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THE 1950 CROP SEASON

Indiana crop yields in 1950 were 107 percent of the 1939-48 average. No new yield record was made except for potatoes. Only fruits and a few truck crops were below the ten year average in yield. Condition of pasture averaged 88 percent of normal, or 8 points above the 1939-48 average.

The fall of 1949 had a little more than average precipitation. The heavy rains the first half of October made wheat seeded after fly free date unusually late. Growing temperatures in the spring came about 3 weeks later than usual so wheat seemed less promising in early spring than when it went into the winter. Winter losses of acreage were higher than in recent years but were mostly due to stream overflow, or standing water resulting from insufficient drainage, as there was little extremely cold weather.

Precipitation was extremely heavy in January and February and temperatures averaged far above normal. March was cold with precipitation slightly below normal. In April temperatures remained about 6 degrees below normal but precipitation was below normal from April 5 to April 22 so soil dried enough to permit oats seeding in central Indiana. Freezes about April 14 damaged fruit buds.

May was near normal in precipitation and warmer than average. This permitted spring plowing and planting to make rapid progress with both corn and soybeans mostly planted by the end of the month. June was only slightly cool, but heavy rains hindered corn cultivation and haying operations. Crops made good progress. July was cool with near normal precipitation. Grass crops made good growth but corn seemed backward. Harvest of small grains and hay was difficult because of high humidity. August was cool and until the end of the month was dry. Corn showed widespread deficiency of nitrogen. Farm work was brought up to seasonal levels, but ripening of fruit and truck crops was retarded.

September continued cool with nearly normal precipitation further delaying ripening of crops. Light frost September 24 about closed the tomato season, and killed some corn which was however almost mature. October was dry and the last half very warm. This was favorable for the completion of soybean harvest, curing of corn and seeding of fall grains. These conditions continued the first 10 days of November after which rains and cooler weather began stopping corn harvest and setting up favorable conditions for small grains to enter the winter. Real winter weather arrived the last of November and stopped farm work with some corn still in the fields.

The yield of winter wheat at 21.5 bushels is higher than usually secured when rainfall is so heavy.

The yield of oats at 37.0 bushels was probably lowered somewhat by harvesting losses due to delay in harvesting because of slow ripening of grain and rapid growth of weeds.

Corn was planted earlier than in several recent years, but the soil was worked when slightly wet and the physical condition was not as good as usual. Heavy rains and cool weather restricted nitrification so nitrogen deficiency limited the crop in many fields. Yields were above average in the southern third of the state, and in the northeast, but elsewhere near average. The state yield was 49.5 bushels per acre.

Soybeans were planted in good season and made good growth throughout. The yield of 22.0 bushels is only slightly below the record yield of 1949.

The plentiful moisture promoted growth of hay crops and all varieties made average yields or better with all hay averaging 1.42 tons per acre. More than usual difficulty was experienced in getting hay cured without rain damage.

The buds of fruits were damaged by frost April 14th, and perhaps by some of the colder days of January and February. Production of commercial apples was 77 percent of the 1939-48 average, peaches 80 percent, pears 80 percent, and grapes 98 percent. Except grapes, which were adversely affected by dry weather in August, all fruits sized well.

Truck crop yields averaged an 103 percent of average or 4 points below all crops. Tomatoes, mint and peas were below average, and other crops with small acreages did not make yields great enough to bring the group to all crop level. Yields as a percentage of the 1939-48 average were as follows: cabbage 108, cantaloupes 110, cucumbers 128, green peas 96, mint 96, snap beans 142, strawberries 107, sweet corn 117, tomatoes 99, watermelons 104.

The fall of 1950 had heavier precipitation than has been associated historically with above average wheat yields. Increased use of nitrate fertilizer in the spring seems to be changing the former relationship. The seedings of winter wheat were slightly larger than the small acreage of 1949 totaling 1,627,000 acres. December 1 condition of 89 is two points above last year and above average.

