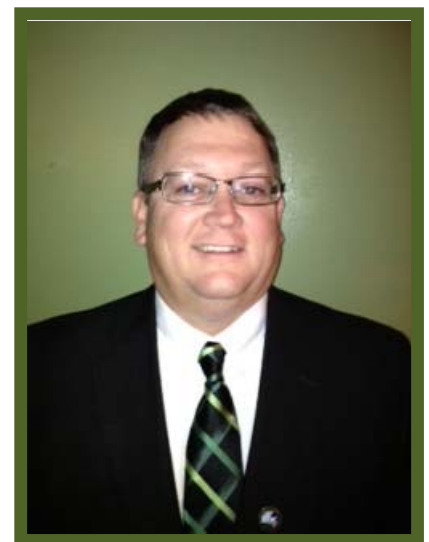

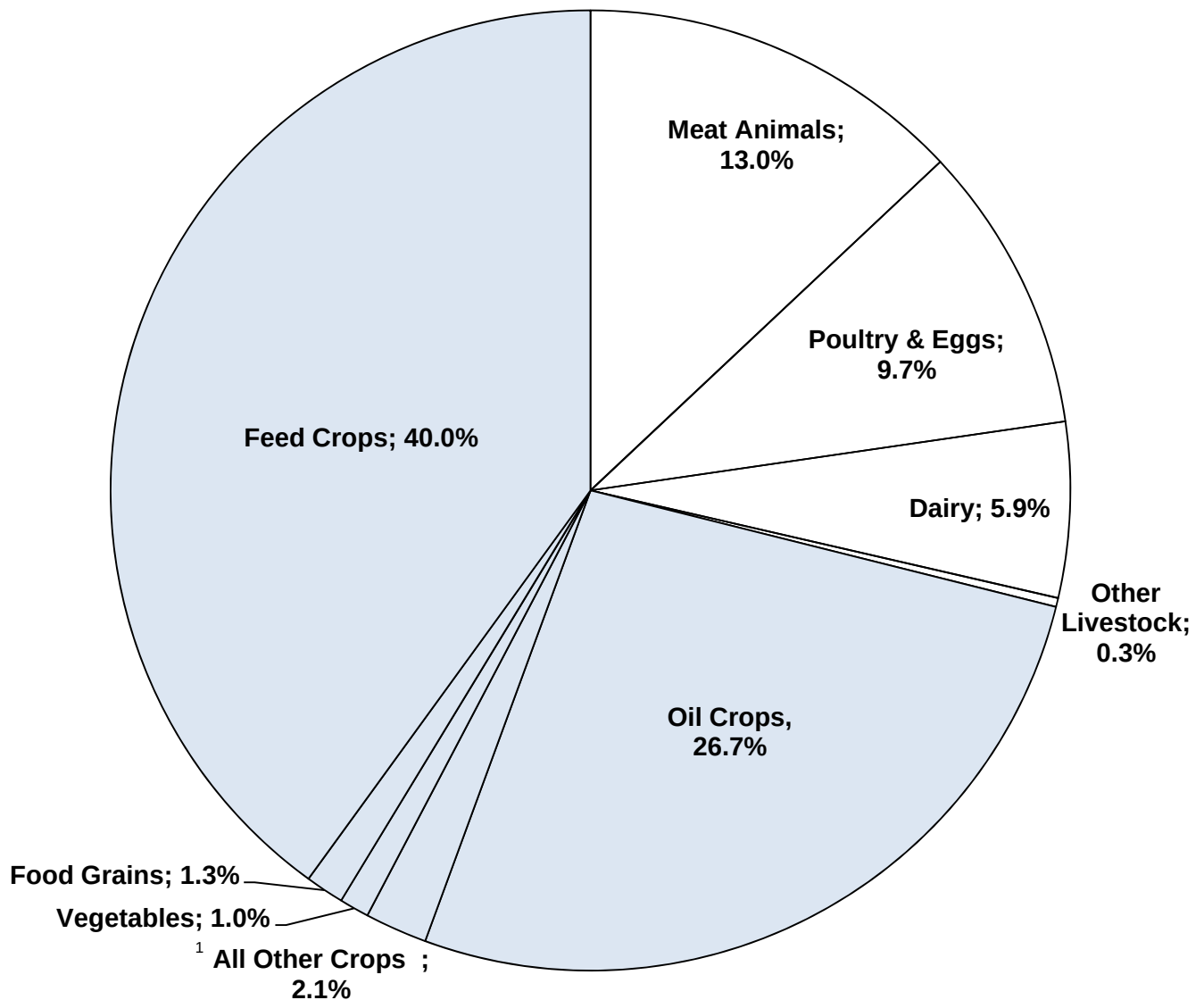
FARM INCOME

CASH RECEIPTS

Indiana farmers received \$12.1 billion in cash receipts from farm marketings in 2012, 3 percent above 2011. Cash receipts from crops were up 2 percent, and receipts for livestock were 5 percent above the previous year. Marketings of crops at \$8.57 billion, accounted for 71.1 percent of the total cash receipts in 2012 while livestock receipts, at \$3.48 billion, accounted for the remaining 28.9 percent. In the previous year crop receipts accounted for 71.9 percent and livestock 28.1 percent of total cash receipts.

