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KANSAS CROP PROGRESS AND CONDITION

MANHATTAN, Kan. March 9, 2020 - For the week ending March 8, 2020, there were 5.8 days suitable for fieldwork, according to the USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service. Topsoil moisture supplies rated 9 percent very short, 16 short, 68 adequate, and 7 surplus. Subsoil moisture supplies rated 7 percent very short, 17 short, 71 adequate, and 5 surplus.

Field Crops Report: Winter wheat condition rated 4 percent very poor, 14 poor, 35 fair, 41 good, and 6 excellent.
