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THE 1948 CROP SEASON

Indiana farmers produced bumper crops in 1948. Corn and soybeans made new record yields. Winter wheat yield was above average having been exceeded by only four previous years. Oats made a yield exceeded only once before. Hay yields were slightly below average but most other crops made yields equal to average or better.

The fall of 1947 was below normal in precipitation, though there was enough moisture for the germination of fall sown grains. The winter was colder than average, though extreme low temperatures were few and of short duration. Winter loss of fall sown grain acreage was nominal. Some scattered black stem rust infection occurred but total damage was small. Heavy rains in wheat harvest caused apprehension and some loss from lodging and shattering. The yield of 21.5 bushels was well above average.

Oats were seeded at a seasonable time, and with about average precipitation and slightly cool weather in June made excellent growth. Heavy rains in mid-July caused some loss from shattering before harvest but the yield of 43.0 bushels per acre was the second highest of record.

Spring plowing was nearly completed by May 1 for corn and soybeans. The last half of this month saw most of the corn and soybeans planted under very favorable conditions. Rainfall was very heavy the middle weeks of July, but temperatures were near normal. In late August temperatures were above normal but without extreme departures. Since moisture deficiency developed only in limited localities the crops made marvelous development. Increased use of fertilizer per acre and on more than 80 percent of the corn acreage also was helpful in making the record yield of 60 bushels per acre. The soybean yield of 21.5 bushels was also a new high.

Hay harvest was hindered and some losses occurred from the rains of mid-June and mid-July. Pastures responded to the moisture and maintained productivity above average through most of the season.

Apples were barely a fair crop. There was some damage from mites, and drought caused some loss of size in the northern part of the state. The crop was 70 percent of average. Some rather

warm weather at picking time caused quick ripening and some loss of peaches, but the production was 145 percent of average. This was the fifth successive satisfactory peach crop. The pear crop was 72 percent of average, and grapes 84 percent.

Truck crops except canning peas were better than average in yield. The canning season for tomatoes was longer than usual, largely because of an early start by warmer than usual weather.

Tobacco made a very high yield. Potatoes were generally an excellent crop, and some extraordinary yields were reported on muckland.

The fall of 1948 was again favorable for prospects of above average yields for fall sown crops. Precipitation was below normal from August through October, but with enough moisture for germination of fall sown grains. Rains the first of November provided more than adequate water for fall grains and delayed the drying and harvest of corn. Again there is much variation in the amount of growth made by wheat before the onset of winter.

Indiana

Numbers of all species of Indiana livestock declined in 1947. The change was very slight for chickens. All cattle, and milk cows, and hogs dropped three percent. Stock sheep registered ten percent down, but an increase of sheep on feed left the all sheep drop at seven percent. Work stock again fell sharply. Price increases of cattle and hogs brought inventory values to new high levels, but in other species number declines offset price increases.

The number of horses is now estimated as 147,000 or 16 percent smaller than a year ago. Colt numbers declined even more sharply so further reduction seems certain.

The estimated number of mules is 17,000, a reduction of 15 percent. It appears the decline is due to sales and replacement by tractors, since colts would maintain numbers without excessive age levels.

The total number of cattle is 1,798,000 or three percent less than a year ago. About half the decrease is in cattle on feed and most of the remainder is milk cows. There were some shifts in age groups with increases in heifers 1-2 years of age, and decreases in calves. The farm value per head of all cattle rose from \$113 to \$127. The value per head of milk cows rose from \$152 to \$165 within the year.

The number of stock sheep decreases 10 percent to 387,000 head. The estimated number on feed is 135,000 compared with last year's 129,000 revised by market receipts. All age classes decreased but of course breeding ewes declined most. The value per head of stock sheep rose from \$15.60 to \$16.10. The 1947 lamb crop was 105 percent of the breeding ewes or 346,000. Wool shorn in 1947 was 3,253,000 pounds from 417,000 fleeces.

The January 1 number of hogs was 3,992,000 or three percent less than last year. The 1947 spring pig crop was 3,500,000 head, about three percent below the previous spring crop. The 1947 fall crop was 3,084,000 head, or practically the same as a year earlier. Farmers' intentions indicate a ten percent reduction in sows for farrowing in the spring of 1948. The value per head of hogs on farms January 1 rose from \$33.40 to \$41.60 greatly increasing inventory value.

