

LIVESTOCK HIGHLIGHTS

HOG AND PIG numbers (December 1, 2016), at 4.10 million, were up 6 percent from a year earlier. The average value per head decreased from \$98.00 in 2015 to \$95.00 in 2016. This raised the total inventory value to \$389.5 million, 3 percent above a year ago. Indiana remained in fifth place in the nation for the number of hogs on hand December 1, 2016.

CATTLE inventory numbers, at 890,000, remained the same from January 1, 2016 while value per head, at \$1,090 was \$240 below the previous year. Total cattle inventory value, at \$970 million, decreased 18 percent from the \$1.18 billion last year. Cows and heifers that have calved totaled 395,000 head, up 4 percent from a year earlier. Of this total, 210,000 were beef cows, up 7 percent; and 185,000 were milk cows, up 1 percent from the previous year.

Total **SHEEP** inventory, at 52,000 head for January 1, 2017, was up 4 percent from a year earlier. Breeding sheep totaled 45,000 head. Average value per head at \$223.00, was up \$7.00 from 2016. Total inventory value at \$11.6 million was 7 percent above the previous year.

Total **CHICKEN** inventory, excluding broilers, on December 1, 2016, at 42.1 million birds, was up 5 percent from last year. With this inventory, Indiana moved up to second place in the nation for total chickens, excluding broilers, and for layers (32.0 million). The total value of the chicken inventory was \$96.9 million, down 14 percent from 2015. The value per bird, at \$2.30 was down \$0.50 from the previous year.
