2025 Indiana Popcorn Production

Indiana popcorn acreage increased from the previous year, along with prices and total value of production, according to Nathaniel Warenski, State Statistician, USDA NASS, Indiana Field Office. Indiana growers planted 89,000 acres of popcorn in 2025, up 12,000 acres from 2024. A total of 88,000 acres were harvested, also up 12,000 acres from last year. The 2025 average yield was 52.0 cwt per acre, matching the State's record yield also seen in 2021, 2023, and 2024. Total production was 4.58 million cwt, up 16 percent from a year ago. The average price was \$18.00 per cwt, an increase of \$1.00 from the previous year. The crop value of production was \$82.4 million, up 23 percent from last year.