Corn was the leading source of income for Indiana farmers in 2012 and amounted to \$4.75 billion. Soybeans were second at \$3.22 billion and meat animals were third with \$1.57 billion. Poultry and Eggs remained as the fourth leading contributor with \$1.16 billion and Dairy follows with \$709 million. These five commodity groups accounted for almost 95 percent of the 2012 cash receipts.

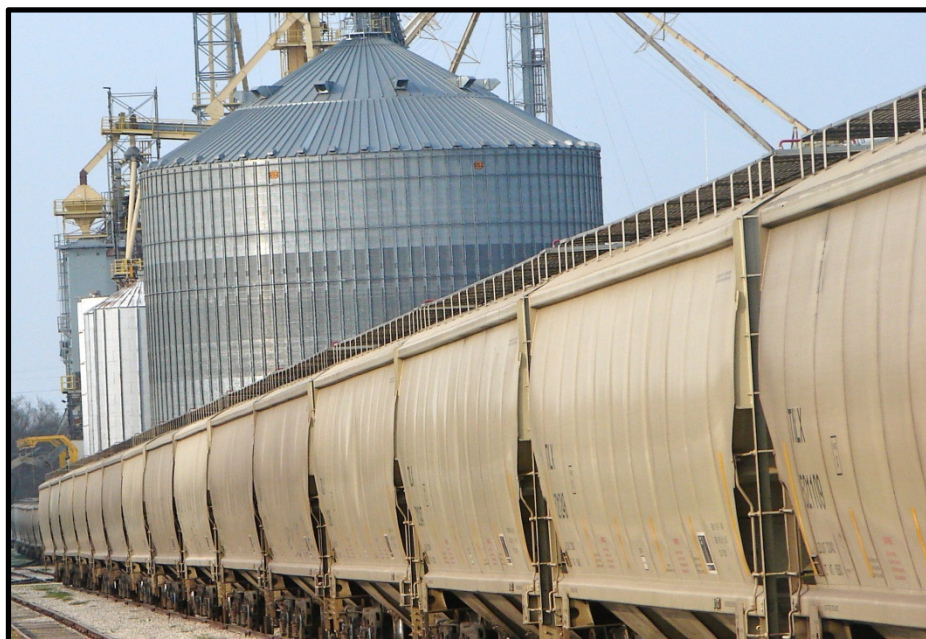

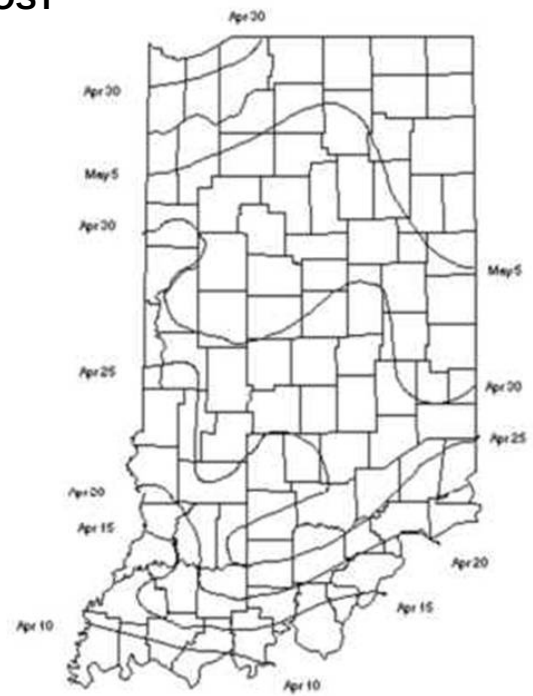

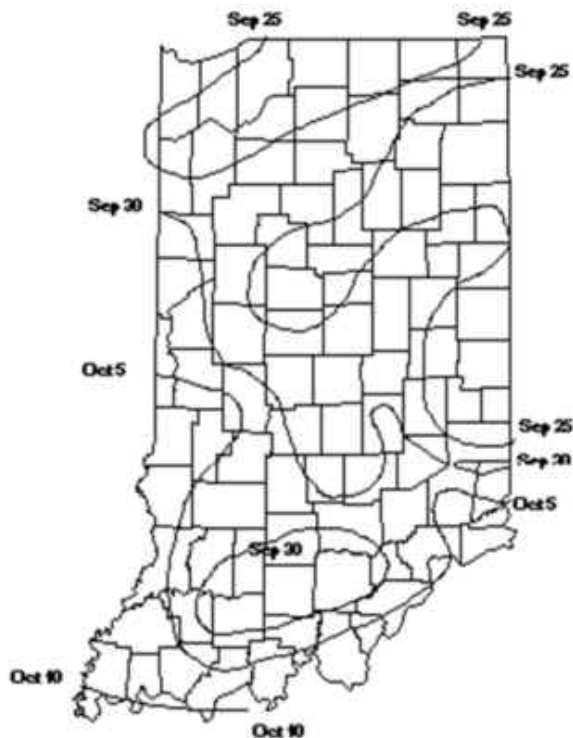


10% Probability for Frost

CROP HIGHLIGHTS

ACREAGE: Indiana's five major field crops totaled slightly over 12.1 million acres for harvest during 2012, down slightly from 2011. Corn acreage for harvest was up by 5 percent from a year ago, while soybean acreage for harvest was down about three percent. Winter wheat harvested acreage was down 25 percent from a year ago, and all hay harvested acreage was down 6 percent from the 2011 level. Oat acreage for harvest decreased 29 percent from 2011. Other crops showing harvested acreage changes were tomatoes for fresh market, down 8 percent while tomatoes for processing acreage was unchanged. Sweet corn acreage for harvest decreased 14 percent, and watermelon harvested acreage decreased 3 percent from 2011. In addition, cucumbers for processing increased 20 percent from 2011, and cantaloupes for fresh market decreased 19 percent.

