

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


# FARM INCOME

## CASH RECEIPTS

Indiana farmers received \$12.1 billion in cash receipts from farm marketings in 2012, 3 percent above 2011. Cash receipts from crops were up 2 percent, and receipts for livestock were 5 percent above the previous year. Marketings of crops at \$8.57 billion, accounted for 71.1 percent of the total cash receipts in 2012 while livestock receipts, at \$3.48 billion, accounted for the remaining 28.9 percent. In the previous year crop receipts accounted for 71.9 percent and livestock 28.1 percent of total cash receipts.

Corn was the leading source of income for Indiana farmers in 2012 and amounted to \$4.75 billion. Soybeans were second at \$3.22 billion and meat animals were third with \$1.57 billion. Poultry and Eggs remained as the fourth leading contributor with \$1.16 billion and Dairy follows with \$709 million. These five commodity groups accounted for almost 95 percent of the 2012 cash receipts.







## LAST SPRING FROST




10% Probability for Frost

## CROP HIGHLIGHTS


**ACREAGE:** Indiana's five major field crops totaled slightly over 12.1 million acres for harvest during 2013, up slightly from 2012. Corn acreage for harvest was down by 3 percent from a year ago, while soybean acreage for harvest was up 1 percent. Winter wheat harvested acreage was up 53 percent from a year ago, and all hay harvested acreage was up 14 percent from the 2012 level. Oat acreage for harvest doubled from 2012. Other crops showing harvested acreage changes were tomatoes for fresh market, up 29 percent while tomatoes for processing acreage was down 3 percent. Sweet corn acreage for harvest increased 10 percent, and watermelon harvested acreage increased 10 percent from 2012. In addition, cucumbers for processing increased 90 percent from 2012, and cantaloupes for fresh market decreased 5 percent.

**YIELDS:** Row crop planting started out sluggish in 2013 thanks to an unusually wet April and late-month snows that shut down the majority of field activity. With a state average of 6.45 inches of precipitation, the month proved to be the 7<sup>th</sup> wettest April on record in Indiana. By May 5, only 8% of corn had been planted vs. a five-year average of 41%, and soybeans had not even begun to be put in the ground. May panned out to be a warm and dry month, much to the delight of farmers. Spotty rainfalls in the first half of the month gave way to several weeks of good clear weather in late May so that by May 26, planting progress in corn and soybeans had surged ahead of the five year average to end at 86% and 60%, respectively. June thankfully did not put on a repeat performance of last year's temperature extremes and widespread drought: temperatures averaged only 71.1° F through the month, and rains were plentiful, with a surplus of 2.08 inches above normal for the month. Planting for both corn and soybeans had concluded by month's end, and wheat heading rapidly progressed during the month to conclude to on June 23. Generous rains allowed condition ratings for corn and soybeans to swell to 79 and 74 percent good to excellent by June 30, respectively. July was overall cool and dry, though a heat wave in the third week allowed abnormally dry conditions to resurface in a handful of east central Indiana counties. Corn and soybeans progressed on schedule through most of the month, with corn 82% silked and soybeans 72% blooming by July 28. The weather was perfect for winter wheat harvest, with percent harvested shooting from 32 percent on July 7 to 100 percent by July 28. August proved to be warm and exceedingly dry – at a state average deficit on 1.94 inches below normal, it ranks as the 3<sup>rd</sup> driest August on record. The dry spell came just as row crops had begun to fill, causing some worry among farmers with what had been to that point an exemplary crop. Crop condition ratings fell through the month and into September as a consequence, though still remained over 50% good to excellent for both corn and soybeans even at their lowest points. Thankfully, mid-September brought an end to the dryness, with significant storms in the third week bringing relief to much of the state's crops. The corn and soybean harvest kicked off about the same time, progressing slowly through a damp October and hurrying to an on-schedule

finish by November 17, just in time for the first major snows of the season on November 12 and November 26.

The average yield for corn in 2013 was 177 bushels per acre, 78 bushels above the 2012 yield. Soybeans yielded 51.0 bushels per acre, 7.0 bushels above 2012. The average yield for winter wheat, at 73 bushels per acre, was 6 bushels above the previous year's yield of 67 bushels per acre. The average oat yield of 71 bushels per acre was up 1 bushel from the previous year's yield of 70 bushels per acre. All hay yield of 2.80 tons per acre was up .44 ton from the 2012 yield of 2.36 tons per acre. Popcorn averaged 4,600 pounds per acre, up 1,600 pounds from the previous year's yield.

