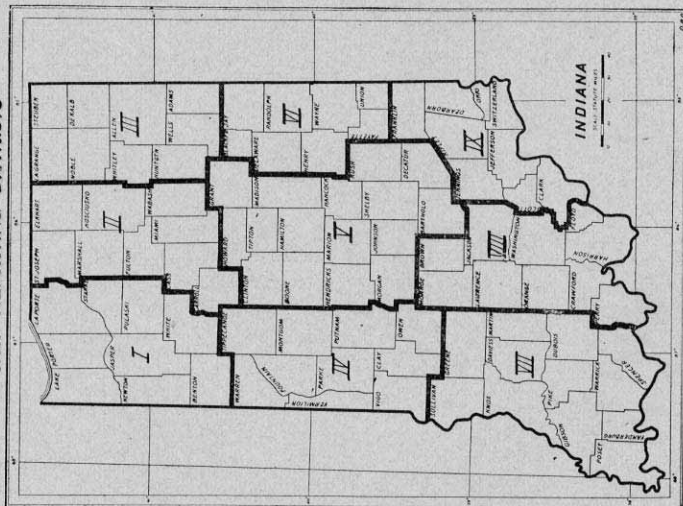

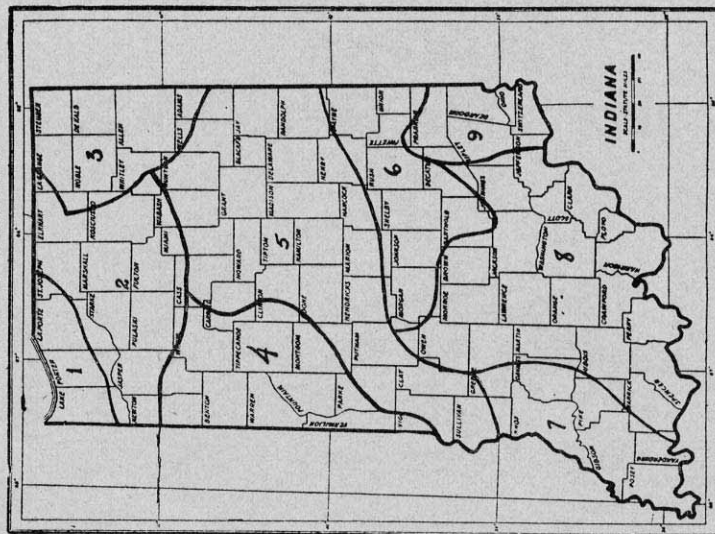

CROP SUMMARY FOR INDIANA 1926

The winter wheat and rye harvested in 1926 was sown under difficulties. The fall of 1925 was wet and the intended acreage could not be seeded though sowing continued in southern counties as late as December. The delayed seeding and small growth in the fall caused the prospects to appear gloomy as indicated by the condition of 70 per cent of normal. Winter damage proved slight, however, as only three per cent of the acreage was lost. March 1926 was below normal both in precipitation and temperature. April had lower than normal temperatures and more than normal precipitation, which greatly retarded spring work. May had less than normal precipitation but temperatures were above normal. In June both temperature and precipitation were below normal. These conditions proved very favorable for wheat and the crop matured a grain yield equal to the best in the preceding ten years. The actual yield was reduced somewhat by losses in the shock from heavy rains in August and September.

Corn was planted late and the low temperatures of June and July caused early prospects to appear poor. Abundant rains and high mean temperatures in August resulted in a marked recovery, and with an exceptionally late frost date in the fall an average yield was matured. The heavy fall rains prevented drying and caused corn to go down badly, so much damage from sprouting and rotting occurred. The damage and high moisture content caused much corn of low grading for the second successive year.

The acreage of oats was again increased, as the land intended for wheat, but unsown because of wet weather, was largely seeded to this crop. At harvest the crop was better than had been expected but heavy losses of shocked grain by growing and rotting occurred. The quality of the grain was lowered by the same causes.

