¹ NASS will no longer estimate numbers from survey data for Cattle County estimates. The new approach for setting livestock county numbers, termed "raking", utilizes county level livestock information from the Census of Agriculture, administrative data and current year state-level Agricultural Statistics Board (ASB) inventory and production estimates. To provide the data user with a consistent data series, NASS has established county numbers using the raking approach for commodities beginning with data from the 2007 Census. For cattle, this new methodology was implemented with the 2008 numbers. These new data items are available in both Quick Stats 1.0 and Quick Stats 2.0 databases. Previously established estimates for these years have been removed from all versions of Quick Stats. District level estimates will no longer be published for Cattle. This is consistent with the Census of Agriculture.