YIELDS: Planting of row crops got off to a record early pace due to warm, sunny conditions in March which allowed soils to dry out enough to support tillage and planting equipment. By April 29th, 70 percent of the intended corn acreage had been planted compared with 20 percent for the 5-year average. Planting progress continued to move at a rapid pace and 97 percent of corn acreage had been planted by May 20th. Dry conditions persisted and by June 17th, 85 percent of the topsoil was rated either short or very short of moisture. By mid-June, wheat harvest was in full swing in most areas of the state, and it was evident that the crop benefitted from the warm spring and was already ripe by the time the drought effects took hold. Fruit growers were less fortunate, as the warm March encouraged early development and left trees vulnerable to temperature drops and frosts in April. Fruit crop potential was already significantly damaged before the extreme heat and dry weather set in. As the summer progressed, drought conditions grew extreme through a large part of Indiana. The average temperature for June and July combined was 76.4 degrees and average total rainfall was 3.78 inches. It would be the 3rd hottest (to 1895) and 4th driest (to 1930) on record. By comparison, these two months were the 20th hottest and 7th driest during the Midwestern drought year of 1988. These two months were the second hottest and driest in the dust bowl year of 1933. By the end of July every county in the state was under moderate to exceptional drought conditions. The fever broke around mid August with the arrival of precipitation and a moderation in temperatures. This was too late for most of the corn crop, as four percent was mature at that point, 39 percent was in dent and 83 percent in dough. Soybeans were in a position to benefit, however, and the rains continued through pod fill and increased the potential for the crop. While the warm and dry conditions to this point had been good for the harvest of hay, fields were nevertheless under stress and regrowth was slow. The late season precipitation revived grass hay and alfalfa fields and yielded an opportunity for growers concerned about hay shortages to put up another cutting. Corn harvest began after the third week of August, and was interrupted occasionally by rains until it concluded on November 18th. Soybean harvest began later and concluded at the same time.

The average yield for corn in 2012 was 99 bushels per acre, 47 bushels below the 2011 yield. Soybeans yielded 44.0 bushels per acre, 1.5 bushels below 2011. The average yield for winter wheat, at 67 bushels per acre, was 5 bushels above the previous year's yield of 62 bushels per acre. The average oat yield of 70 bushels per acre was up 9 bushels from the previous year's yield of 61 bushels per acre. All hay yield of 2.34 tons per acre was down .50 ton from the 2011 yield of 2.84 tons per acre. Popcorn averaged 2,800 pounds per acre, down 1,200 pounds from the previous year's yield.

PRODUCTION: Corn produced during 2012 totaled 597.0 million bushels, 29 percent below the 2011 level of 839.5 million bushels. Soybean production was 226.2 million bushels, 6 percent below the 240.7 million bushels produced a year earlier. Winter wheat production decreased 19 percent from a year earlier, to 20.1 million bushels. Popcorn production totaled 221.0 million pounds, 20 percent below the 2011 level. Oat production of 350 thousand bushels was 18 percent below the 427 thousand bushels produced in 2011. All hay production, at 1.48 million tons, was down 22 percent from the previous year. Peppermint production of 510 thousand pounds decreased 15 percent while spearmint production of 224 thousand pounds increased 66 percent from 2011. Blueberry production totaled 1.5 million pounds, a 6 percent decrease from the previous year.

