KANSAS CROP PROGRESS AND CONDITION

MANHATTAN, Kan. March 22, 2021 - For the week ending March 21, 2021, there were 2.7 days suitable for fieldwork, according to the USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service. Topsoil moisture supplies rated 4% very short, 13% short, 68% adequate, and 15% surplus. Subsoil moisture supplies rated 9% very short, 20% short, 64% adequate, and 7% surplus.

Field Crops Report: Winter wheat condition rated 5% very poor, 16% poor, 34% fair, 40% good, and 5% excellent.
