## KANSAS CROP PROGRESS AND CONDITION

**MANHATTAN, Kan. June 2, 2025** - For the week ending June 1, 2025, there were 2.8 days suitable for fieldwork, according to the USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service. Topsoil moisture supplies rated 7% very short, 16% short, 62% adequate, and 15% surplus. Subsoil moisture supplies rated 8% very short, 21% short, 61% adequate, and 10% surplus.

**Field Crops Report:** Winter wheat condition rated 7% very poor, 13% poor, 29% fair, 44% good, and 7% excellent. Winter wheat headed was 96%, near 97% last year and 94% for the five-year average. Coloring was 53%, behind 68% last year, but ahead of 37% average. Mature was 1%, well behind 22% last year, and near 5% average.

Corn condition rated 1% very poor, 4% poor, 29% fair, 55% good, and 11% excellent. Corn planted was 92%, near 91% last year and 89% average. Emerged was 73%, near 77% last year and 72% average.

Soybean condition rated 1% very poor, 2% poor, 25% fair, 63% good, and 9% excellent. Soybeans planted was 72%, ahead of 65% both last year and average. Emerged was 50%, ahead of 44% last year, and near 46% average.

Sorghum planted was 29%, near 33% last year and 28% average.

Cotton condition rated 1% very poor, 4% poor, 27% fair, 49% good, and 19% excellent. Cotton planted was 82%, equal to last year, and ahead of 77% average.

Sunflowers planted was 23%, near 20% last year and 24% average.

**Pasture and Range Report:** Pasture and range conditions rated 4% very poor, 10% poor, 28% fair, 51% good, and 7% excellent.