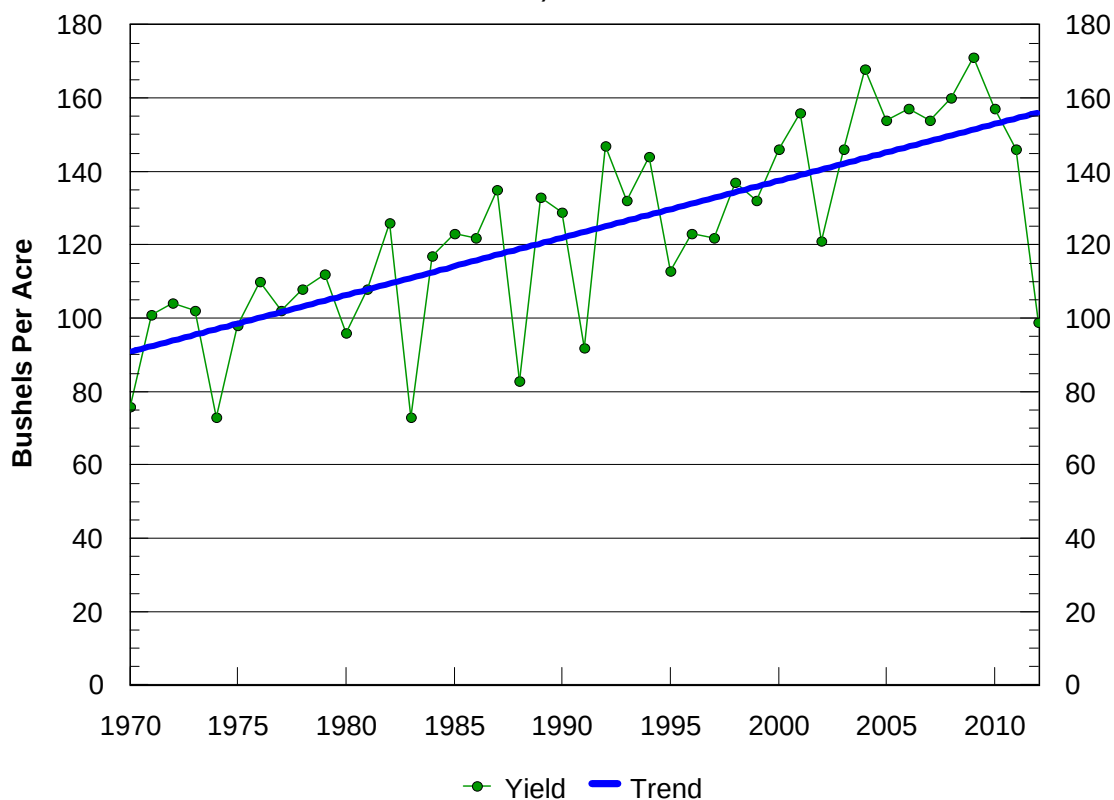

Corn Yield Trend Indiana, 1970-2012

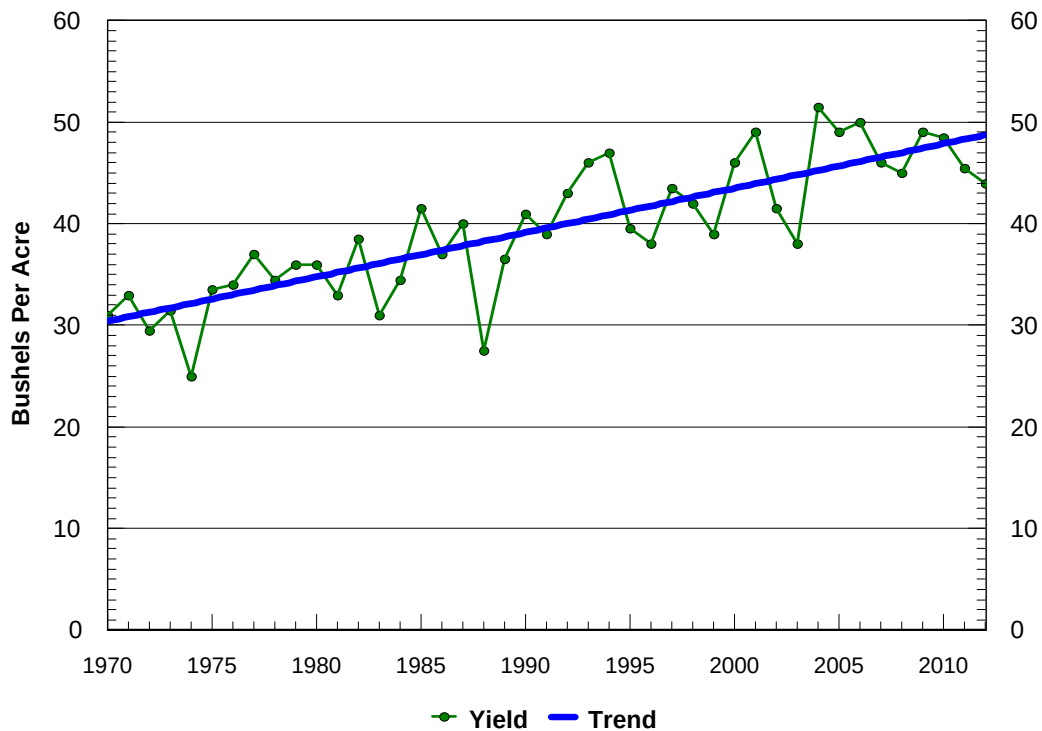

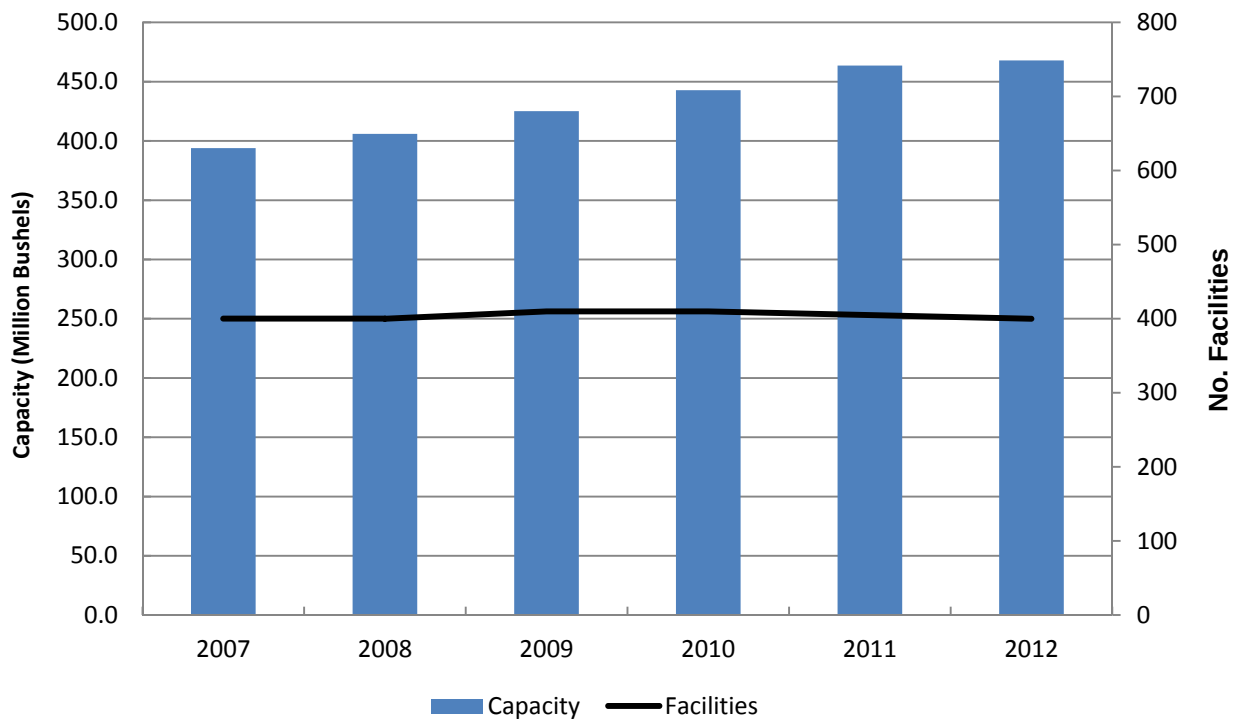

BIOTECHNOLOGY VARIETIES

The National Agricultural Statistics Service conducts the June Agricultural Survey in all States each year. Randomly selected farmers across Indiana are asked if they planted corn or soybean seeds that, through biotechnology, are resistant to herbicides, insects, or both. Conventionally bred herbicide resistant varieties were excluded. Insect resistant varieties include only those containing bacillus thuringiensis (Bt). Stacked gene varieties include those containing biotech traits for both herbicide and insect resistance.

LIVESTOCK HIGHLIGHTS

HOG AND PIG numbers (December 1, 2012), at 3.8 million, were unchanged from a year earlier. The average value per head decreased from \$120.00 in 2011 to \$115.00 in 2012. This dropped the total inventory value to \$437.0 million, 4 percent below a year ago. Indiana remained in fifth place in the nation for the number of hogs on hand December 1, 2012.

CATTLE inventory numbers, at 810,000, were down 6 percent from January 1, 2012 while value per head, at \$1,030 was \$30 above the previous year. Total cattle inventory value, at \$834.3 million, decreased 3 percent from the \$860.0 million last year. Cows and heifers that have calved totaled 365,000 head, down 1 percent from a year earlier. Of this total, 191,000 were beef cows, down 2 percent; and 174,000 were milk cows, down 1 percent from the previous year.

Total **SHEEP** inventory, at 55,000 head for January 1, 2013, was unchanged from a year earlier. Breeding sheep totaled 48,000 head. Average value per head at \$228.00, was down \$18.00 from 2012. Total inventory value at \$12.5 million was 7 percent below the previous year.

Total **CHICKEN** inventory, excluding broilers, on December 1, 2012, at 34.3 million birds, was up 10 percent from last year. With this inventory, Indiana held on to third place in the nation for total chickens, excluding broilers, and moved to third position for layers (26.1 million). The total value of the chicken inventory was \$72.0 million, up 10 percent from 2011. The value per bird, at \$2.10 was unchanged from the previous year.

HOGS AND PIGS

The total pig crop in 2012 was slightly above the pig crop in 2011. Sows farrowed during the year was down 2 percent from the previous year, while litter rates increased to 9.73. Hog and pig cash receipts decreased 2 percent from 2011. Gross income of \$1.21 billion (cash receipts plus value of home consumption) decreased 2 percent from a year earlier.

