## KANSAS CROP PROGRESS AND CONDITION

**MANHATTAN, Kan. June 16, 2025** - For the week ending June 15, 2025, there were 5.0 days suitable for fieldwork, according to the USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service. Topsoil moisture supplies rated 4% very short, 15% short, 65% adequate, and 16% surplus. Subsoil moisture supplies rated 8% very short, 19% short, 62% adequate, and 11% surplus.

**Field Crops Report:** Winter wheat condition rated 8% very poor, 13% poor, 30% fair, 42% good, and 7% excellent. Winter wheat coloring was 88%, behind 97% last year, but near 86% for the five-year average. Mature was 39%, well behind 73% last year, and behind 44% average. Harvested was 3%, well behind 25% last year, and behind 11% average.

Corn condition rated 1% very poor, 4% poor, 31% fair, 50% good, and 14% excellent. Corn planted was 96%, near 98% last year and 97% average. Emerged was 88%, behind 93% last year, and near 91% average. Silking was 1%, equal to both last year and average.

Soybean condition rated 2% very poor, 5% poor, 33% fair, 51% good, and 9% excellent. Soybeans planted was 82%, near 85% both last year and average. Emerged was 69%, near 71% last year and 70% average.

Sorghum planted was 57%, behind 70% last year and 66% average.

Cotton condition rated 2% very poor, 19% poor, 40% fair, 36% good, and 3% excellent. Cotton planted was 92%, near 95% last year and 94% average. Squaring was 2%, behind 9% last year and 10% average.

Sunflowers planted was 56%, behind 66% last year, and near 60% average.

**Pasture and Range Report:** Pasture and range conditions rated 2% very poor, 9% poor, 28% fair, 47% good, and 14% excellent.