The number of chickens at 17,555,000 is little changed from last year. There was some increase in pullets, little change in hens, and some reduction in other chickens. The value per head of chickens remained unchanged at \$1.35. The number of turkeys declined sharply from 110,000 birds to 70,000 birds. The value per head rose from \$6.40 to \$7.00.

United States

The number of livestock on farms and ranches declined during 1947 to the lowest level since 1939. Numbers have dropped 4 years in succession since reaching the all-time peak on January 1, 1944. The decline during 1947 was somewhat larger than in 1945 and 1946 but less than in 1944. For the second year in a row, numbers of each species of livestock and of chickens and turkeys were lower at the end of the year than at the beginning.

The decline in livestock and poultry numbers is attributable to various causes. High prices for meat animals encouraged marketing, resulting in a heavy rate of slaughter in relation to inventory numbers. Reduced feed supplies in the last half of the year accompanied by high feed prices curtailed livestock feeding operations and prompted marketing and closer culling of flocks and breeding herds. With work stock, the decline represented a further retreat in favor of mechanization, and comparatively low prices for work stock offered little incentive toward checking a sharp downward trend.

In terms of animal units which allow for differences in size and feed requirements of the several species, livestock (excluding poultry) numbers on January 1, 1948 were 4.0 percent below a year earlier and about 16 percent below the record high numbers of January 1, 1944. In terms of feed grain consuming units, numbers were down 3.9 percent; including chickens, they were down 3.7 percent. In terms of roughage and pasture units, the total was down 4.1 percent.

Notwithstanding the smaller numbers of every species this year, the farm value of livestock and poultry on January 1, 1948 hit a record high of 13,451 million dollars. This value was 12 percent above last year and 90 percent above the 1937-46 average. January 1, 1948 values per head of cattle, hogs, sheep, chickens and turkeys were the highest on record. Values per head were lower than last year for both horses and mules.

Although livestock numbers were down from last year, the January 1 stocks of feed grains on farms was down still more. In relation to livestock numbers, the supply was much less favorable than last year and well below the average for the last 10 years. However, the supply was somewhat better than on January 1, 1944, when livestock numbers were at an all-time peak. The supply per unit of livestock was about 23 percent below last year and 13 percent below the 1938-47 average.

The decrease in cattle numbers during 1947, amounting to 2,643,000 head, was one of the largest experienced. It resulted from a record slaughter of cattle and calves accompanied by reduced imports of cattle from Mexico. The effects of this heavy slaughter on the January 1, 1948 cattle population was eased by a better-than-average calf crop in 1947. The decline is a continuation of the downward phase of the present cattle numbers cycle which started in 1945. This downward trend has been accompanied by a consistent and large decline in the number of milk cows but a rather irregular and small decline in other cows. Over half of the decrease in all cattle in 1947 was in cows. The drop in the cow population was the largest so far in the present cycle.

Liquidation of sheep numbers continued during 1947 but the rate of decline was more moderate than in any year since 1942. The January 1 number of stock sheep for 1948 was the smallest since records began in 1867. The number of sheep and lambs on feed showed a 16 percent decrease from a year ago, but was still large in relation to the number of stock sheep. The decline in stock sheep was relatively greater for farm flocks than range flocks. There was a further drop in the number of farms keeping sheep. A number of important Western sheep States showed fairly marked increases in the number of ewe lambs, indicating a possibility that the downward trend is being checked in some of these States.

Hog numbers, down 3 percent from last year, were the lowest since 1941. The decline was a result of heavy marketings of hogs during the last quarter

of 1947 which more than offset the increase in the 1947 pig crop. All of the decrease was in the number of hogs over 6 months old.

The number of horses and mules declined sharply, though the decrease in numbers was not so large as in 1946 or 1945. These declines continued the downward trend which began in 1915 for horses and in 1925 for mules. The decrease in 1947 was accelerated by a record slaughter, and the smallest crop of both horse and mule colts on record. Exports, however, were sharply below the big shipments in 1946.

The number of chickens on farms was down 2 percent from last year to the lowest level since 1941. The number of pullets was about the same as last year—the decrease being in hens and other chickens. A drastic reduction of 32 percent was recorded for turkeys, bringing the January 1 inventory to the smallest number of record beginning in 1929. Turkey breeder hens also were the smallest on record, which dates back to 1937.