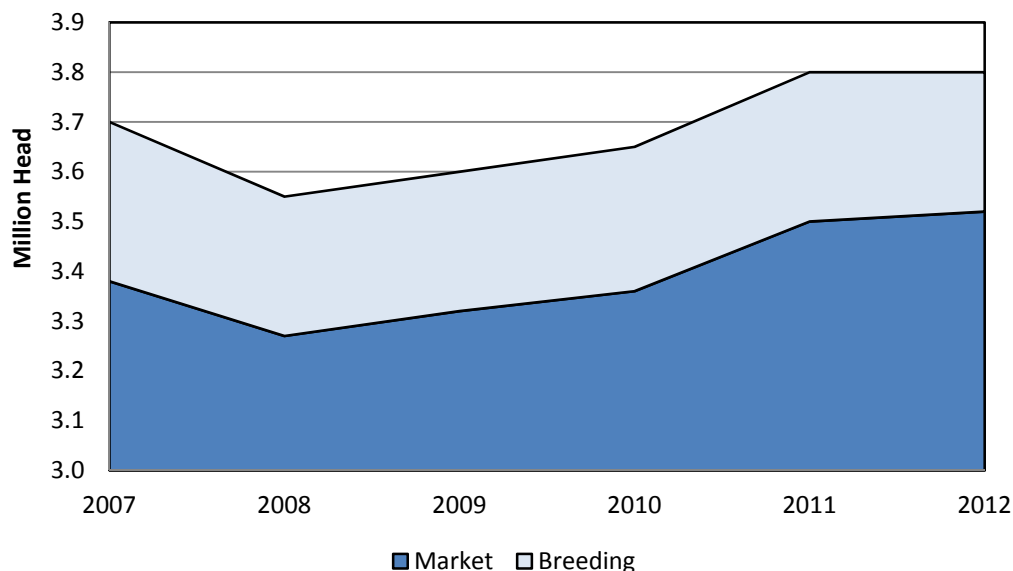

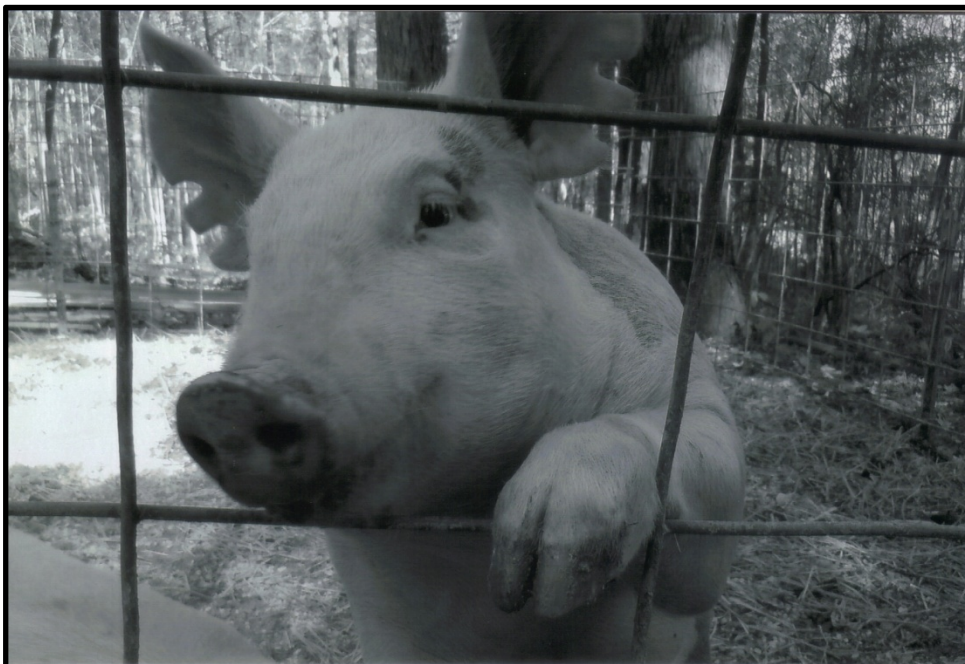

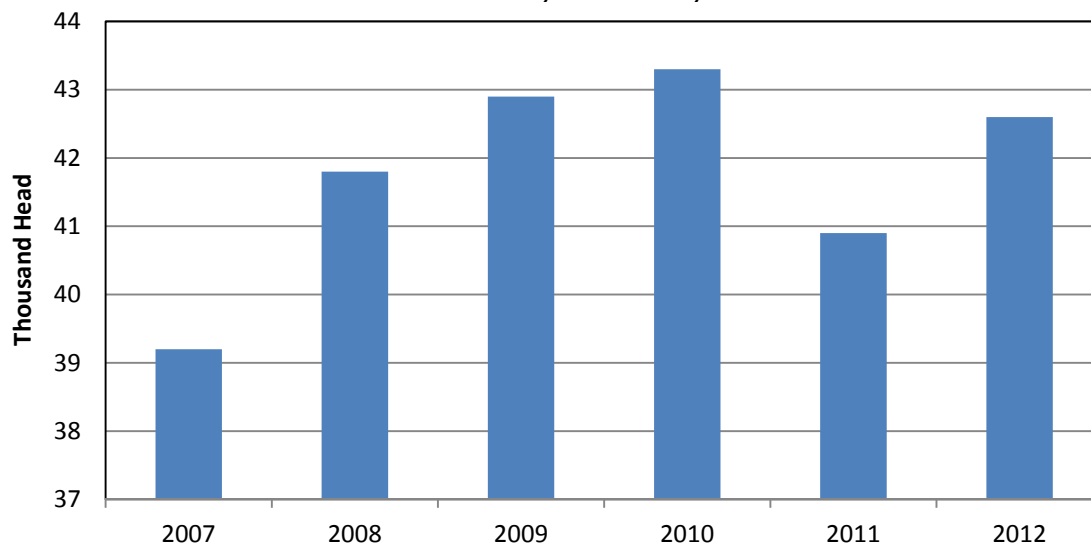

COMMERCIAL CATTLE SLAUGHTER NUMBER OF HEAD, INDIANA, 2007-2012



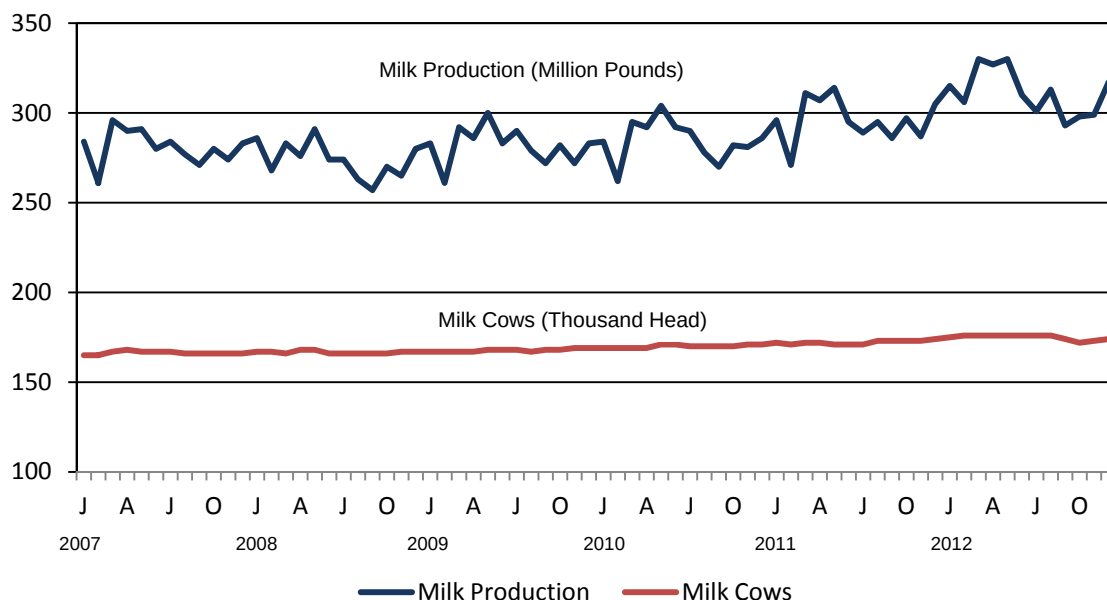

SHEEP AND GOATS

Lambs saved in 2012, at 47,000 head, unchanged from the previous year. The number of ewes one year old and older on hand January 1, 2013 was unchanged from 2012. Lamb Crop per 100 ewes one year old and older was 127 during 2012, down 8 percent from a year earlier.

Wool production was up 4 percent from the previous year, at 250,000 pounds. Sheep and lambs shorn totaled 41,000 head with an average fleece weight of 6.1 pounds. Total value of shorn wool was \$168,000, up 71 percent from a year earlier and averaged 67 cents per pound.

