KANSAS CROP PROGRESS AND CONDITION

MANHATTAN, Kan. April 26, 2021 - For the week ending April 25, 2021, there were 4.8 days suitable for fieldwork, according to the USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service. Topsoil moisture supplies rated 6% very short, 13% short, 76% adequate, and 5% surplus. Subsoil moisture supplies rated 8% very short, 14% short, 73% adequate, and 5% surplus.

Field Crops Report: Winter wheat condition rated 5% very poor, 12% poor, 28% fair, 49% good, and 6% excellent. Winter wheat jointed was 68%, ahead of 62% last year, and equal to the five-year average. Headed was 2%, equal to last year, and behind 12% average.

Corn planted was 20%, near 22% last year, and behind 27% average. Emerged was 6%, near 3% last year and 7% average.

Soybeans planted was 2%, equal to last year, and near 1% average.

Data for this news release were provided at the county level by USDA Farm Service Agency, KSU Extension Service, and other reporters across the State.