The yield of hay was slightly below average. This was partly due to low yields in the southern part of the state where drouth occurred in the early summer. Another cause was a smaller proportion of clover in the hay acreage because of the poor stand of clover secured in the spring of 1925.

The condition of pasture was above average through most of the season. Condition was especially high in the late summer.

As was the case last year soybeans and cowpeas suffered injury by wet weather after cutting, reducing yields of both hay and grain.

The clover seed crop was the poorest for many years. The acreage was small and filling poor. Losses after cutting were heavy proportionately to the crop.

The acreage seeded to clover in 1926 was large and a good stand was secured on about 76 per cent of the seeded acreage. A great increase in the seeding of sweet clover was a notable feature of the season.

The acreage of tomatoes for canning decreased. Yields were lower than usual as the wet weather of August caused heavy losses.

The acreage of onions planted was less than last year, but the harvested acreage was larger. Yields were heavy but wet weather at harvest lowered quality and caused heavy losses in storage and handling.

The planted acreage of peppermint was about the same as last year but less acreage was lost so that the harvested acreage was nearly doubled. Yields were but little changed, being lowered by the wet weather during the harvest period.

The season was exceptionally favorable for fruit. The production of peaches was the largest for ten years. Apples yielded heavily, totaling about twice as much as last year. Other fruits were unusually abundant.

Wet weather in 1926 again made the seeding of the intended acreage of fall grains impossible. The acreage of winter wheat sown was 1,784,000 or 102 per cent of last year. The condition December 1st was 76 compared with 70 last year and the ten year average of 87 per cent of normal.

The acreage of rye for harvest is estimated as 133,000 or 92 per cent of last year. The condition December 1st was 81 compared with 84 last year and the ten year average of 91 per cent of normal.

LIVESTOCK SUMMARY INDIANA 1926

In the past year all classes of livestock have decreased with the exception of cattle. In the cattle class dairy cows and heifers intended for milking have also decreased, indicating that beef animals only have been the exception.

This is consistent with the short grain crop and large hay crop of 1924 and the short hay crop of 1925.

The figures for all classes except sheep have been revised in line with the U. S. Census of Agriculture 1925. Census figures for sheep are not yet available.

For the five-year period only mules and milk cows have substantially maintained their numbers. The decreases have been greater in young stock and in horses than other classes. Of the decrease of 198,000 head of young stock 63,000 are horses and mules. Of the decrease of 209,000 head in mature animals 160,000 were horses. Mature mules show an increase.

It is interesting to note in this connection that comparable figures on receipts at stockyards from Indiana show 368,000 cattle and 226,000 calves in 1920, and 319,000 cattle and 275,000 calves in 1925. These figures comprise the bulk of the marketings from the State but are not entirely complete.

In the same five years that have brought a decrease of 22.3 per cent in horses and 16.0 per cent in cattle there has been an increase of 17 per cent in the acreage of hay. This has resulted in making available for each of the hay eating animals other than sheep an acreage of hay 41 per cent greater than five years ago. This would account for the continued unfavorable discrepancy in the price of hay compared with other crops, but hardly seems consistent with the decreases in the numbers of cattle. Furthermore, the increases in hay acreage are nearly all in the leguminous crops, which should mean a greater production of feed and hence might be expected to result in increased numbers of livestock. The report of the Creamery License Division of Purdue University shows that the production of milk per cow has risen in the past five years, which is in accord with the changed hay conditions.

The number of hogs is now 867,000 below that of 1920. The short corn crop of 1924 with resulting high prices for feed is the immediate cause of the low number, though the greatest number in any year since 1920 is much below that peak year.

The decrease in horses in the five-year period though striking can be explained only in generalities, such as the agricultural depression and the substitution of motor vehicles for horses in cities. The increase in the number of tractors on farms from 9,230 in 1920 to 23,572 in 1925 may be a factor also.
