres during 2006. Glyphosate Iso. salt, commonly known as Alecto 41S, Backdraft, and Roundup, was Indiana's most widely used herbicide, applied to 93 percent of the state's acreage. 2, 4-D, 2-EHE, known as c, 4-D LV6, Agsco 400 (EC), Barrage, and Salvo, was applied to 17 percent of the acreage.

## LIVESTOCK HIGHLIGHTS

The total value of the four major species of livestock and poultry on Indiana farms January 1, 2007 (December 1, 2006 for swine and chickens) amounted to \$1,256.6 million, down 5 percent from a year earlier.

**CATTLE** inventory numbers, at 900,000, was unchanged from January 1, 2006 and value per head, at \$1,000 was \$60 below the previous year. Total cattle inventory value, at \$900.0 million, decreased 6 percent from the \$954.0 million last year. Cows and heifers that have calved totaled 400,000 head, up 7 percent from a year earlier. Of this total, 234,000 were beef cows, up 8 percent from the previous year; and 166,000 were milk cows, up 5 percent from the previous year.

**HOG AND PIG** numbers (December 1, 2006), at 3.35 million, were up 3 percent from a year earlier. The average value per head decreased from \$96.00 in 2005 to \$92.00 in 2006. This lowered the total inventory

value to \$308.2 million, 1 percent below a year ago. Indiana remained in fifth place in the nation for the number of hogs on hand December 1, 2006.

Total **SHEEP** inventory, at 53,000 head, for January 1, 2007 was up 6 percent, compared to a year earlier. Breeding sheep totaled 47,000 head. Average value per head at \$195.00, was up \$5.00 from 2006. Total inventory value at \$10.3 million was 9 percent above the previous year.

Total **CHICKEN** inventory, excluding broilers, on December 1, 2006, at 31.7 million birds, was slightly below last year. With this inventory, Indiana held on to third place in the nation for total chickens, excluding broilers, and remained in third position for hens and pullets of laying age (24.8 million). The total value of the chicken inventory was \$38.0 million, down 25 percent from 2005. The value per bird decreased \$0.40 from the previous year to \$1.20.

## HOGS AND PIGS

The total pig crop in 2006 was 1 percent above the pig crop in 2005. Sows farrowed during the year increased 1 percent from the previous year, and litter rates rose slightly to 8.91. A \$4.00 decrease in average price per hundredweight brought a 7 percent decrease in cash receipts for 2006. Gross income of \$721 million (cash receipts plus value of home consumption) decreased 7 percent from a year earlier.







## **CATTLE AND DAIRY PRODUCTS**

The total live weight of cattle and calves marketed during 2006 increased 14 percent from a year earlier. The average price for cattle increased \$0.90 per cwt. to \$86.10. Calf prices for 2006 averaged \$119.00 per cwt. compared with \$117.00 during 2005. Cash receipts totaled \$273 million, up 15 percent from the \$237 million a year earlier. Gross income (cash receipts plus value of home consumption) increased 15 percent from a year earlier.



## **SHEEP AND LAMBS**

The number of sheep and lambs marketed during 2006 increased 1 percent to 38,000 head. The total pounds of sheep and lambs marketed was 5 percent below the 2005 level. Cash receipts totaled \$2.41 million, down 15 percent from \$2.82 million in 2005. Gross income (cash receipts plus value of home consumption) totaled \$2.85 million in 2006 compared with \$3.22 million a year earlier. Sheep averaged \$32.30 per cwt. and lambs averaged \$94.00 per cwt. during 2006.

Lambs saved in 2006, at 45,000 head, was up 7 percent from the previous year. The number of ewes one year old and older on hand January 1, 2007 was up 9 percent from 2006. Lamb crop per 100 ewes one year old and older was 136 during 2006, up 7 percent from a year earlier.

Wool production increased 2 percent during 2006 to 275,000 pounds. Sheep and lambs shorn totaled 44,000 head with an average fleece weight of 6.3 pounds. Total value of shorn wool was \$47,000, up 2 percent from a year earlier and averaging 17 cents per pound.




**COMMERCIAL SHEEP SLAUGHTER

## **POULTRY AND OTHER LIVESTOCK**

Total value of production from eggs was \$224.6 million in 2006, up 17 percent from a year earlier. The average number of layers at 24.6 million was 4 percent above 2005. The average rate of lay was 2 percent above 2005, at 269 eggs per layer, resulting in a 5 percent increase in total egg production during 2006. The average price received by producers for eggs was 40.9 cents per dozen compared with 36.9 cents a year earlier.





### Internet Published Estimates Database:

The database uses custom extracts based on commodity, year, State, and other selection criteria to produce an output file compatible for updating databases and/or spreadsheets. The database can be accessed from the NASS Home page shown above, or any State Field Office Home page. Just click on the **Quick Stats** button and follow the instructions. Searches for U.S. and State, State and County, and the Census of Agriculture data can be queried from here.

### NASS Subject Specialists:

NASS maintains a listing of subject and commodity specialists for the various program areas. From the NASS Home page, click on **Publications**, then select **Contact a Specialist** in the **I Want To....** box on the right hand side of the screen.

### NASS Customer Service:

### E-Mail Subscriptions:

**NASS Reports:** Subscriptions to NASS reports are offered free through our e-mail service. From the right side of the NASS Home page, select National under **Receive reports by E-mail**. First time users will be required to set up an account. Select **Register** and follow instructions to choose the National reports you would like to receive and they will be delivered as soon as they are published.

**Indiana Field Office Reports:** State specific reports are also available free via e-mail. From the right side of the NASS Home page, select State under the heading **Receive reports by E-mail**. Reports from all states are available with this selection. Scroll down to select the reports you want, enter your name and e-mail address, and then click on **Submit**. Or, on the right side of the Indiana Field Office Home page, select Subscribe to IN reports. This will give you only reports for Indiana. After entering your name and e-mail address, click on **Submit**. E-mail reports available through the Indiana Field Office include: All Reports, Agriculture Report, Crop-Weather, Crops and Livestock, Miscellaneous, Press Releases.

### Printed Report Subscriptions:

**County Level Data** - An annual report providing county level data for the top crops in Indiana.

**Indiana Agricultural Statistics Bulletin** - Our annual summary, available each fall, contains data for rankings, farm income, weather, crops, livestock, prices, county crop and livestock data, etc.
