Kansas Agricultural Statistics

Cooperating with the Kansas Department of Agriculture

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Agricultural Summary: Kansas producers averaged 6.6 days suitable for fieldwork. Wheat planting and fall harvesting of corn, soybeans, and sorghum were the primary activities across the State. There has been some replanting of winter wheat due to poor stand. There was no precipitation across Kansas last week. Topsoil moisture was rated 10 percent very short, 27 percent short, 62 percent adequate, and 1 percent surplus. Subsoil moisture was rated 8 percent very short, 28 percent short, and 64 percent adequate.

Field Crop Report: Ninety-seven percent of the **wheat** has been planted, compared to 98 percent for last year and 97 percent for the 5-year average. Seventy-eight percent has emerged, compared to 87 percent for 2006 crop year and 86 percent for the 5-year average. Two percent of the winter wheat has been pastured. Winter wheat condition was rated at 3 percent very poor, 11 percent poor, 31 percent fair, 47 percent good, and 8 percent excellent. Ninety-six percent of the **corn** has been harvested compared to 92 percent last year and 94 percent for the 5-year average. Eighty-seven percent of the **soybeans** have been harvested, compared to 85 percent for 2006 and 83 percent for the 5-year average. Eighty-two percent of the **sorghum** has been harvested, compared to 64 percent last year and 68 percent for the 5-year average. Sixty-five percent of the **sunflowers** have been harvested, the same as last year and 5 percent behind the 5-year average. Forty-five percent of the **cotton** has been harvested, compared to 25 percent last year and 18 percent for the 5-year average. Cotton condition was rated 10 percent poor, 45 percent fair, 35 percent good, and 10 percent excellent.

Feed Supplies Report: Range and pasture conditions were rated 6 percent very poor, 18 percent poor, 31 percent fair, 39 percent good, and 6 percent excellent. Feed grain supplies were rated 3 percent short, 90 percent adequate, and 7 percent surplus. Hay and forage supplies were rated 1 percent very short, 8 percent short, 85 percent adequate, and 6 percent surplus. Stock water supplies were rated 3 percent very short, 12 percent short, 84 percent adequate, and 1 percent surplus.

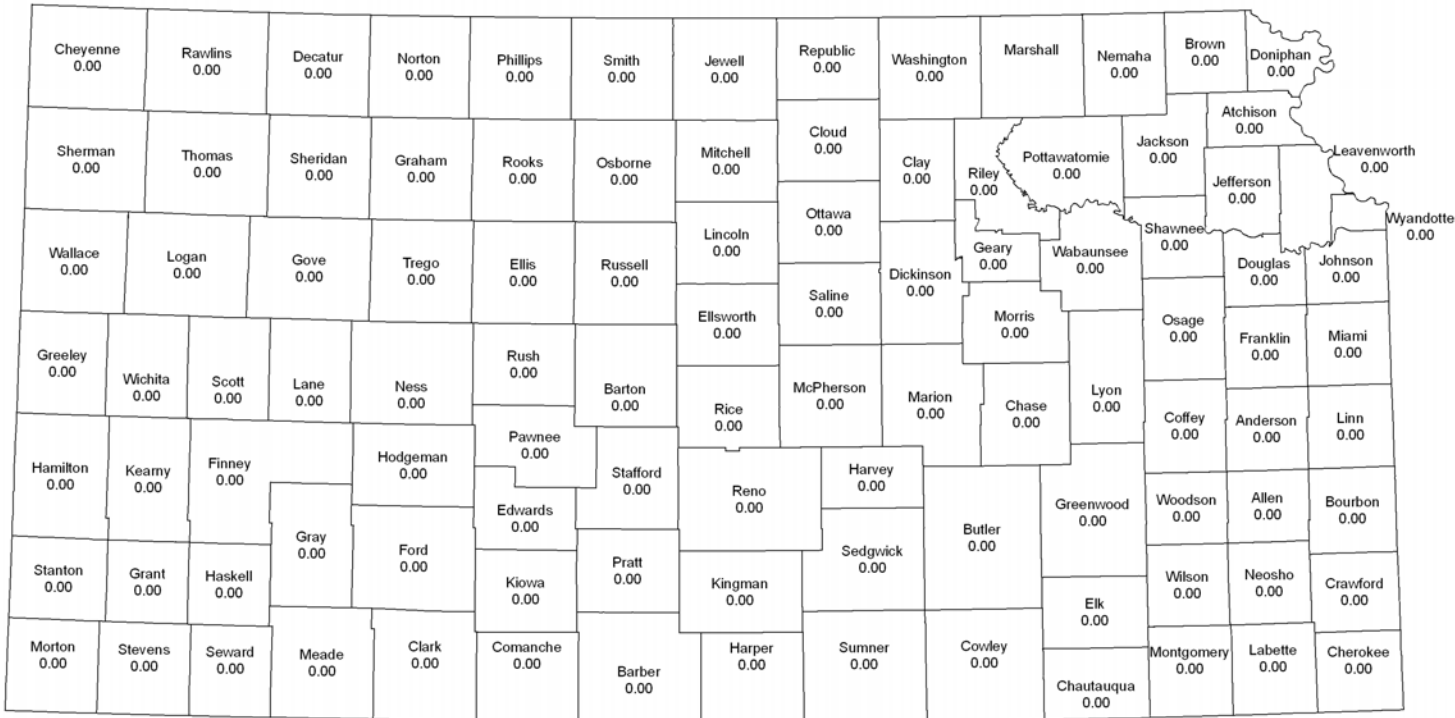
