KANSAS CROP PROGRESS AND CONDITION

MANHATTAN, Kan. June 9, 2025 - For the week ending June 8, 2025, there were 2.6 days suitable for fieldwork, according to the USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service. Topsoil moisture supplies rated 3% very short, 12% short, 63% adequate, and 22% surplus. Subsoil moisture supplies rated 6% very short, 18% short, 62% adequate, and 14% surplus.

Field Crops Report: Winter wheat condition rated 6% very poor, 13% poor, 31% fair, 43% good, and 7% excellent. Winter wheat coloring was 71%, behind 87% last year, but near 67% for the five-year average. Mature was 13%, well behind 48% last year, and behind 18% average.

Corn condition rated 1% very poor, 5% poor, 30% fair, 54% good, and 10% excellent. Corn planted was 94%, near 95% last year, and equal to average. Emerged was 81%, behind 86% last year, and near 82% average.

Soybean condition rated 1% very poor, 5% poor, 29% fair, 56% good, and 9% excellent. Soybeans planted was 76%, equal to both last year and average. Emerged was 62%, near 58% both last year and average.

Sorghum planted was 37%, behind 51% last year and 46% average.

Cotton condition rated 5% very poor, 11% poor, 34% fair, 40% good, and 10% excellent. Cotton planted was 90%, near 91% last year and 89% average. Squaring was 1%, near 3% last year and 4% average.

Sunflowers planted was 37%, behind 42% last year, and near 40% average.

Pasture and Range Report: Pasture and range conditions rated 3% very poor, 8% poor, 26% fair, 51% good, and 12% excellent.
