KANSAS CROP PROGRESS AND CONDITION

MANHATTAN, Kan. July 7, 2025 - For the week ending July 6, 2025, there were 5.1 days suitable for fieldwork, according to the USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service. Topsoil moisture supplies rated 4% very short, 15% short, 75% adequate, and 6% surplus. Subsoil moisture supplies rated 6% very short, 21% short, 67% adequate, and 6% surplus.

Field Crops Report: Winter wheat mature was 99%, equal to last year, and near 96% for the five-year average. Harvested was 82%, behind 90% last year, but ahead of 77% average.

Corn condition rated 2% very poor, 4% poor, 22% fair, 54% good, and 18% excellent. Corn silking was 39%, near 45% last year, but ahead of 30% average. Dough was 2%, near 3% last year, and equal to average.

Soybean condition rated 0% very poor, 4% poor, 23% fair, 64% good, and 9% excellent. Soybeans planted was 94%, behind 99% last year, and near 98% average. Emerged was 87%, behind 94% both last year and average. Blooming was 28%, ahead of 16% last year and 22% average. Setting pods was 1%, equal to last year, and near 2% average.

Sorghum condition rated 2% very poor, 4% poor, 28% fair, 52% good, and 14% excellent. Sorghum planted was 94%, near 96% both last year and average. Headed was 4%, equal to last year, and near 5% average.

Cotton condition rated 1% very poor, 24% poor, 38% fair, 32% good, and 5% excellent. Cotton squaring was 30%, well behind 61% last year and 53% average. Setting bolls was 4%, near 6% last year and 3% average.

Sunflowers planted was 94%, near 90% last year and 91% average.

Pasture and Range Report: Pasture and range conditions rated 3% very poor, 7% poor, 27% fair, 51% good, and 12% excellent.
