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Indiana February Agricultural Prices

Prices received by Indiana farmers for the full month of February 2025 are listed in the table below.

Some Indiana highlights were: February corn, at \$4.66 per bushel, decreased \$0.34 from January and increased \$0.09 from last year; February soybeans, at \$10.50 per bushel, increased \$1.10 from last month and decreased \$1.90 from last year; February wheat, at \$5.92 per bushel, increased \$0.26 from January and increased \$0.09 from last year; February milk, at \$25.10 per cwt., was unchanged from last month, but increased \$3.50 from last year.

Nationally, the February Prices Received Index 2011 Base (Agricultural Production), at 147.1, increased 14 percent from January and 22 percent from February 2024. At 96.2, the Crop Production Index was up 8.5 percent from last month but down 5.0 percent from the previous year. The Livestock Production Index, at 193.7, increased 2.5 percent from January and 37 percent from February last year. Producers received higher prices during February for market eggs, corn, cattle, and hogs but lower prices for broilers, milk, onions, and celery. In addition to prices, the volume change of commodities marketed also influences the indexes. In February, there was increased monthly movement for cattle, market eggs, milk, and broilers and decreased marketing of soybeans, corn, tobacco, and wheat.