**PRODUCTION:** Corn produced during 2013 totaled 1.04 billion bushels, 72 percent above the 2012 level of 597.0 million bushels. Soybean production was 267.3 million bushels, 19 percent above the 225.3 million bushels produced a year earlier. Winter wheat production increased 66 percent from a year earlier, to 31.8 million bushels. Popcorn production totaled 372.6 million pounds, 46 percent above the 2012 level. Oat production of 710 thousand bushels was 103 percent above the 350 thousand bushels produced in 2012. All hay production, at 1.79 million tons, was up 35 percent from the previous year. Peppermint production of 425 thousand pounds decreased 17 percent while spearmint production of 263 thousand pounds increased 17 percent from 2012. Blueberry production totaled 3.2 million pounds, 113 percent increase from the previous year.



Indiana, 1970-2013**







## **BIOTECHNOLOGY VARIETIES**

The National Agricultural Statistics Service conducts the June Agricultural Survey in all States each year. Randomly selected farmers across Indiana are asked if they planted corn or soybean seeds that, through biotechnology, are resistant to herbicides, insects, or both. Conventionally bred herbicide resistant varieties were excluded. Insect resistant varieties include only those containing bacillus thuringiensis (Bt). Stacked gene varieties include those containing biotech traits for both herbicide and insect resistance.

## LIVESTOCK HIGHLIGHTS

**HOG AND PIG** numbers (December 1, 2013), at 3.65 million, were down 4 percent from a year earlier. The average value per head increased from \$115.00 in 2012 to \$140.00 in 2013. This raised the total inventory value to \$525.0 million, 20 percent above a year ago. Indiana remained in fifth place in the nation for the number of hogs on hand December 1, 2013.

**CATTLE** inventory numbers, at 870,000, were up 7 percent from January 1, 2013 while value per head, at \$1,100 was \$70 above the previous year. Total cattle inventory value, at \$957.0 million, increased 15 percent from the \$834.3 million last year. Cows and heifers that have calved totaled 370,000 head, up 1 percent from a year earlier. Of this total, 192,000 were beef cows, up 1 percent; and 178,000 were milk cows, up 2 percent from the previous year.

Total **SHEEP** inventory, at 50,000 head for January 1, 2014, was down 9 from a year earlier. Breeding sheep totaled 43,000 head. Average value per head at \$234.00, was up \$6.00 from 2013. Total inventory value at \$11.7 million was 7 percent below the previous year.

Total **CHICKEN** inventory, excluding broilers, on December 1, 2013, at 35.6 million birds, was up 4 percent from last year. With this inventory, Indiana held on to third place in the nation for total chickens, excluding broilers, and moved to third position for layers (27.3 million). The total value of the chicken inventory was \$74.8 million, up 4 percent from 2012. The value per bird, at \$2.10 was unchanged from the previous year.

## **HOGS AND PIGS**

The total pig crop in 2013 was down 11 percent from the pig crop in 2012. Sows farrowed during the year was down 12 percent from the previous year, while litter rates increased to 9.88. Hog and pig cash receipts were down slightly from 2012. Gross income of \$1.19 billion (cash receipts plus value of home consumption) was down slightly from the previous year.







## **SHEEP AND GOATS**

Lambs saved in 2013, at 44,000 head, down 6 percent from the previous year. The number of ewes one year old and older on hand January 1, 2014 was down 7 percent from 2013. Lamb Crop per 100 ewes one year old and older was 119 during 2013, down 6 percent from a year earlier.

Wool production was down 12 percent from the previous year, at 220,000 pounds. Sheep and lambs shorn totaled 36,000 head with an average fleece weight of 6.1 pounds. Total value of shorn wool was \$180,000, up 7 percent from a year earlier and averaged 82 cents per pound.









The new approach for setting livestock county numbers, termed "raking", utilizes county level livestock information from the Census of Agriculture, administrative data and current year state-level Agricultural Statistics Board (ASB) inventory and production estimates. To provide the data user with a consistent data series, NASS has established county numbers using the raking approach for commodities beginning with data from the 2007 Census. 

## COUNTY HIGHLIGHTS

The following pages of county statistics represent the results of a survey of over 15,000 farm operators following the 2013 harvest season. In addition to these data are selected items of interest from the U.S. Population Census, 2012 Census of Agriculture, and 2011 Cash Receipts information from the Bureau of Economics Analysis. The County Highlights section summarizes the importance of agriculture to each and every Indiana County while comparing the magnitude of importance across counties.

Planted acreage for hay is represented by three dashes because this category is not estimated, planted acreage and yield for popcorn are represented by three dashes because these categories are not surveyed; in all other places the three dashes represent zero for that county. An asterisk signifies that the county has data for this item, but it cannot be disclosed for confidentiality purposes. ## E-Mail Subscriptions:

**NASS Reports:** Subscriptions to NASS reports are offered free through our e-mail service. From the right side of the NASS Home page, select National under **Receive reports by E-mail**. First time users will be required to set up an account. Select **Register** and follow instructions to choose the National reports you would like to receive and they will be delivered as soon as they are published.


