KANSAS CROP PROGRESS AND CONDITION

MANHATTAN, Kan. July 14, 2025 - For the week ending July 13, 2025, there were 5.8 days suitable for fieldwork, according to the USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service. Topsoil moisture supplies rated 5% very short, 20% short, 68% adequate, and 7% surplus. Subsoil moisture supplies rated 7% very short, 21% short, 67% adequate, and 5% surplus.

Field Crops Report: Winter wheat harvested was 93%, near 96% last year, but ahead of 88% for the five-year average.

Corn condition rated 1% very poor, 5% poor, 25% fair, 51% good, and 18% excellent. Corn silking was 51%, behind 57% last year, but near 47% average. Dough was 11%, near 14% last year and 9% average.

Soybean condition rated 1% very poor, 4% poor, 26% fair, 58% good, and 11% excellent. Soybeans planted was 96%, near 100% both last year and average. Emerged was 91%, behind 97% both last year and average. Blooming was 38%, near 36% last year and 37% average. Setting pods was 6%, near 7% both last year and average.

Sorghum condition rated 1% very poor, 3% poor, 32% fair, 49% good, and 15% excellent. Sorghum headed was 5%, behind 12% last year and 10% average.

Cotton condition rated 0% very poor, 13% poor, 43% fair, 33% good, and 11% excellent. Cotton squaring was 45%, well behind 72% last year and 68% average. Setting bolls was 6%, well behind 33% last year, and behind 13% average.

Sunflowers planted was 96%, near 95% last year and 94% average.

Pasture and Range Report: Pasture and range conditions rated 3% very poor, 10% poor, 28% fair, 49% good, and 10% excellent.
