KANSAS CROP PROGRESS AND CONDITION

MANHATTAN, Kan. April 15, 2024 - For the week ending April 14, 2024, there were 6.3 days suitable for fieldwork, according to the USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service. Topsoil moisture supplies rated 22% very short, 43% short, 34% adequate, and 1% surplus. Subsoil moisture supplies rated 21% very short, 41% short, 37% adequate, and 1% surplus.

Field Crops Report: Winter wheat condition rated 6% very poor, 13% poor, 38% fair, 38% good, and 5% excellent. Winter wheat jointed was 52%, well ahead of 24% last year and 31% for the five-year average.

Corn planted was 13%, near 14% last year and 10% average.

Soybeans planted was 1%, equal to last year.

Data for this news release were provided at the county level by USDA Farm Service Agency, KSU Extension Service, and other reporters across the State.
