KANSAS CROP PROGRESS AND CONDITION

MANHATTAN, Kan. April 24, 2023 - For the week ending April 23, 2023, there were 6.0 days suitable for fieldwork, according to the USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service. Topsoil moisture supplies rated 48% very short, 28% short, 24% adequate, and 0% surplus. Subsoil moisture supplies rated 51% very short, 29% short, 20% adequate, and 0% surplus.

Field Crops Report: Winter wheat condition rated 32% very poor, 30% poor, 24% fair, 12% good, and 2% excellent. Winter wheat jointed was 46%, near 47% last year, and behind 51% for the five-year average. Headed was 3%, near 1% average.

Corn planted was 24%, near 20% last year, and ahead of 19% average. Emerged was 3%, near 1% last year and 2% average.

Soybeans planted was 4%, near 3% last year and 1% average.

Data for this news release were provided at the county level by USDA Farm Service Agency, KSU Extension Service, and other reporters across the State.