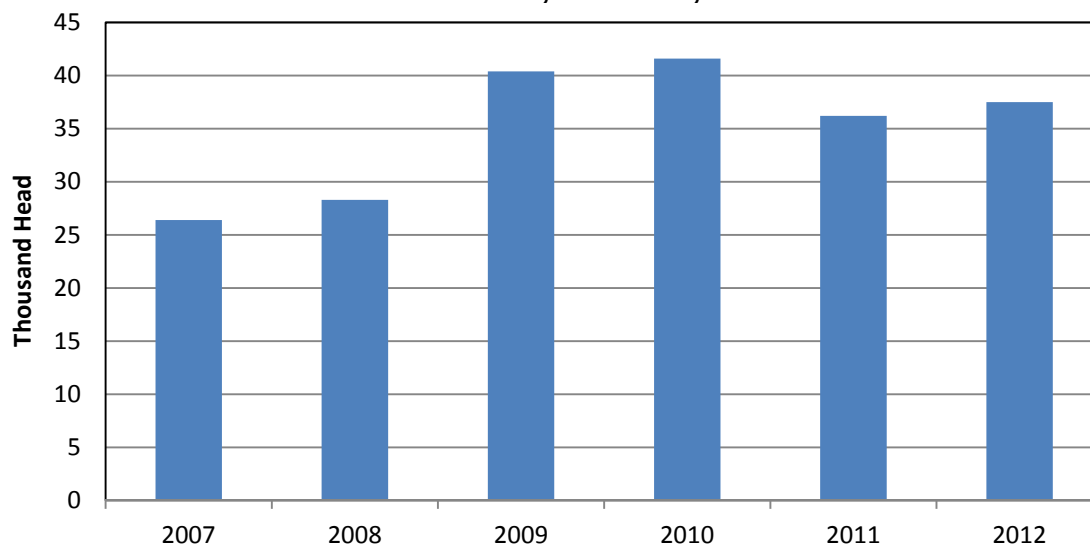

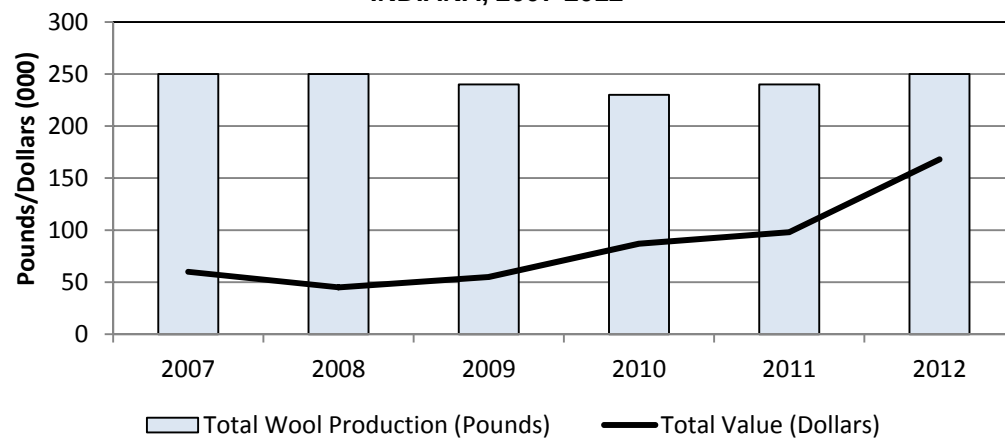

Total value of production from eggs was \$473.9 million in 2012, up 13 percent from a year earlier. The average number of layers at 24.9 million was up 7 percent from 2011. 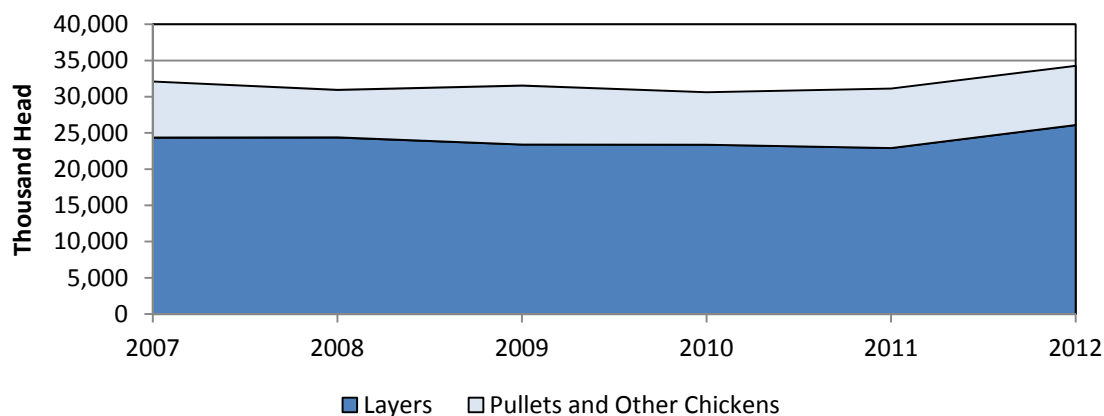

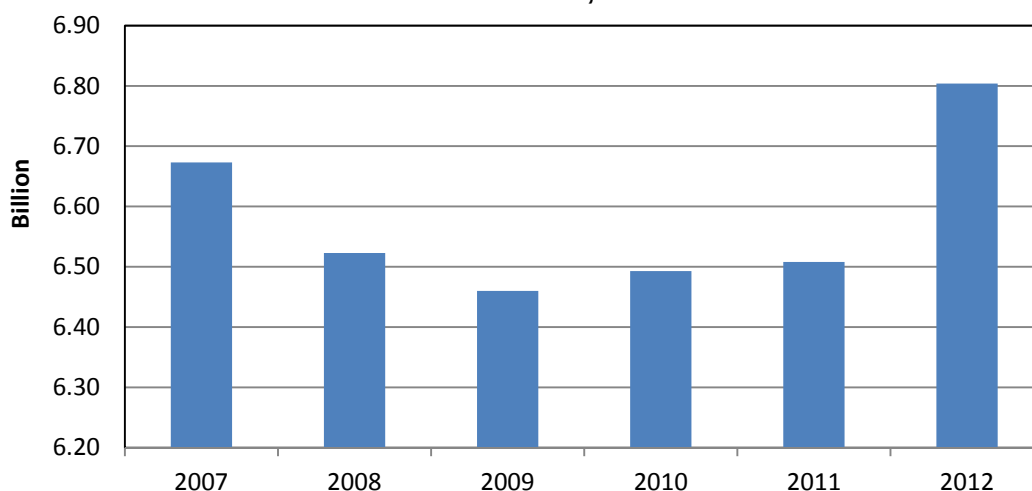

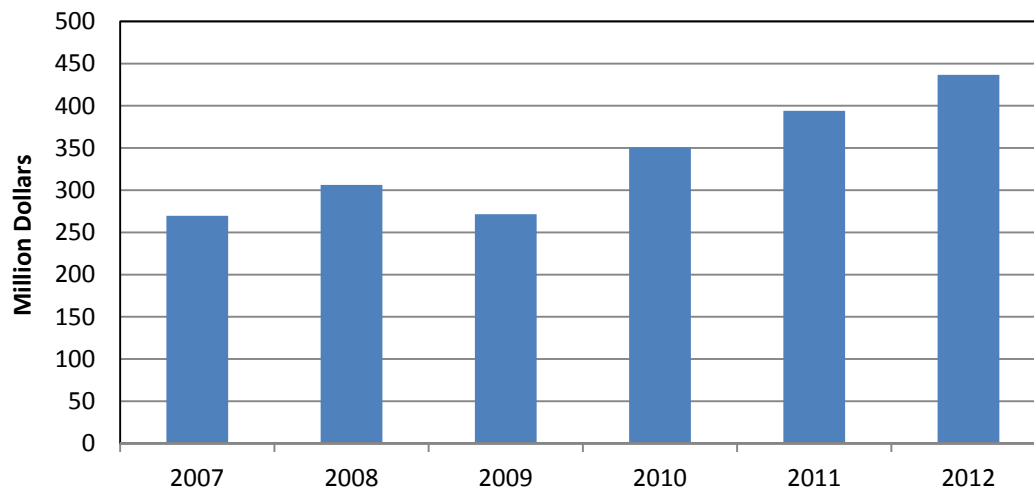

The new approach for setting livestock county numbers, termed "raking", utilizes county level livestock information from the Census of Agriculture, administrative data and current year state-level Agricultural Statistics Board (ASB) inventory and production estimates. To provide the data user with a consistent data series, NASS has established county numbers using the raking approach for commodities beginning with data from the 2007 Census. For cattle, this new methodology was implemented with the 2008 numbers. These new data items are available in both Quick Stats 1.0 and Quick Stats 2.0 databases.
