


GRADE HORSE INDIANA, JANUARY 1, 2002

Grade horses are horses of unknown origin or undocumented parentage. They can be crossbreds that don't belong in any registry, purebred horses that have no registration papers, or are the offspring of registered parent that do not qualify for registration in their parents breed. Grade horses can be just as useful and enjoyable as registered horses. Grade horses are eligible to participate in a full range of equestrian activities, such as dressage, jumping, reining, and endurance at shows that are not limited by breed registration.


