KANSAS CROP PROGRESS AND CONDITION

MANHATTAN, Kan. April 22, 2024 - For the week ending April 21, 2024, there were 5.9 days suitable for fieldwork, according to the USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service. Topsoil moisture supplies rated 27% very short, 38% short, 34% adequate, and 1% surplus. Subsoil moisture supplies rated 24% very short, 40% short, 35% adequate, and 1% surplus.

Field Crops Report: Winter wheat condition rated 8% very poor, 18% poor, 38% fair, 33% good, and 3% excellent. Winter wheat jointed was 72%, well ahead of 41% last year and 48% for the five-year average. Headed was 4%, near 2% last year and 1% average.

Corn planted was 26%, near 22% last year, and ahead of 18% average. Emerged was 3%, near 2% last year and 1% average.

Soybeans planted was 6%, near 3% last year, and ahead of 1% average.

Sorghum planted was 1%.

Data for this news release were provided at the county level by USDA Farm Service Agency, KSU Extension Service, and other reporters across the State.
