KANSAS CROP PROGRESS AND CONDITION

MANHATTAN, Kan. March 11, 2024 - For the week ending March 10, 2024, there were 5.9 days suitable for fieldwork, according to the USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service. Topsoil moisture supplies rated 8% very short, 30% short, 58% adequate, and 4% surplus. Subsoil moisture supplies rated 11% very short, 35% short, 53% adequate, and 1% surplus.

Field Crops Report: Winter wheat condition rated 4% very poor, 9% poor, 34% fair, 45% good, and 8% excellent.
