Indiana January Agricultural Prices

Prices received by Indiana farmers for the full month of January 2025 are listed in the table below.

Some Indiana highlights were: January corn, at \$4.32 per bushel, was unchanged from December but decreased \$0.42 from last year; January soybeans, at \$10.40 per bushel, increased \$0.30 from last month but decreased \$2.80 from last year; January wheat, at \$5.66 per bushel, decreased \$0.32 from December and decreased \$1.04 from last year; January milk, at \$25.10 per cwt., increased \$0.20 from last month, and increased \$3.50 from last year.

Nationally, the January Prices Received Index 2011 Base (Agricultural Production), at 129.4, increased 2.1 percent from December and 16 percent from January 2024. At 88.5, the Crop Production Index was down 4.4 percent from last month and 9.5 percent from the previous year. The Livestock Production Index, at 188.8, increased 9.4 percent from December and 38 percent from January last year. Producers received higher prices during January for market eggs, cattle, milk, and broilers but lower prices for tomatoes, broccoli, lettuce, and cauliflower. In addition to prices, the volume change of commodities marketed also influences the indexes. In January, there was increased monthly movement for soybeans, cattle, corn, and strawberries and decreased marketing of market eggs, grapes, hogs, and cotton.