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LIVESTOCK SUMMARY JANUARY 1, 1950

In 1949 numbers of head of livestock on Indiana farms were increased by 1 percent for cattle, 10 percent for hogs, 3 percent for stock sheep, and 12 percent for chickens. Decreases were made of 2 percent for milk cows, 12 percent for horses, 22 percent for mules, and 10 percent for turkeys.

Values per head were lower for all species. Declines were 3 percent for mules and sheep, 8 percent for horses and milk cows, 10 percent for all cattle, 25 percent for hogs, 22 percent for chickens, and 32 percent for turkeys. Total inventorial value all species declined 12 percent to \$392,032,000.

All cattle increased because of gains in the numbers of beef cows and all classes of young stock. Steers declined in numbers as feeders shifted to other classes. Higher prices for beef than dairy products continued the close culling of dairy herds with a resulting decrease in number of milk cows.

Stock sheep numbers increased 3 percent reversing a sharp decline which has continued since 1944. The number on feed is 84,000 compared with the 112,000 of last year, revised from marketing.

The 1949 lamb crop was 112 percent of the breeding ewes January 1 or 305,000. The 1949 wool crop was 348,000 fleeces weighing 2,645,000 pounds.

The January 1, 1950 number of hogs 4,611,000 included 730,000 sows or 84,000 more than last year, and 338,000 more pigs under six months old than a year ago. Other hogs changed little. The spring pig crop of 1949 was 4,070,000 and the fall crop 3,813,000. The total of 7,883,000 was 115 percent of 1948 and of the 1938-47 average.

The greater part of the 12 percent increase in chickens was in chickens other than layers. The hens and pullets numbered 15,963,000, a gain of less than 5 percent. The number of turkeys and turkey breeders declined even though intentions are to raise more turkeys in 1950.

United States

Livestock and poultry on farms showed a net increase in 1949 for the first time since 1943. The increase amounted to 2 percent cent and placed the aggregate total for January 1, 1950 above that

and placed the aggregate total for January 1, 1950 above that of the two previous years, but 16 percent below the peak on January 1, 1944. The main features of this upturn were a 3 percent increase in cattle numbers and the first increase in milk cows since they started dropping five years ago. Hog numbers were up for the second straight year, and chickens and turkeys recorded gains. Sheep numbers continued the decline started in 1942 but at a much slower rate. The numbers of horses and mules continued their downward trend.

Abundant feed supplies and generally favorable prices for most livestock and livestock products in relation to feed prices, especially in the first half of the year, prompted increases in feeding operations and building up of breeding herds and poultry flocks. The 1949 pig crop was 13 percent larger, slightly more cattle were on feed January 1, 1950, and commercial broiler production reached a new high level in 1949.

Even with more livestock, the farm value of 13,211 million dollars was 10 percent below the record high of last year.

On January 1 the total supply of feed grains was second only to that of a year ago, both in total and per animal unit.

Cows for beef production reached a new high this year, while milk cow numbers increased slightly. Slaughter of cattle and calves was relatively high, and steer slaughter was a record high. Imports were less than in previous years but the calf crop was large.

Stock sheep numbers are the lowest in 83 years, but the decrease was the smallest since 1942. Slaughter was the lowest since 1918, with the smallest proportion of ewes since 1941. However the 1949 lamb crop was not large enough to maintain inventories although it appears that interest in sheep raising is reviving.

Hogs numbers were 6 percent larger than last year, and the largest since 1946. Nearly all the increase was in hogs under 6 months old. More sows are being held for spring farrow so that other older hogs were down about 3 percent. Hog marketing was rapid in the fall months.

Horse and mule numbers declined sharply and at about the same rate as a year earlier. This decline continues the downtrend which began in 1915 for horses and in 1925 for mules. The decrease in 1949 was accelerated by a sharp drop in the crop of both horse and mule colts and a fairly large slaughter of horses. Slaughter however, was less than during either of the two previous years. Exports of work stock were smaller this year than last.

The number of chickens on farms, excluding commercial broilers, was up 7 percent from last year, though 1 percent below average. Pullet numbers were up 12 percent following an increase of 17 percent in chickens raised in 1949 while hen numbers dropped 2 percent. Turkey holdings were up 10 percent from a year ago.
