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KANSAS CROP PROGRESS AND CONDITION

MANHATTAN, Kan. April 4, 2022 - For the week ending April 3, 2022, there were 5.0 days suitable for fieldwork, according to the USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service. Topsoil moisture supplies rated 27% very short, 27% short, 43% adequate, and 3% surplus. Subsoil moisture supplies rated 28% very short, 34% short, 37% adequate, and 1% surplus.

Field Crops Report: Winter wheat condition rated 10% very poor, 20% poor, 38% fair, 29% good, and 3% excellent. Winter wheat jointed was 11%, near 9% last year and 13% for the five-year average.

Corn planted was 2%, equal to both last year and average.
